The rates of Postage on Letters and Newspapers for the United Kingdom *via* Brindisi, as well as on correspondence for several of Foreign Countries, has been reduced. The Postage on Letters for India and the South Sea Islands has also been reduced.

Post Offices have been established at the following places:—Kaurihohore, Matawhero, Paterangi, Whakato, and Whatipu (Auckland), Te Kapu (Hawke's Bay), Adelaide Road, St. John's at Wanganni, and Waihenga (Wellington), Dunrobin (Otago).

The Post Office at Horokiwi (Wellington) has been re-opened.

The Post Office at Flaxbourne (Marlborough) has been closed.

The Post Office at Waipu (Auckland) has been constituted a Money Order and Savings Bank Office.

A Receiving Office has been opened at Mr. H. Innes's, Courtney Place (Wellington).

An Iron Pillar Receiver has been erected on College Hill (Nelson).

The Office at Cheviot (Canterbury) will be made a Money Order and Savings Bank Office from the 1st August.

The frequency of the Mail Service between Napier and Tauranga has been reduced from twice to once a week.

The Contract for the carriage of the Suez English Mails between New Zealand and Melbourne provides for the despatch and receipts of Mails within given dates at the Ports of the Bluff, Port Chalmers, Lyttelton, and Wellington only. The closing of the Suez mails at Auckland, Thames, New Plymouth, Westport, Nelson, Blenheim, Picton, and Napier should be regulated by the date of the departure of the mail steamer from Wellington; and at Greymouth and Hokitika by the date of the departure of the steamer from Lyttelton.

WINDOW DELIVERIES.

Deliveries from the windows are made from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on week days, but at certain Post Offices specially authorized by the Postmaster-General, the windows will be closed during the periods of sorting and despatching mails. When English mails arrive on a Public Holiday, the windows will be open for delivery for two hours.

SEABORNE MAILS.

Seaborne mails, as a general rule, are closed one hour previous to the despatch of the mails from the Post Offices; and at Christchurch late letters may be posted in the Guard's Van at the Christchurch Railway Station until the hour of departure of the trains for Lyttelton. Late letters should not be posted at the Iron Pillar Receiver, Christchurch Railway Station.

PRIVATE BOXES AND BAGS.

Private letter-boxes are provided for merchants and others upon payment, in advance, of the following fees:—

For a term exceeding six calendar months and not exceeding one year, two pounds (£2),
For a term exceeding three calendar months and not exceeding six calendar months, one pound (£1).

For a term not exceeding three calendar months, ten shillings (10s.).

For a term exceeding six calendar months and not exceeding one year, when the box has been already let to the same person for a term or successive terms exceeding in all six calendar months, expiring within a week of the beginning of the new term, one pound (£1).

For a term not exceeding six calendar months, when the box has been already let to the same person for a term or successive terms exceeding in all six calendar months, ten shillings (10s.).

All such fees to be paid in advance: Provided that no private box shall be let save for a term ending on the 31st day of March, the 30th day of June, the 30th day of September, or the 31st day of December next after the day on which the same shall be let; and that, where there are two or more applicants for the same box at the same time, the preference shall be given to the person desiring to have the same for the longest term.

Persons residing upon mail routes requiring the accommodation of private bags can obtain the same upon payment, in advance, of two pounds per annum to the Chief or Head Postmaster, subject to the following regulations, viz:—

1. The bag must be of leather, with a lock and two keys, and provided and kept in repair at the cost of the person requiring it.
2. The Postmaster must securely lock the bag before despatching it, and it must be returned to the Postmaster in the same manner.
3. The bag must only contain correspondence for persons connected with the establishment of the owner of the bag, or who may be in his employment; and it must be distinctly understood that such owner is responsible for the postage of all unpaid letters, and for returning receipts for all those which may be registered.

A mail contractor is bound to convey and deliver, free of charge, all private bags given to him by Postmasters, but is not required to deviate from the prescribed mail route, and is on no account to be delayed. Should the return bag not be ready at the appointed time and place, the Contractor is not required to wait for it.

UNCLAIMED LETTERS.

On the first day of each month a list is exhibited at each Post Office in the Colony of the addresses of all letters received from places beyond the Colony that have remained unclaimed for three months at such Post Office; and such of these letters as remain unclaimed at the end of a further period of two months are then forwarded to the Dead Letter Office, to be returned unopened to the countries where they originated. Unclaimed letters originating in the Colony are not advertised, but at the end of three months are forwarded to the Dead Letter Office, Wellington, there to be opened and returned to the writers.

Rates of Postage, and Conditions of Transmission.

All letters, newspapers, book and pattern parcels, and prices current, posted in New Zealand, must be prepaid by postage stamps.

INLAND LETTERS.

Letters posted in New Zealand for places within the Colony, not properly prepaid, will be forwarded charged with double the amount of deficiency. For rates of postage on town letters, country letters, and interprovincial letters, see page 30.

Late letters for despatch by steamers will be received until within twenty minutes of the despatch from the Post Office, provided such letters bear, in addition to the full postage, a further single rate of postage as a late fee.

Late letters placed on board mail steamers must also bear, in addition to the full postage, a further single rate of postage as a late fee. When such letters are posted unpaid, or insufficiently paid, they will be charged, on delivery, with double the deficient postage and the late fee.

Letters redirected from one part of the Colony to another are chargeable with fresh rates of postage, as if they were then posted for the first time, prepayment being optional.

LETTERS FOR PLACES BEYOND THE COLONY.

The rates of postage on letters to the United Kingdom, the Australian and other British Colonies, and Foreign Countries, are enumerated in the Table of Rates of Postage, at page 33.

Letters posted in the Colony for the United Kingdom, the Colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, Tasmania, Western Australia, and United States of America, although insufficiently prepaid, if bearing postage stamps of the value of at least one single rate, will be forwarded charged with the deficient postage, together with an additional single rate as a fine; and in the case of a letter for the United Kingdom, marked *via* Brindisi, but not bearing a single rate for such route (*i.e.*, ninepence), it will be forwarded *via* Southampton, if bearing stamps of the value of sixpence. When less than one single rate has been prepaid on letters for either the above-mentioned places, and less than the full rates on letters for all other places, such letters will be detained.

Late letters for places beyond the Colony will be received until twenty minutes before the hour of despatch from the Post Office, provided such letters bear, in addition to the full postage, a further single rate of postage as a late fee.

Late letters placed on board mail steamers must also bear, in addition to the full postage, a further single rate of postage as a late fee.

Letters re-directed to the United Kingdom, the Colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, Tasmania, and Western Australia, respectively, are charged with a new and distinct rate of postage—prepayment optional; the postage on re-directed letters for all other places beyond the Colony must be prepaid.

Re-directed letters received from places beyond the Colony, on which the re-direction postage has not been prepaid, will be charged full postage rates on delivery.

Letters, &c., received at any Post Office in the Colony from places beyond the Colony, which have not been regularly posted at the place of despatch, will be charged with full postage, according to the rates fixed in the Table of Postage Rates, unless they are letters which it is not compulsory by law to send by post, in which case they are chargeable with the inland letter rate of postage only.

NEWSPAPERS AND TRADE CIRCULARS.

Newspapers published in the Colony, and registered at the General Post Office for transmission by post, may either be forwarded like other printed matter under the regulations of the book post, or may be transmitted within the Colony on prepayment of a postage rate of one halfpenny each in postage stamps, and to places beyond the Colony at the rates set forth in the Table of Postage Rates, page 33, and under the following regulations:—

The title and date of the newspaper must be printed at the top of every page. It must have either no cover, or a cover open at the ends, and must not contain any enclosures nor any writing or other mark thereon beyond the name and address of the person to whom it is sent, nor anything on the cover but such name and address, the printed title of the newspaper, and the printed name and address of the publisher or vendor who sends it.

Newspapers published without the Colony are chargeable with the same rate of postage as those published within the Colony and registered for transmission through the post.

Newspapers re-directed from one Post Office to another within the Colony may be transmitted accordingly, but are chargeable with a fresh newspaper rate of postage, which may be paid either on re-direction or on delivery.

Trade Circulars or prices current, published in the colony, and registered at the General Post Office for transmission by Post, may be forwarded at the rates of postage enumerated on page 31.

BOOK POST.

The following are the regulations of the Inland Book Post:—

- (1.) The postage is one penny not exceeding two ounces; twopence not exceeding four ounces; and twopence for every additional four ounces or fraction of four ounces. Book packets which may be insufficiently prepaid will be treated as described in section 8.
- (2.) Every packet must be sent either without a cover, or in a cover open at the ends or sides, so as to admit of the enclosures being examined. For the greater security of its contents, the packet may be tied at the ends with string, but in such case the Postmaster is authorized to cut the string, although if he do so he must again tie up the packet.
- (3.) A book packet may contain any number of separate books or other publications (including printed or lithographed letters), photographs (when not on glass or in cases containing glass or such like substance), drawings, prints, or maps, and any quantity of paper, parchment, or vellum; and the books or other publications, prints, maps, &c., may be either printed, written, engraved, lithographed, or plain, or any mixture of these; but no printed matter or prints will be allowed, except such as may be printed on paper, parchment, or vellum. Further, all legitimate binding, mounting, or covering of a book, &c., or of a portion thereof, will be allowed, whether such binding, &c., be loose or attached; as also rollers in the case

of prints or maps, markers (whether of paper or otherwise) in the case of books, and, in short, whatever is necessary for the safe transmission of such articles, or usually appertains thereto; but the binding, rollers, &c., must not be sent as a separate packet.

- (4.) No book packet may contain anything which is sealed or otherwise closed against inspection; nor must there be any letter, nor any communication of the nature of a letter, whether separate or otherwise, unless the whole of such letter or communication be printed. Entries, however, merely stating who sends the book, &c., or to whom it is given, are not regarded as a letter. Indeed, as respects the name and address of the sender, not only is the writing permitted, but it is even recommended; so that if the cover come off, or for any other reason the packet cannot be forwarded, it may be returned.
- (5.) No book packet must exceed two feet in length, or one foot in width or depth,—nor must it exceed five pounds in weight; and if any such packet be presented at a Post Office, it will not be received.
- (6.) Any packet which shall not be open at the ends or sides, or shall have any letter or any communication of the nature of a letter written in it, or upon its cover, will be charged letter postage, with an additional rate.
- (7.) If a packet be found to contain any letter not wholly printed, whether closed or open, or any enclosure sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, or any other unauthorized enclosure, the packet will be charged with the full letter postage, together with an additional rate, and forwarded to its address.
- (8.) If a packet be not sufficiently prepaid with stamps, but nevertheless bear stamps of the value of one rate, it is forwarded, charged with the deficient book postage, together with an additional rate.

It is the duty of Postmasters, whenever they have ground for suspecting an infringement of any of the above conditions, and occasionally even where there is no ground for suspicion, to open and examine book packets posted at or passing through their offices.

To prevent obstacles to the regular transmission of letters, a Postmaster may, when necessary, delay forwarding any book packet until the following despatch.

The main business of the Post Office being the transmission of letters, the forwarding of books and newspapers (which no one is compelled to send through the Post Office), though an important, is only a secondary object, for which no arrangement can be made which would interfere with the quick and regular conveyance and delivery of letters. Books, therefore, which would be injured by being thrust into a bag and hurriedly pressed down like a bundle of letters, should not be sent through the post.

BOOK POST TO PLACES BEYOND THE COLONY.

Books can be sent to the United Kingdom, British Colonies, and certain Foreign Countries, on the same conditions as those of the Inland Book Post, and at the rates enumerated in the Table of Postage Rates, at page 33.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST.

The following are the rules of the Inland Pattern and Sample Post:—

- (1.) The postage is one penny not exceeding two ounces; twopence not exceeding four ounces; and twopence for every additional four ounces or fraction of four ounces.
- (2.) No packet of patterns or samples must exceed twenty-four ounces in weight; any packet exceeding that weight will be sent to the Dead Letter Office.
- (3.) There must be no writing or printing on the packet or its cover in addition to the address of the person for whom the packet is intended, except the address of the sender, a trade mark and numbers, and the prices of the articles, otherwise the packet will be treated as a letter.
- (4.) There must be no enclosure other than the samples themselves. The particulars, which are allowed to be furnished under the preceding rule, must in all cases be given, not on loose pieces of paper, but on small labels attached to the samples or the bags containing them.
- (5.) The patterns or samples must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination. Samples, however, of seeds, drugs, &c., may be enclosed in boxes, or in bags of linen, or other material, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened, or in the case of samples of seeds in bags entirely closed, provided that they are transparent, so that the officers of the department may be able to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents. If this rule be infringed, the packet will be treated as a letter.
- (6.) Insufficiently paid packets of patterns or samples will be treated as described in section 8 of the Inland Book Post Regulations.
- (7.) In order to prevent any interruption to the regular transmission of letters, a packet of patterns or samples may, when it is necessary, be kept back by any Postmaster until the following despatch.

- (8.) The rule which forbids the transmission through the post of any article which might injure the contents of the mail bags or the officers of the Post Office is so far relaxed as to permit the transmission of scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pens, nails, keys, watch machinery, metal tubing, pieces of metal or ore, and such like, as samples, provided that they be packed and guarded in so secure a manner as to afford complete protection to the contents of the mail bags and the officers of the Post Office, while at the same time the samples may be easily examined. If any packet containing such articles as these be posted which is found not to be sufficiently guarded it will be detained, and a notice of its detention will be sent to the person to whom it is addressed or to the sender, who may then obtain it upon personal application; but the packet will be charged with a fine equal in amount to the postage to which the packet was liable as a packet of patterns.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST TO PLACES BEYOND THE COLONY.

Patterns and samples may be sent at the rates enumerated in the Table of Postage Rates at page 33 to such countries as are marked in that table with the letter *p*. The conditions in these cases are for the most part the same as in the case of the Inland Pattern and Sample Post, the following being the only important exceptions:—

- (1.) A packet of patterns or samples sent *via* the United Kingdom to Portugal, Madeira, the Azores, Cape de Verdes, France, or to Turkey, Syria, or Egypt, by French packet, must not exceed eighteen inches in length, width, or depth; a packet to any other place abroad must not exceed twenty-four inches in length or twelve inches in breadth or depth.
- (2.) A packet of patterns or samples sent to Germany, Russia, Belgium, Turkey, Moldavia, Wallachia, &c., *via* the United Kingdom and Belgium, or to any place *via* Austria, must not exceed eight ounces in weight, and the weight of a packet for Portugal, Madeira, the Azores, or Cape de Verdes is limited to one pound.
- (3.) None of the articles named in rule 8 above may be sent as patterns or samples to any place abroad except the United States of America, Germany, Belgium, Holland, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Turkey, Moldavia, Wallachia, Portugal, Madeira, the Azores, Cape de Verdes, and the British Colonies.
- (4.) Bags entirely closed, even though they be transparent, must not be used for the transmission of seeds to any foreign country except the United States of America, Holland and its possessions, Belgium, Denmark, Greece, Portugal and its possessions, and Switzerland; and samples of intrinsic value must not be sent to foreign countries, except the United States, and to France and Germany.

Postage Stamps.

Every Postmaster is required to keep for sale to the public a sufficient stock of the various postage labels in use in the Colony, and to sell them at the following prices:—

Labels should be placed on the front of the letter, and upon the right-hand corner of the upper side. On re-directed letters, however, care should be taken not to place fresh stamps over the stamps which have been previously used.

Receipt or duty stamps cannot be used in place of postage stamps, nor can postage stamps which have been torn, cut, or otherwise rendered imperfect, be used.

The halfpenny postage stamp must not be affixed to letters.

English postage stamps may be obtained by persons desirous of sending a stamp or stamped envelope to their relatives or friends in the United Kingdom, in order to relieve them of the cost of the postage when sending replies. These stamps cannot be purchased in quantities, nor are they permitted to be used for the purpose of making remittances.

Registration.

By the prepayment of a fee of sixpence in addition to the full postage, any letter, newspaper, book, or other packet, may be registered to any place in the Colony. For registration to the United Kingdom, British Colonies, and certain Foreign Countries, see Table of Postage Rates, page 33.

The registration of a packet makes its transmission much more secure; and the loss of a registered packet is a very rare occurrence. Nevertheless, the Post Office is not responsible for the safe delivery of registered packets, though any officer who may neglect his duty on this point will be called to strict account. Valuable articles sent in *unregistered* letters are exposed to risk; and the Department cannot in any way undertake the safe conveyance of such packets. All Inland, British, or Colonial letters, therefore, which unquestionably contain coin, even though they be posted without registration, are treated as registered, and charged on delivery with a double registration fee of one shilling, in addition to the ordinary postage; and any such letters which cannot be registered in time to be forwarded by the mail for which they are posted are detained for the next despatch.

Every letter to be registered should be presented at the window, and a receipt obtained for it, and should on no account be dropped into the letter-box. If, contrary to this rule, a letter marked "Registered" be dropped into the letter-box, it will, *if directed to any place in the Colony, the United Kingdom, or the British Colonies*, be liable to a double registration fee.

Letters may be registered during the ordinary office hours, and for despatch by any mail, two hours before the closing of such mail. No letter-carrier, messenger, or other servant of the Post Office is allowed to carry a letter for any person to be registered.

A registered letter, which has not been delivered, when re-directed to any place within the Colony, is not liable to any further charge than an ordinary re-directed letter. If, however, a registered letter be re-directed to any place without the Colony, the second postage and registration fee must be prepaid.

No letter or other postal packet addressed to initials, or to a fictitious name, can be registered.

Delivery.

Letter-carriers and messengers are prohibited from distributing any letters, newspapers, &c., whether before beginning their rounds, whilst on their rounds, or after they may have completed them, except such as have passed through a Post Office. Nor are they allowed to receive any payment beyond the postage for the delivery or collection of any letter or newspaper, nor to deviate from the route laid down for them. The prohibition, however, from receiving payment in addition to the postage does not extend to Christmas gratuities.

No person living within the town free delivery, can claim to have his letters delivered at the office window if a delivery by letter-carrier is about to take place; but letters which arrive by a mail, after which there is no immediate delivery by letter-carrier, may be obtained by any person on application at the office window, so long as the office is open for delivery.

Letters addressed to the Post Office, or to be kept till called for, may be obtained at the office window, except where it is ascertained that it is the practice of persons living within the town delivery to have their letters so addressed, in which cases they will be sent out by letter-carrier. Letters for persons residing beyond any official delivery, will be delivered on application at the window. It is not permitted to return any letter to the writer or sender, or to any one else, or to delay forwarding it to its destination according to the address, even though a request to such effect be written thereon, as every letter must be delivered to the person to whom it is originally directed, and to him alone. No information must be given by a postal officer respecting letters, &c., which pass through a Post Office, except to the persons to whom they are addressed.

V.—Registration.

For every letter, book packet and pattern parcel, or newspaper registered at any Post Office within the Colony for delivery at or from any Post Office within the Colony, a fee of sixpence will be charged in addition to the postage.

VI.—Soldiers' and Sailors' Letters.

Letters addressed to or forwarded by any non-commissioned officer, army schoolmaster (not of the first class), army schoolmistress, soldier, or seaman, while actually employed in Her Majesty's service, may be transmitted within the Colony, and between the Colony and the Australian Colonies, India, British Ports in the Mediterranean, and the United Kingdom, at a charge of one penny each; and to any Post Office within the British Dominions, *via* the United Kingdom, by British Mail Packet, at twopence each, provided that the following regulations are observed:—

- (1.) Each letter must not exceed half an ounce in weight.
- (2.) If sent by any such privileged person, it must be superscribed with the name of the writer, his description or class in the regiment or vessel, and signed by the officer at the time in command.
- (3.) If addressed to any such privileged person, his description or class in the regiment or vessel must be specified thereon.
- (4.) If posted within the Colony, the postage must be prepaid.

Letters of this description posted or received in the Colony, not in accordance with the foregoing regulations, will be treated as ordinary letters. Soldiers' and sailors' letters addressed to foreign places, are chargeable with the foreign transit rates due to the countries through which such letters may pass.

On trade circulars and prices current addressed to foreign countries, foreign book rates, as enumerated in the Table of Postage Rates, page 33, will be charged in addition to the Colonial rate of one penny each.

Articles not allowed to be sent by Post.

It is forbidden to forward by post any indecent or obscene print, painting, photograph, lithograph, engraving, book, or card, or any other indecent or obscene article, or any letter, newspaper, publication, packet, or card having thereon any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, libellous, or grossly offensive character.

Postmasters are instructed not to receive any letter which there is good reason to believe contains anything likely to injure the contents of the mail bag, or to do bodily harm to any officer of the Post Office. The following are examples of the articles referred to:—

A glass bottle, or glass in any form; leeches, game, fish, meat, fruit, or vegetables bladders or other vessels containing liquids; gunpowder, lucifer matches, or anything which is explosive or liable to sudden combustion; razors, scissors, needles, forks, or other sharp instruments are also forbidden.

Miscellaneous Regulations and Suggestions.

The Post Office is not, by law, responsible for any loss or inconvenience which may arise from the non-delivery, mis-sending, or mis-delivery of any letter, book, or other postal packet (even if the packet be registered); nor is the Post Office responsible for any injury which a packet may sustain during its transmission.

To guard against such injury, all postal packets which are likely to suffer from stamping or from great pressure should be placed in strong covers; and even with this precaution no fragile article should be sent through the Post.

*No information can be given respecting letters which pass through a Post Office except to the persons to whom they are addressed; and in no other way is official information of a private character allowed to be made public.

Postmasters are not allowed to return any letter or other packet to the writer or sender, or to any one else, or to delay forwarding it to its destination according to the address, even though a request to such effect be written thereon.

Postmasters are not bound to weigh any letters or other packets for the public, but they may do so if their duty be not thereby impeded.

Postmasters are not bound to give change, or authorized to demand change.

No postal officer is permitted to take money in prepayment of postage, or to affix postage stamps on letters, &c., posted at any Post Office. Postage stamps should in all cases be affixed by the sender or person posting the correspondence.

Every letter should contain the full address of the writer, in order to insure its return if the person to whom it is directed cannot be found. A much larger portion of the undelivered letters could be returned if the names and addresses of the senders were always either fully and plainly written inside or embossed on the envelopes.

The practice of sealing letters passing to and from countries with hot climates with wax (except such as is specially prepared) is attended with much inconvenience, and frequently with serious injury, not only to the letters so sealed, but to the other letters in the mail, from the melting of the wax and adhesion of the letters to each other. The public are therefore recommended, in all such cases, to use either wafers or gum, and to advise their correspondents in the countries referred to to do the same.

Neither money nor any other article of considerable value ought ever to be sent through the post, except by means of a money order or in a registered letter. Any person who sends money or jewellery in an unregistered letter, not only runs a risk of losing his property, but exposes to temptation every one through whose hands his letter passes, and may be the means of ultimately bringing some clerk or letter-carrier to moral ruin.

Whenever bank notes are sent by post, even in registered letters, they should be cut in halves, and the second halves should not be posted till it has been ascertained that the first halves have been received ; and further, in order to afford the means of identification, a memorandum should always be made of the number of each bank note.

Any person conveying (otherwise than by the Post) a letter not exempted from the exclusive privilege of the Postmaster-General, incurs, by law, a penalty of £20 for every letter so conveyed.

Much difficulty is experienced in the delivery to their right owners of letters imperfectly addressed; and the Post Office has frequently incurred unjust censure either for unintentionally delivering such letters to wrong persons, or for declining the responsibility of delivering them at all. The address of every letter ought to be full and distinct; but in the cases referred to it is obvious that the correct delivery cannot be secured unless the name of the street (and occupation when any) be added in the address of the letter to the name of the person for whom the letter is intended to be given. The practice of addressing letters to a town only, prevails to a large extent, and it has become necessary to call special attention to the matter, in order to prevent not only the delay which such letters are in all cases liable to suffer, but also the danger to which they are exposed of being delivered to wrong persons and lost altogether.

Post Office Savings Bank.

Every Money Order Office is also a Post Office Savings Bank, and open for Bank business during the same hours as for Money Orders.

Deposits of one shilling, or of any multiple of one shilling, may be made at any Post Office Savings Bank.

Interest is allowed to each Depositor at the rate of 4½ per cent. per annum on the balance at the credit of his account when it does not exceed £200, and at the rate of 4 per cent. when it exceeds £200; but no interest will be allowed on more than £500.

Electric Telegraph.

REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH TELEGRAMS ARE AUTHORIZED TO BE TRANSMITTED BY THE TELEGRAPH BELONGING TO THE GENERAL GOVERNMENT OF NEW ZEALAND.

1. The Government is not responsible for errors, omissions, or delays in the transmission of telegrams, nor for the non-transmission of any telegram.

2. Printed forms, upon which telegrams should be written, may be obtained at all Stations on application; but all telegrams, whether written upon the prescribed form, upon any other printed form, or upon plain paper, will be considered as presented for transmission under the several conditions contained in these regulations.

3. All telegrams presented for transmission must be written in ink, in a clear and legible manner; they shall contain a proper address, and bear a genuine signature in the usual handwriting of the sender.

4. In order to prevent errors in the transmission of telegrams, all words must be written in full, and no abbreviation will be allowed. It is advisable to write all numbers in words in full, and not in figures.

5. Telegrams will be transmitted in the following order of priority:-

(1.) Telegrams of the General or Provincial Government marked *urgent*—General Government telegrams having precedence.

(2.) Telegrams relative to the arrest of criminals or persons accused, or the discovery or prevention of crime.

(3.) Telegrams relating to cases of pressing emergency, such as accident, sickness, or death, may be transmitted in priority to any others.

Subject to the above exceptions, all telegrams will be transmitted in the order in which they may be received by the Officers of the Department.

6. In order to prevent a monopoly of the line by any one company or individual, when several telegrams are presented for transmission about the same time, and any one of these telegrams is of considerable length, then no officer shall transmit more than two hundred words of any such telegram at one time.

7. Telegrams may be written in cypher, which will be counted according to the following scale, whether for figures or letters:—Separate cyphers count as one word; groups of five cyphers, or fractional part of five cyphers, count as one word; groups exceeding five cyphers are counted at the rate of five cyphers to the word, and any fractional portion remaining is to be counted as one word.

8. Where cyphers are used, the sender is recommended to pay for the repetition of such telegram, in order to insure accuracy.

9. In the event of serious delays occurring through accident to the lines which may prevent the transmission of a telegram within a reasonable time, or may destroy the value of any telegram, notice thereof will be sent to the sender of such telegram, should his address be known. The sender may, on a written application to the Officer in Charge of the Station at which such telegram was presented and paid for, receive back the amount paid thereon, and the telegram will be cancelled.

10. Telegrams will be delivered free of charge within one mile of the Station to which they may be transmitted by wire; but if required to be delivered beyond that distance, cab or omnibus fares, or horse hire, will be charged, as may be found necessary. All telegrams requiring to be delivered on shipboard, or on the water, or across the water, will bear an extra charge to defray any boat expenses incurred.

11. When the sender of a telegram desires it, the reply to such telegram may be prepaid, and the messenger will be instructed to wait for such prepaid reply for the space of ten minutes; after which time the reply must be forwarded to the Station by the receiver of the original telegram. Persons presenting for transmission a "Reply-paid" message which has already been paid for, must distinctly state this at the time of its presentation.

12. Should the sender of a telegram desire to have the telegram repeated, to insure accuracy, such repetition will be made at a charge of half the rate of the original telegram.

13. On special occasions, when Telegraph Stations are kept open beyond the usual hours of business, a double charge will be made on all telegrams presented for transmission.

14. Telegrams may be taken from the sender with the word "Collect" written thereon, and in such case the payment for the telegram will be collected from the receiver of the telegram; but in the event of the receiver refusing to pay, the sender of the telegram shall be held responsible for the due payment thereof.

15. Telegrams may be taken from the sender of a telegram with the words "Reply-paid" written thereon, and in such case the payment for the telegram in reply will be collected from the sender of the first telegram.

The stamps are to be affixed on the top right-hand corner, immediately under the heading "Fees received."

Telegraph forms and envelopes, having the words (printed in red) "Telegram for transmission to the Officer in charge Telegraph Station," can be procured at all Post Offices throughout the Colony.

Papers publishing before 5 p.m. each day, in addition to Australian or San Francisco Mail telegrams, will be allowed to receive at any period of the day telegrams amounting in the aggregate to 200 words, and will be charged for the same at Evening rates; any excess over the 200 words to be paid for at the rates in force between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

On Sundays, double the above rates.

No charge will be made for address and signature up to 10 words; every word over 10 will be charged for at Tariff rates.

WEATHER TELEGRAMS FOR SHIPPING.

Masters of vessels are permitted to forward messages at an uniform rate of sixpence for each message (including reply) to the Harbour Masters of the various ports, seeking information as to the state of the weather, &c., at the port to which they are bound, or from any port which may lie in their route. These telegrams must be concise, and should be filled in in accordance with the directions to be seen at the various telegraph stations.

In no case will a larger number of words than ten in the body of the telegram be followed under these Rules.

CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH TELEGRAMS ARE TRANSMITTED, AND TARIFF RATES FOR PLACES BEYOND THE AUSTRALIAN COLONIES.

CONDITIONS.

THE following are the conditions under which messages will be transmitted on and after 1st January, 1876:—

1. The length of a word is limited to a maximum of ten letters.
2. Only ordinary dictionary words should be used. Artificially-constructed words are subject to the cipher rate.
3. Groups of figures may be transmitted, and will be charged at the rate of five to the word, if expressing ordinary commercial quotations; but if used for code purposes, they will be subject to the cipher rate.
4. Groups of letters or artificially-constructed words will be treated in the same manner as figures.
5. Cipher telegrams must be collated—i.e., repeated back in their entirety from station to station. Half rate extra is charged for collating.
6. Any combination of code employing in the same message groups of figures and letters is strictly prohibited, and telegrams composed in this manner cannot be accepted.
7. Addresses may be written in code, at the sender's risk, under arrangement with the administrations concerned. The signature may also be a code word, or the last word of the message may replace it.
8. The following abbreviated forms for expressing "Reply paid," "Acknowledgment of receipt," "Collating," and "Telegram to follow" have been agreed to, so that only one word need be paid for to convey these instructions:—

REGISTRATION OF ABBREVIATED ADDRESSES.

With the view of saving as much as possible the cost of the transmission of telegrams to New Zealand from other countries, a Register will be kept at every telegraph station in New Zealand for the registration of arbitrary or cypher addresses in the shape of one or more words. No fee will be charged for registration. Persons registering will require to communicate the cypher or arbitrary address to their correspondents.

The Telegraph Companies register names and addresses of telegraph correspondents free of charge at all their stations, and in London at 74, Old Broad Street; 8, Leadenhall Street; and 42, Finsbury Circus. Addresses may also be registered at any Government Telegraph Office in England or Scotland upon payment of one guinea to the Postmaster-General, London.

THE following notice has been received from the General Post Office, London:—
General Post Office, London, 1872.

1. On and after this date, a register will be opened at the Central Telegraph Station for the registration of the full address at which telegrams reaching London from the provinces, or from abroad, and marked with an abbreviated or arbitrary address, are to be delivered.
 2. The charge for registration will be one guinea per annum, payable in advance, and will become due on the 1st of August in each year. The payment made during the current year will cover the period to the 31st July, 1873.
 3. For an address registered in London, the fee of one guinea should be remitted by means of a cheque on a London Bank, crossed "Bank of England," in favour of the Postmaster-General or order, or by Post Office order payable at the Chief Office, London.
 4. On and from the 1st of October next, the Postmaster-General will not undertake the delivery of any telegrams at addresses which are not either full and complete, or which have not been registered at the General Post Office, or which cannot be traced in the Post Office London Directory, whether the record of the actual address has already been notified to the Post Office or not.
 5. In the provinces, and in Scotland and Ireland, the Addresses of Telegrams may have their addresses registered at the Chief Office of the Town in which they reside, upon payment at that office of the registration fee.
- Persons in New Zealand desirous of availing themselves of the arrangement above notified should request their correspondents in the United Kingdom to register any abbreviated address that may be agreed upon, at the Chief Office of the Town in which they reside.

REPETITION OF MESSAGES VIA JAVA CABLE.

Notice has been received from the Agent of the British Australian Telegraph Company in Adelaide, South Australia, that Messages sent via the Java Cable may be repeated back, to insure accuracy, at one-half the usual rate for transmission.

The following copy of a Circular, received from "The Eastern Extension Australasia and China Telegraph Company, Limited," is published for general information:—

The St. Petersburg Telegraph Conference.

THE Telegraph Companies to India, China, and Australia have issued the following Circular in London:—

"We have the pleasure to send the following information respecting certain of the new rules and regulations affecting extra European correspondence adopted at the Conference held at St. Petersburg. These rules and regulations will come into force from the 1st of January next.

D

"The Directors are pleased to state that the Company's efforts to secure the introduction of the word-rate have been crowned with success, and that from and after the 1st of January, 1876, messages of any number of words may be sent, the sender only having to pay for the number he desires to have forwarded.

"This facility will apply to all European States, and the charge per word will be uniform between India and all stations in Europe, except the Shetland and Orkney Islands and Russia.

"The same system has been adopted in all respects between India and Europe for messages originating in, or destined for, countries beyond India and Europe—i.e., Trans-Indian, and Indo and Trans Indo-American messages.

"The length of a word has been limited to a maximum of ten letters.

"In consequence, it is understood, of the numerous errors made previous to the establishment of the present special lines, merchants have almost universally employed words of unusual length, taken from several languages, sometimes non-natural words, with the object, as stated, of insuring the receipt of at least some part of the word, enabling its meaning to be guessed; but the use of this method at present, so far from increasing the intelligibility, is calculated to give rise to mistakes and consequent unintelligibility.

"There are now special through wires and cables with India; the messages consequently do not now traverse the lines of different States, where various languages are employed; or undergo manipulation by clerks of numerous nationalities. A mixture, therefore, or the use of inordinately long, difficult Greek, Latin, Italian, German, French, and even imaginary isolated words, giving no clue to the sense of the word, and with arbitrary and frequently improper terminations and prefixes, not alone delays the transmission of the whole of the traffic, but is calculated to provoke errors.

"The prevalent recourse to these code words was discussed at the Conference held at St. Petersburg, and it was resolved to treat them as cyphers. This treatment involved an allowance of five letters only to the word, and entailed a half-charge in addition for repetition on compulsory registration. Upon the urgent representations of the Companies, however, this resolution was afterwards set aside.

"Ultimately the use of codes was allowed, such words not to contain more than a maximum of ten characters, in lieu of seven syllables as at present, and any excess to be charged for at the rate of one word for every ten letters or fraction of ten letters. The intention of the Conference was to secure a fair average by imposing a reduced maximum. If this object should not be attained, we are afraid that the question of treating code words as cyphers will come up again at the next Conference.

"To prevent the adoption of this course, it is also most advisable to employ only ordinary dictionary words. Artificially-constructed words, not appearing in a dictionary, will not in future be admitted. Codes should consist of words giving a fair average length only, and the plainest and simplest words, easily understood by the clerks, and therefore easily recognized, will be found the best to employ.

"Groups of figures will be admitted and charged, each group as one word, if containing five figures or less; groups of more than five will be charged as so many words as they contain five figures, plus one word for the remainder, if any; but groups of figures, if manifestly used for code purposes, and not in order to express commercial quotations and ordinary numbers, will cause the telegram to come under the heading of 'secret messages,' and subject it to compulsory registration.

"Groups of letters may be refused altogether by any administrations, but if admitted they will be charged the same as groups of figures. It would, consequently, be very unsafe to form 'letter' codes. All telegrams wholly or partially composed of letters, and thus manifestly cypher, as long as they are admitted, will be forwarded, but will be subjected to compulsory registration.

"Any combination of code employing in the same message groups of figures and letters is strictly prohibited, and telegrams composed in this manner cannot be accepted.

"Addresses may be written in code at sender's risk, under arrangement with the administrations concerned. The signature may also be a code word, or the last word of the message may replace it.

"Abbreviated forms for expressing 'reply paid,' 'acknowledgment of receipt,' of 'registration,' 'telegram to follow,' &c., have been agreed to, so that only one word need be paid for to convey these instructions. The *vid.* or indication of route, will be sent free of all charge.

"The object of the Telegraph Companies in circulating this information is more especially to acquaint merchants with the rules and regulations coming into force on the 1st of January, affecting 'language convenu'—i.e., code—in order that they may take such steps as they may deem best fitting. The object of the Telegraphic Conference has not been to put merchants to additional expense as regards code messages, but to prevent, what was termed by the States, an abuse of the facilities accorded.

"The Companies are naturally most desirous, considering that the interests of their customers are the same as theirs, to prepare merchants using the wires for the future application of the new rules and regulations embodied in the St. Petersburg Convention. Tariffs with full particulars will be shortly published by the Companies. The Companies are informed that a full authorized English translation of the new Convention, with the rules, regulations, and tariff tables annexed, will shortly be ready, prepared by Mr. Alfred

NEW ZEALAND.

GOVERNMENT LIFE INSURANCE.

1. THE GOVERNMENT LIFE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT issues all desirable forms of policies.

2. THE PAYMENT OF EVERY POLICY IS GUARANTEED BY THE COLONY.

3. DIVISION OF PROFITS.—The surplus or profit is ordered by Law to be divided among Policy-holders *only*, and is to be ascertained every fifth year. The first investigation, with a view to division of profits, is to be made as at 30th June, 1880.

4. PREMIUM RATES ARE LOWER than the participating rates of Private Companies, to an extent which is equivalent to a bonus in advance of from 15 to 20 per cent.

5. PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS.—The payments may be made during whole term of life, or during a limited period only; at an invariable annual, half-yearly or quarterly, or by a single premium. The rates for any description of Life Insurance not given in the published Tables may be obtained at the Head Office in Wellington.

6. LIBERAL CONDITIONS as to travelling, residence, &c. :—

- a. Policy-holders may travel without license or payment of extra premium, or reside in any part of the world, except within 25 degrees of the equator, without license or payment of extra premium.
- b. Policy-holders may change their occupation without license or payment of extra premium.
- c. Death by suicide (except within twelve months of the date of the policy), by duelling, or by the hands of Justice, does not void any policy.
- d. No policy becomes void by any act of the assured, so far as regards the interest of any third persons, provided such act is done without their knowledge, and that they pay the additional premium required, if any, as soon as such act comes to their knowledge.

7. ALL POLICIES, after five years' duration, ARE INDISPUTABLE and UN-CHALLENGABLE on any grounds whatever connected with the statements on which the assurance was based, provided the age of the insured has been admitted.

8. ALL POLICIES, after five years' duration, ARE FREED FROM ALL CONDITIONS, except the payment of premium, provided the age of the insured has been admitted, and he has attained thirty years of age, and he has resided continuously within the ordinary limits from the date of the policy. Holders of such policies can voyage or reside in any part of the world, without license or payment of extra premium.

9. PROOF OF AGE.—Age will be admitted at any time on a policy on production of either a certificate of birth or baptism; or, failing these, the best proof that can be procured, such as, for instance, an entry in a family Bible, or a statutory declaration from a relation or friend, stating belief as to age, and grounds of such belief.

10. ALL POLICIES ARE NON-FORFEITABLE after three years to the full extent of their value, under a special regulation providing for the continuance in force of every policy for the original amount, so long as the surrender value of the policy, as defined by the regulation, is not less than the premiums in arrear together with interest at six per cent. per annum, thus giving to every policy-holder a full equivalent for every premium paid. Such policies may be revived even within twelve months after exhaustion of surrender value on proof of unimpaired health, and payment of arrears and fine.

11. ABSOLUTE SECURITY FROM LOSS.—Insurers, after having paid three full annual premiums, are guaranteed a cash surrender value of about 40 per cent. of the paid-up premiums; and if for any reason the premiums are not paid when due, a *paid-up* policy will be granted for an amount generally greater than the paid-up premiums.

The following Example, taken from the preceding Table illustrates the practical working of clauses 10 and 11 :—A person, aged 30 (col. 1), insured for £100, paying an annual premium of £2 0s. 6d. (col. 2), whose policy has been in force for three years, and failing to pay the next premium, the surrender value of £2 6s. 1d. (col. 3) would be applied by the office to keep the policy in force for a period of twelve months, during which time the policy can be revived as stated in the preceding clause, No. 10, unless he should desire to cancel the policy, in which case he could either receive the surrender value in cash, or a policy free of all future premiums of £6 6s. 7d., being an amount slightly exceeding the premiums he has paid.

12. LOANS.—Policy-holders can borrow on the security of their policies to the extent of 90 per cent. of the cash surrender value, provided the loan exceeds £5. (For cash surrender value see columns 3, 6, and 9 of preceding Table.) The loan agreement between policy-holders and the Department is prepared free of cost, and interest is at present charged at the rate of £7 per cent.

13. THIRTY DAYS OF GRACE are allowed on all Renewal Premiums, and no policy is absolutely forfeited for non-payment of premium unless the premium remains unpaid for 12 months. Such policies may be renewed, provided the premiums in arrear and a fine are paid, and the insured is in unimpaired health.

14. A POLICY-HOLDER may at any time direct that, instead of the sum insured being paid at his death, it shall be converted into an annuity payable to a nominee.

15. POLICIES PROTECTED FROM BANKRUPTCY.—An insurance policy effected by the insured, *bond fide* on his own life, is protected from bankruptcy or insolvency laws to a certain amount, which increases with its duration. Thus, after it has endured for two years, it is protected to the extent of £200;

After five years	...	...	...	to £500

This protection applies only in favour of the personal representatives of the insured.

16. MARRIED WOMEN MAY EFFECT POLICIES, dispose of the sum assured by will, as if single, and their policies are protected from the debts of their husbands, according to duration, to amounts similar to those stated in clause 15.

17. SETTLEMENT POLICIES.—Policies effected for the benefit of the wife and children of the insured are from the date of issue absolutely protected from the claims of

creditors to the extent of £2,000, provided that the premiums are payable during life, or any period not less than seven years.

18. A POLICY-HOLDER may at any time nominate his wife, mother, child, brother, sister, or niece to receive the sum assured payable at his death, provided it does not exceed £200.

19. PROBATE, &c., DISPENSED WITH.—When a claim under a policy does not exceed £200, the Commissioner may dispense with the production of probate or letters of administration, thus saving great expense to the representatives of the insured.

20. EXEMPTION FROM STAMP DUTY.—Annuities, policies, powers of attorney authorizing the receipt of moneys, and receipts for moneys payable under the Act, are exempted from stamp duty.

21. NO POLICY or Medical Fees charged. Assurances are granted on a single life to the extent of £3,000.

22. NOTICES OF ASSIGNMENT are received and registered at the Head Office only. On this subject, attention is requested to the provisions of "The Government Insurance and Annuities Act, 1874."

23. CLAIMS AT DEATH.—Claims are payable by the Regulations one month after proof of death; but in practice they are paid in full as soon as death is proved and the representatives of the deceased are able to discharge the policy.
