21d PICTORIAL FRAME PLATES Report by Mr F. J. MOHR.

Frame Plate 3:

I have examined this plate in printings as follows:-

- A Stamps perf 14 with the short line head used in conjunction with the long line head.
- B Stamps perf 14 both ways with the short line head.

C Stamps perf 14 with the comb head.

The following are the re-entries and most prominent flaws seen, the stamps being listed in the various states noticed. As with the centre plate there are probably states I have not seen:--

Clear (A). Scratches top right corner (B). Re-entry showing above Revenue and to right of value tablet (C).

3/5 Normal (A). Re-entry bottom right inner corner (BC).

5/5 Normal (A). Re-entry showing strongest in cross-hatching between W and Z and to left of value tablet (BC).

4/5 Normal (A). Slight signs of doubling down centre (BC).

- 6/5 Normal (A). Retouching (?) to cross-hatching around Postage tablet and in bottom right corner (BC).
- Normal (A). Retouch (?) to cross-hatching in bottom left corner (BC).

Normal (A). Very slight re-entry above Postage (BC).

- Normal (A). Very slight re-entry above rostage (BC).

 Normal (A). Good re-entry as described in Handbook (BC).
- Normal (A). Faint lines showing across leaf in top left corner (BC).

8/2 Flaw at top of top flower on right (ABC).

8/3 Flaw at bottom of bottom right-hand flower (ABC).

- 3/5 Re-entry (slight) bottom left corner (ABC). N.B.—Handbook states only appears in A and B.
- 10/1 Normal (AB). Re-entry showing over whole stamp, particularly bottom right corner with plate crack below (C) (cf Handbook description).

Normal (AB). Re-entry down left side, as described in Handbook (C).

Normal (AB). Re-entry across top and to right of value tablet (C).

The general retouching (?) of the outer frame lines in the top right corner is 10/5 here apparently overdone—the middle one of the three top lines is carried through to the right outer frame line (ABC).
