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RATES OF POSTAGE.

Letters and Letter-cards.

Inland, the United Kingdom, British possessions (except Australia), and countries enumerated in list on page 3 1d. for each 4oz. or fraction thereof.

Note.—"Inland" includes Aitutaki, the Cook Islands, Mangaia, and Niue.
Australia 3d. for each 4oz. or fraction thereof for letters, and 1d. each for letter-cards.
All other places 3d. for each 4oz. or fraction thereof.

Post-cards.

All places Single, 1d.; reply, 2d.

Books and Printed Papers.

*All places 3d. for each 3oz. or fraction thereof.

Commercial Papers.

Town (for accounts, &c., only) 1d. if not exceeding 4oz., or 1d. for the first 4oz. or fraction thereof, and 1d. for each succeeding 2oz. or fraction thereof.
Inland 1d. for the first 4oz. or less, and 1d. for each succeeding 2oz. or fraction thereof.
*Australia and all other places 2d. for the first 10oz., and 1d. for each succeeding 2oz. or fraction thereof.

Pattern and Sample Packets.

*All places Not exceeding 4oz., 1d.; every additional 2oz. or fraction thereof, 1d.

Magazines (not registered).

All places except Queensland 1d. per 2oz. or fraction thereof.
Queensland 1d. per 4oz. or fraction thereof.

Magazines (registered).

New Zealand, Australia (except Queensland and Western Australia) Each copy, not exceeding 2oz., 1d.; if over 2oz. to 8oz., 1d.; every additional 4oz. or fraction thereof, 1d.
Queensland 1d. for 4oz. or fraction thereof.
Western Australia and other places As for unregistered magazines.

Newspapers

Town and Inland 1d. each.
Australia (except Queensland) and other South Sea Islands 1d. each.
All other places (including Queensland) 1d. each if not exceeding 4oz., and 1d. additional for every succeeding 2oz. or fraction thereof.

Parcels.

Inland 6d. for the first 1lb., and 3d. for each succeeding 1lb. or fraction thereof.
Australia, Samoa and Norfolk Islands 8d. for the first 1lb., and 6d. for each succeeding 1lb. or fraction thereof.
All other places See special tables under heading "British, Intercolonial, and Foreign Parcel Post."

3d. for all places.

Registration.

*There are special rates for Queensland and Western Australia, which see under respective headings "Printed Papers," "Commercial Papers," "Patterns and Samples."

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

LETTERS AND LETTER-CARDS.

1. The prepaid rates of postage on letters and letter-cards posted in New Zealand are—
Inland, and to the places enumerated 1d. for each 4oz. or fraction thereof.

Below
United Kingdom, Chilli, Costa Rica, Egypt, Italy, Mexico, Nicaragua, Paraguay, Peru, Portugal and Portuguese Colonies, Spain, Switzerland; Cook, Ducie, Easter, Norfolk, Pitcairn, Samoan, Society, Solomon, and Tongan Islands; New Hebrides, and the under-mentioned British possessions and protectorates, viz.: Aden, Ascension, Bahamas, Barbados, Bermudas, British Central Africa Protectorate, British East Africa Protectorate, British Guiana, British Honduras, British North Borneo, Canada, Cape Colony, Ceylon, Cyprus, Falkland Islands, Fiji, Gambia, Gibraltar, Gold Coast, Hongkong, India, Jamaica, Johore, Labuan, Lagos, Leeward Islands (viz., Antigua, St. Kitts, Nevis, Dominica, Montserrat, and the Virgin Islands), Malay States (Protectorate) (viz., Perak, Selangor, Negri-Sembilan, and Panang), Malta, Mauritius, Natal, Newfoundland, *Nigeria (Northern), *Nigeria (Southern), Orange River Colony, St. Helena, Sarawak, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Straits Settlements, Tobago, Transvaal, Trinidad, Turk's Islands, Uganda, Windward Islands (viz., Grenada, St. Lucia, St. Vincent, and the Grenadines), Zanzibar.

Australia 2d. for each 4oz. or fraction thereof for letters, and 1d. each for letter-cards.
All other places 3d. for each 4oz. or fraction thereof.

2. Letters not fully prepaid or posted wholly unpaid are charged double the deficiency at the prepaid rate on delivery.

3. No letter should exceed 2½ in. in length or 1½ in. in width or depth.

4. Coin, bank-notes, or other paper-money, cheques, &c., can be sent by letter-post only. All letters containing coin, bank-notes, or jewellery must be registered.

Late-fee Letters, &c.

5. Late-fee letters must be paid 1d. in addition to the ordinary postage. Such letters may, as a general rule, be posted at the post-office up to twenty minutes of the time the mail leaves the office, and in the railway travelling post-offices, guards' vans, and on board steamers up to the time of departure of train or steamer. Late-fee letters or commercial papers posted on board trains and steamers without the fee will be charged the late-fee on delivery. A concession is, however, made in respect to letters, &c., posted on trains while at a flag-station or railway siding at a place where there is no post-office. On letters, &c., so posted, no late-fee is charged if the words "Posted at (Name of flag-station or siding)" are written or printed on the address side of the letter.

Consignees' Letters and Loose Letters.

6. Consignees' letters are letters in closed covers concerning goods, and sent at the same time as the goods. They must be marked "Consignee's Letter." They are not liable to the late-fee if for delivery within the colony. Loose letters are letters other than consignees' letters which make part or the whole of their journey before being landed to the post-office.

7. Letters sent loose to the United Kingdom are treated on arrival as wholly unpaid letters. Loose letters for Australia must bear a late-fee or they will be surcharged on arrival.

POST-CARDS.

Rates of Postage.

1. The rates of postage are—
All places (Each single post-card, 1d.
.. .. (Each reply-paid post-card, 2d.)

How treated.

2. The face is reserved for the postage-stamp, for inscriptions relating to the Postal Service—such as "Registered," "Acknowledgment of Delivery," &c.—and for the address, which may be written or shown on a gummed label not exceeding 2 in. in length by 1 in. in width.

*Including Borneo, Bida, and Laboa.
*Including Akassa, Asaba, Benin, Bonny, Bussa, Burutu, Calabar (New and Old), Oshana, Opobo, and Warri or Forcados.

3. Engravings or advertisements may be printed on the face as well as on the back of cards, provided sufficient space is left for a clear address and for date-stamping. The name and address of the sender may also be written, printed, or stamped on the face or back.

4. On the reverse side any letter or other matter may be written, printed, engraved, or designed. Excepting stamps for prepayment and the address labels above mentioned, nothing whatever may be joined or attached to a post-card, unless it be addressed for delivery within the colony, in which case a receipt-stamp may be affixed to the back. Stamps cut from post-cards or newspaper-wrappers cannot be used for postage on letters, packets, or newspapers, or for payment of telegrams.

Reply Cards.

5. The reply-half of a reply-card must not merely be addressed to the country of origin, but must have been received attached to the corresponding half, otherwise double post-card rate will be charged. Each of the two halves must fulfil the conditions laid down for single post-cards. One-half must be doubled over the other, and the cards must not be closed up in any manner whatsoever. If the conditions applying to single post-cards are infringed, reply-cards are treated as letters. The sender of a post-card with a reply-half may indicate his name and address on the reply-half either in writing or by attaching a gummed label.

Irregular or Unpaid.

6. Any post-card exhibiting anything of an obscene, libellous, or obviously objectionable character will be detained and sent to the Dead Letter Office.

7. Post-cards infringing any of the above rules, except the last, are treated as unpaid letters.

8. Post-cards posted insufficiently prepaid or unpaid (such as private cards or post-cards not issued by New Zealand, or cards which have already been used for transmission) will be charged double deficiency at post-card rates.

Private Cards.

9. Private cards, including pictorial cards, bearing adhesive stamps may also be used as post-cards. They must be composed of ordinary card-board not thicker than that used for post-cards of the post-card pattern. The size must not be more than 5½ in. by 3½ in., and not less than 2½ in. by 2½ in. For inland transmission the cards may be entirely plain; but for transmission to places beyond the colony single cards must bear the words, printed or written, "New Zealand Post-card," and reply-cards the words "New Zealand Post-card Reply." They are otherwise treated like officially issued post-cards. Private cards will be received from the public, and impressed with the penny postage-stamp, under conditions which may be ascertained upon application to the Secretary, General Post Office, Wellington.

BOOK-POST.

1. The book-post is divided into two classes: (a) Commercial Papers, and (b) Printed Papers. For transmission by book-post as a "commercial paper" or "printed paper" articles must be sent in covers *entirely open at one or both ends, or in open envelopes with the flap turned inside.*

NOTE.—Letters will not pass as commercial papers even if they are sent in open covers. The only way to send a letter is by letter-post, or by writing it on the back of a post-card or on a letter-card. Writing in commonly unknown characters such as Chinese, &c., will render the packet liable to letter rates of postage.

(A.) COMMERCIAL PAPERS.

Rates of Postage.

2. For delivery from the office at which posted (town deliveries) the following documents, if not exceeding 4oz., may be sent for 1d.:

Accounts (receipted or unreceipted), formal receipts, invoices, premium renewal notices, demands for rates or calls. (See conditions below.)

With the foregoing exceptions, the postage for commercial papers is—

(a.) Within New Zealand,—

For delivery from any other office than that at which posted, and for town papers exceeding 4oz.:

(b.) To all other places ...

Not exceeding 4oz. ...	1d.
For every additional 2oz. or fraction thereof ...	1d.
For any weight not exceeding 10oz. ...	2½d.
For every additional 2oz. or fraction thereof ...	1d.

Definition.

3. Commercial papers include all papers or documents written or drawn wholly or partly by hand (except letters or communications of the nature of letters, or other papers or documents having the character of an actual and personal correspondence). Any expression in the following table referring to print or printing shall be held to include type-printing, engraving, lithography, or autography, &c., easy to recognise. The expression "writing" shall be held to include type-writing as well as ordinary script.

4. The following documents, provided they conform to the conditions, are regarded as commercial papers:—

Description of Document.	Conditions.
Acceptances, bills of exchange, invoices, bills of lading (separately or enclosed with invoices),* consignees' advice-notes (marked "consignee"),* drafts, promissory notes, orders for goods (sent by commercial travellers), pay-sheets, ships' manifests, way-bills.	Nothing may appear in writing in the documents save dates, the names and addresses of the parties, the particulars and prices of any goods, or the particulars of any sums of money to which the document relates, and the mode of consignment of any such goods or money. Any other matter shall be wholly in print, and shall relate exclusively to the subject-matter of the document, or the terms on which business is transacted, by the person or firm issuing the document. Only accounts, &c., with printed envelopes for replies if desired, <i>for the person whose name appears on the cover</i> may be enclosed in the same envelope. The words "With thanks" may be added to receipted accounts, but anything, printed or written, in the nature of a request for payment will subject the account to letter rates of postage.
Accounts (receipted or unreceipted), formal receipts, invoices, premium renewal notices.	
Demands for rates or calls.	Nothing to appear beyond the name of the local body or the company issuing the notice and a demand for the amount due, together with extracts from any Act or Articles of Association fixing penalties for non-payment, &c.
Affidavits, briefs, deeds, depositions, powers of attorney, recognisances, scrip.	Nothing to appear in writing or print which does not form part of the document as a legal instrument.
Proposals and policies of insurance and proof of loss, private friends' and medical reports concerning proposals for insurance, returns of banks, public companies, &c., proxy forms, pass-books, cheque-books, stock-accounts, balance-accounts.	The document, as a rule, to consist of a printed form. Any written matter on such document to consist merely of information or statements appropriate to the form and necessary to the completion of the document.
Manuscript for press, manuscript sermons.	Any written or printed matter not forming part of the document must refer solely to the arrangement of the type. The covers must be marked "Manuscript for press," &c.
Specifications (with and without plans), examination papers, pupils' exercises with corrections but without comment thereon, written music.	Any written or printed matter not forming part of the document itself must relate exclusively to its subject-matter.
Old or spent letters (packets of) ...	The letters must clearly have served their original purpose, and must be at least two months old.

(B.) PRINTED PAPERS (INCLUDING BOOKS).

5. The postage for printed papers, except newspapers, is—

To any place within or beyond New Zealand ... { 1d. per 2oz. or fraction thereof.

6. Copies of *Herald*, if enclosed in the authorized wrapper, will be sent free of charge to any place within the colony.

Definition.

7. Printed papers generally comprise all impressions or copies obtained on paper, parchment, or cardboard, by means of printing, engraving, lithography, autography, or any other mechanical process, easy to recognise, except the copying-press or type-writer; anything, not of glass, usually attached or appurtenant to any of the under-mentioned articles in the way of binding, mounting, or otherwise; and anything convenient for their safe transmission by post. No writing whatever is allowed on printed papers, except as specified hereafter.

8. Cards bearing the inscription "Post-card" are not accepted at the rate for "printed papers."

9. For places within New Zealand and Australia obliterated postage-stamps, if registered, may be sent at printed-paper rates of postage, but, with the one exception that stamped and addressed single envelopes or single post- or letter-cards to be used for replies may be enclosed with circulars, &c., packets of uncancelled stamps must be paid for at registered-letter or parcel rates. For all other countries postage-stamps, whether obliterated or not, and all printed articles or stamps constituting the sign of a monetary value, are excluded from transmission as printed papers, and must bear letter or parcel rates of postage.

10. The following is a list of the more prominent articles accepted as "Printed Papers"—

Description of Article.	Remarks.
Books, magazines, &c. (stitched or bound), drawings, engravings, fashion-plates, maps, printed music, notices of all kinds entirely printed, paintings, papers impressed for the use of the blind or cardboard drawing-models stamped in relief, photographs and albums containing photographs, pictures, plans, valentines.	A dedication may be written on books, sheets of music, photographs, and engravings, and the invoice relating to any such work enclosed.
Christmas or other seasonable or complimentary cards	A complimentary or conventional remark, and the names and addresses of the sender and addressee may be written. (For example: "To John Smith, with best wishes from Mary Smith, Christmas, 1895.") Cards bearing communications such as "Write soon," "Hoping to see you shortly," &c., must be paid for at letter rates.
Cards of invitation, notices of meetings	The name of the person invited, and the date, object, and place of the gathering, may be added in manuscript. In notices of meeting of Friendly and other Societies the amount of any subscription due may also appear in writing.
Visiting-cards	The address and title of the sender, as well as good wishes, congratulations, thanks, condolences, or other formulae of courtesy, expressed in five words at most, may be added in writing.
Travellers' cards	Cards to be not larger in size than 5½ in. x 3½ in., and not less than 3½ in. x 2½ in., merely advising customers of the intended visit of the traveller. The name of the traveller, the place and the date of his visit, may be inserted in writing, and a list of prices current printed on the back of the card. The list of prices may be in writing, but no other matter, whether printed or written, will be permitted. If the card is not enclosed in an envelope, the whole of one side must be reserved for the postage-stamps and the address. Cards may be folded, and when folded must conform with the above measurement.

Description of Article.	Remarks.
Ships' advice	The date of departure may be added in writing.
Catalogues, price-current, stock- and share-lists, tenders for advertisements	The prices and figures may be inserted or altered in manuscript.
Circulars, &c., printed letters posted in quantity and bearing internal evidence that they are intended for transmission in identical terms to the several addressees	Circulars may be corrected in writing, and the date of despatch and the name and address and description of the sender and addressee may be inserted in writing.
NOTE.—Printed letters posted singly, and which are of the nature of an actual and personal correspondence, must be paid for as letters. For example, printed letters or slips, such as "You are requested to call at this office without delay," "Your account is very much overdue, and must be settled forthwith," cannot be accepted as circulars unless at least twenty copies in identical terms are posted at one time.	If produced by any other mechanical process than printing, at least twenty copies must be submitted to the post-office simultaneously for posting, and special attention called to their nature. The word "Circular" must be written or printed on the circular and on the envelope containing it. Inland circulars or manuscript may, when posted in quantities of not less than 1,000 at one time, be prepaid in cash instead of stamps. A few hours' notice should in such case be given to the Postmaster.
Newspaper cuttings	The title, date, number, and address of the publication from which the clipping is made may be added.
Obliterated postage-stamps addressed to places within New Zealand and Australia. For other places see paragraph 9	If registered.
Proofs of printing, with or without the manuscript relating thereto	Manuscript additions and alterations relating to the subject-matter or the arrangement or correction of the type may be inserted.
Prospectuses	Wholly printed and without note or comment.

11. The expressions referring to printing include any species of type-printing, engraving, lithography, autography, &c., easy to recognise.

When Writing is permitted.

12. Printed papers, of which the text has been modified after printing, either by hand or by means of a mechanical process, except as specified herein, or which bear any mark whatever of such a kind as to constitute a conventional language, cannot be sent at printed-paper rates.

13. As exceptions to the above rule, it is permitted—

- (a) To indicate on the outside of the paper the name, commercial standing, and address of the sender;
 - (b) To indicate or alter in a printed paper, in manuscript or by a mechanical process, the date of despatch, the signature, and the commercial standing or profession, as well as the address, of the sender;
 - (c) To correct errors in printing in printed documents;
 - (d) To mark through certain parts of a printed text, in order to render them illegible;
 - (e) To make prominent, by means of marks, passages of the text to which it is desired to draw attention;
 - (f) In forms of order or subscription for books, newspapers, engravings, pieces of music, to indicate in manuscript the works required or offered, and to erase or underline the whole or part of the printed communications;
 - (g) To paint fashion-plates, maps, &c.
14. Additions made in manuscript, or by means of a mechanical process, which would deprive printed paper of its general character and give it that of individual correspondence or communication, are forbidden.

GENERAL BOOK-POST REGULATIONS.

APPLYING TO BOTH "PRINTED PAPERS" AND "COMMERCIAL PAPERS."

How to Pack.

15. A book-pocket may be posted either without a cover (in which case it must not be fastened in any way) or in a cover entirely open at one or both ends, so as to admit of the contents being easily withdrawn for examination. If an envelope be used, it must be entirely open at one end, or the flap turned inside. Small slits cut in the ends of closed envelopes are not regarded as leaving a packet open for inspection. For the greater security of the contents, however, it may be tied at the ends with string, but the string must be easy to unfasten. Packets containing bank pass-books are allowed to pass at printed-paper rates if the covers are sufficiently open at the ends to enable the pass-books to be identified as such.

16. Address cards and all printed matter of the form and substance of an unfolded card may be forwarded without wrapper, envelope, fastening, or fold. The face is reserved for the postage-stamps, indications relative to the Postal Service, and the address. The sender is permitted to indicate there his name, profession, and address, by means of a stamp, autograph stamp, or any other typographical process. Requisitions to libraries may bear the printed words "Library Order" (or Requisition).

Limits of Size and Weight.

17. The limits of size for book-packets are 18in. in any direction. If made up in the form of a roll, a packet may measure up to 2ft. 6in. in length and 4in. in diameter. Packets exceeding these limits will be detained and sent to the Dead Letter Office. The weight must not exceed 4lb.

Short Paid or Irregularly Posted.

18. Book-packets posted wholly unpaid, if addressed to countries beyond New Zealand, are detained, advertised for one month on a list exhibited at the office of posting, and, if not paid for in the meantime, sent to the Dead Letter Office. Unpaid or insufficiently-prepaid packets addressed to any place within the colony, and insufficiently-prepaid packets for places beyond the colony, are sent to destination, charged with double the deficiency, at prepaid rate, on delivery.

19. If "commercial papers" or "samples" are enclosed with "printed papers" the rates for "commercial papers" or "samples" respectively must be paid.

20. "Commercial papers" and "printed papers," photographs, cards, &c., marked on the outside as such, bearing or containing writing other than that authorised, or closed against inspection, or containing enclosure not authorised by the foregoing rules, or any enclosure addressed to a name which differs from that on the cover, if addressed for any place within the colony, are sent to destination surcharged simple letter rate, minus the postage already prepaid. (The fine on open packets not to exceed 6d., unless the written matter enclosed represents more than a foolscap sheet of writing.) If addressed to any place beyond New Zealand the packets are detained and sent to the Dead Letter Office.

PATTERNS AND SAMPLES.

Rates of Postage.

1. The rates of postage for patterns and samples are—

For all places within and beyond New Zealand, except Queensland	For each packet not exceeding 4oz. ... 1d.
For Queensland	For each additional 2oz. or fraction thereof ... 4d.
	For each 2oz. or fraction thereof ... 1d.

2. Unpaid or insufficiently-prepaid pattern- or sample-packets are treated in the same manner as unpaid or insufficiently-prepaid "printed papers."

3. If "commercial papers" are included in a pattern- or sample-packet, then the rates applicable to "commercial papers" must be paid on such packets. "Printed papers" may be enclosed with pattern- and sample-packets.

4. Patterns and sample-packets (except such as are absolutely prohibited) bearing or containing writing beyond that authorised in section 10, or such as may be closed against inspection, or contain enclosures not authorised by these rules, if posted for any place within the colony, are sent to destination surcharged simple letter rate, less the postage already paid. (The fine on open packets will not exceed 6d. if the written matter does not represent more than a foolscap sheet of writing.) If addressed to any place beyond the colony the packets will be detained, and sent to the Dead Letter Office for disposal.

Definitions.

1. The pattern and sample post for places beyond New Zealand and Australia, excepting Queensland, is restricted to *hand-fade* trade patterns or samples of merchandise, and natural history specimens not forwarded for commercial purposes. Patterns or samples must possess no saleable value, or they will be detained and sent to the Dead Letter Office. Packets containing articles of saleable value may be sent at sample rate to any place within New Zealand and Australia, excepting Queensland. Packets containing watches, jewellery, &c., may be sent under this regulation, but must, if the value exceeds ten shillings, be registered.

2. Samples of eider-down, raw or thread silk, woollen or goats' hair thread, vanilla, or singles are deemed inadmissible if they weigh more than 3oz.

3. Wedding-cake may be forwarded by sample post to places within New Zealand and Australia if securely packed in tin boxes and marked "Packet Post." For other places beyond the colony wedding-cake must be paid for at letter rates of postage or sent by parcel post, but must be enclosed in tin boxes.

4. Packets not *hand-fade* samples or patterns may be sent by parcel post to any of the countries with which parcel post exchanges exist.

How to Pack.

5. Patterns or samples, when practicable, must be sent in covers open at the end, and packed in such manner as to be easy of examination; but samples of seeds, drugs, and such articles, which cannot be sent in covers of this kind, may be posted enclosed in boxes or in bags of linen, or other material, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened.

No Writing allowed.

6. Patterns and samples must not bear any writing except the name and address of the sender, the address, a manufacturer's trade-mark, numbers, prices, and indications relative to weight or size, or to the quantity to be disposed of.

7. Writing in characters such as Chinese, &c., will render the packet liable to letter rates of postage.

Dangerous Articles.

8. Such articles as scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pens, nails, keys, watch-machinery, metal tubing, pieces of metal or ore, provided that they be packed and guarded in a secure manner as to afford complete protection to the contents of the mail-bags and to the officers of the Post Office, while at the same time they may be easily examined, may be forwarded as samples.

9. Articles of glass must be securely packed in boxes of metal, wood, leather, or clothed, so as to prevent all danger to correspondence or postal officers.

10. Liquids, oils, and fatty substances which are easily liquefied must be enclosed in glass bottles hermetically sealed. Each bottle must be placed in a wooden box furnished with sawdust, cotton-wool, or spongy material in sufficient quantity to absorb the liquid in case the bottle be broken. Finally the box itself must be enclosed either in a case of metal or of wood, with a screw top, or of strong and thick leather. When hollow wooden blocks, of wood, with a minimum thickness of 2½ millimetres (about ¼ in.), are used with sufficient quantity of absorbent material inside, and provided with a lid, the blocks need not be enclosed in a wood case.

11. Fatty substances which are not easily liquefied, such as ointments, soft-soap, tins, &c., the transmission of which offers less inconvenience, must be enclosed in an inner case (box, bag of linen, parchment, &c.), which must itself be placed in a second box of wood, metal, or strong and thick leather.

12. Dry powders, whether dyes or not, must be placed in cardboard boxes which themselves are enclosed in a bag of linen or parchment.

Live Bees, Natural History Specimens, &c.

17. Live bees and harmless entomological specimens may be forwarded at sample post rates to any place within the colony, Australia, the United Kingdom, and to the United States, provided they are enclosed in covers so constructed as to avoid all danger and to allow the contents to be ascertained. Live bees similarly packed may also be sent to all other places. Natural history specimens, such as dried or preserved animals and plants, geological specimens, &c., when not sent for commercial purposes, are admitted to transmission as samples.

Limits of Size and Weight.

18. Packets addressed to places within New Zealand, Australia, or the United Kingdom must not exceed 2ft. in length, or 1ft. in width and depth. The maximum weight admissible to places within the colony and the United Kingdom is 5lb., and Australia 1lb. (See under "Prohibited Articles.")

19. Patterns and sample-packets sent to any other place must not exceed 1ft. in length 6in. in width, 4in. in depth, and 12oz. in weight, unless they be in the form of a roll, for which the maximum dimensions are limited to 1ft. in length and 6in. in diameter.

MAGAZINES.

For New Zealand and the Commonwealth of Australia (except Queensland and Western Australia)—Each copy of a registered magazine, not exceeding 2oz., 4d.; if over 2oz. and up to 8oz., 1d.; each additional 4oz. or fraction, 4d.

For Queensland—Not exceeding 4oz., 1d.; each additional 4oz. or fraction, 1d.

For Western Australia and other places, as for printed papers. Magazines are registered on application to the Secretary, General Post Office. Unregistered magazines are charged for at printed-paper rates.

NEWSPAPERS.

Rates of Postage.

1. The postage for the transmission of newspapers is—

(a.) For places within the colony—For each newspaper, 4d.

(b.) For Australia (except Queensland) and the South Sea Islands—For each newspaper, 1d.

(c.) For other countries and Queensland—Each newspaper, 1d. for the first 4oz., and 4d. for each additional 4oz. or fraction thereof.

2. If more than one newspaper be enclosed in a packet, each newspaper must be prepaid, as if separate.

3. Newspapers, if addressed to places beyond the colony and posted unpaid, are deemed and advertised as in the case of "printed papers." Unpaid and insufficiently prepaid newspapers intended for delivery within the colony, and insufficiently prepaid newspapers for places beyond the colony, are forwarded to destination charged double the deficiency at the prepaid rate.

Conditions of Transmission.

4. Newspapers published in the colony must be registered at the General Post Office, to which a fee of 5s. is payable.

5. A newspaper is a publication consisting wholly or in great part of political or other news, or of articles relating thereto or to other current topics, with or without advertisements. It may be printed and published in New Zealand or elsewhere, but shall be published in numbers at intervals of not more than thirty days. The full title and date of publication shall be printed at the top of the first page, and the whole or part of the title and the date of publication at the top of every subsequent page.

6. A supplement to a newspaper shall be deemed to be part of such newspaper for the purposes of the regulations, and shall consist wholly or in great part of matter like that of a newspaper, or of advertisements, printed on a sheet or sheets or on a piece or pieces of paper, or consisting wholly or in part of engravings, prints, or lithographs illustrative of articles in the newspaper. The supplement shall in every case be published with the newspaper, and shall have the title and date of publication of the newspaper printed at the top of every page, or, if it consist of engravings, prints, or lithographs, at the top of every sheet or side. Insets, advertising-sheets, or handbills are not allowed to pass as supplements.

Exemptions from Postage.

7. Single copies of newspapers addressed to the Manager, Librarian, or other person having the charge of any New Zealand Athenaeum, Mechanics' Institute, Hospital, Lunatic Asylum, Public Library, Young Men's Christian Association, or Free Reading-room, which shall have been authorised to receive newspapers free of postage; to the Catholic Reading-room, Wellington; Sailors' Hosts, Dunedin and Port Chalmers; Chambers of Commerce, Auckland and Dunedin; certain Charitable Institutions in the Christchurch Postal District; or to the Royal Colonial Institute, London, are permitted to pass through the post free. If directed to the care of the officer or to a name at the institution they will be treated as ordinary newspapers.

8. "Newspaper exchanges" (i.e., single copies of newspapers exchanged between newspaper offices in the colony, and addressed to the Editor, Proprietor, Publisher, or Manager) are permitted to pass through the post free of postage. The title of the newspaper and the words "Newspaper Exchange only" must be written or printed on each one above the address. Newspaper exchanges not complying with these rules will be charged as ordinary newspapers.

9. Not more than one copy of any issue of a newspaper intended for free transmission under the two preceding paragraphs will be forwarded free of charge. If more than one be posted not prepaid with postage a charge of 1d. will be made for each extra newspaper enclosed.

Must not contain Enclosure or Writing.

10. A newspaper for any place within the colony must not contain any enclosure other than the supplement or supplements proper to the newspaper. Any other printed enclosure contained therein will render the addressee liable to double the charge for "printed papers," less the postage affixed.

11. If a "commercial paper," "pattern," or "sample" be enclosed in a newspaper for any place within the colony, double the postage for "commercial papers" and "patterns and samples" respectively, less the postage affixed, will be charged.

12. A newspaper must not contain any writing beyond the name and address of the addressee, the initials or name and address of the sender, and any marks or signs simply intended to call attention to passages in a text.

13. Newspapers intended for delivery within the colony which infringe the preceding rule, or are fastened in their covers by means of gum, sealing-wax, postage-stamps, or otherwise, are sent to destination surcharged simple letter-rate minus the postage affixed. The fine so imposed will, however, not exceed 6d. unless the writing enclosed represents more than one sheet of foolscap. Such newspapers, if addressed to any place beyond the colony, are detained and sent to the Dead Letter Office.

How to Pack.

14. A newspaper must be posted either without a cover or in a cover entirely open at both ends, so as to admit of its easy removal for examination.

15. Newspapers addressed to places beyond the colony are subject to the same conditions respecting dimensions and weight as "printed papers."

REGISTERED ARTICLES.

Fee in addition to Postage.

1. The fee for registration is 3d., in addition to the ordinary postage, and must be prepaid.

2. The sender of a registered article may obtain an acknowledgment of its due receipt by the addressee on payment, at the time of posting of the article, of an "acknowledgment-fee" of 2d., in addition to the ordinary registration-fee. No inquiry as to the delivery of a registered letter will be made except by means of an Acknowledgment of Delivery form, to which must be attached the fee of 2d.

What may be Registered.

3. Any letter, letter-card, post-card, book or other packet, newspaper, or inland parcel will be accepted for registration. Parcels for places beyond the colony, except the United States of America, cannot be registered.

4. No article directed to initials, or to a fictitious name, can be registered.

How and when to Register Letters, &c.

5. Every letter, &c., to be registered should be presented at the counter, and a receipt obtained for it, and must on no account be dropped into the letter-box.

6. No letter-carrier, messenger, or other servant of the Post Office is allowed to carry a letter for any person to be registered.

7. Letters may be registered during ordinary office-hours, and for despatch by any mail, up to within one hour before the closing of such mail.

Advantages of Registration.

8. The registration of an article renders its transmission much more secure, and the loss of a registered packet is a very rare occurrence.

Postmaster-General's Liability.

9. In the event of the loss of an inland registered letter or a registered letter from any country with which New Zealand has a reciprocal arrangement as to indemnities the Postmaster-General will be liable to pay a sum not exceeding £2, under the following conditions:—

1. The letter must be duly registered by the sender.

2. No compensation for loss will be given in respect of—

(1.) A letter containing any article which may not be lawfully sent by post.

(2.) Money, unless it be sent by letter-post, and then only on the following conditions being complied with:—

(a.) That any coins enclosed in the letter be packed in such a way as to move about as little as possible.

(b.) That the number, amount, bank of issue, and (where necessary) the date of any bank-note enclosed be supplied to the Postmaster-General when required.

(c.) That the amount and number of any postal note enclosed be supplied to the Postmaster-General when required.

(d.) That particulars sufficient to identify the document be supplied to the Postmaster-General in the case of any bill of exchange, bond, coupon, or other order or authority for the prepayment of money, or security for money, enclosed in the letter.

3. The compensation given in respect of loss shall not in the case of any letter exceed the sum of two pounds, whatever be the value of the contents, and shall in no case exceed the value of the article lost.

4. In every case it must appear that the loss did not arise wholly or in part by the fault of the sender, and that it occurred while the letter was in the post.

5. Evidence of the loss of a registered letter shall be given to the Postmaster-General by a statutory declaration made by or on behalf of the claimant, setting forth,—

(a.) The date when, and the place where, such letter was posted, so far as the same can be reasonably ascertained.

(b.) A description of the contents and value of such letter, so far as known to the claimant, and the fact of the loss.

(c.) Any other particulars required by these regulations, or tending to establish the facts of the loss and verify the claim made.

But the Postmaster-General may require any further or additional reasonable evidence to satisfy him as to any such alleged loss or value; or, where he deems the loss proved by other means, may dispense with the whole or any of the requirements of this regulation.

6. The Postmaster-General may in every case, if he thinks fit, reinstate the article lost instead of giving pecuniary compensation.

7. Where compensation is given, the Postmaster-General reserves the right to retain and dispose as he thinks fit of the letter or its contents in case it should subsequently come into his hands.

8. In no case will the Postmaster-General give compensation for injury or damage consequential upon the loss, damage, or delay of a letter, or any article contained therein.

9. Without prejudice to any of the preceding rules, the Postmaster-General may, if he thinks fit, refuse to give compensation for loss on any ground on which a common carrier might in like case claim exemption from legal liability. The decision of the Postmaster-General upon all questions of compensation is final.

Compulsory Registration.

10. Valuable articles sent in unregistered letters are exposed to risk. All inland and Australian letters or packets, therefore, which unquestionably contain coin, bank-notes, or jewellery, even though they be posted without registration, are treated as "registered," and charged double the registration-fee, in addition to the ordinary postage; and any such letter, &c., which cannot be registered in time to be forwarded by the mail for which they are posted are detained for the next despatch.

Prohibitions.

11. It is prohibited to send to any of the countries mentioned at Table B ("List of Countries to which Postal Union States are charged") any registered article marked on the outside with the declared value of the contents; and Postmasters must refuse to receive articles which are so marked.

12. It is forbidden to send coin, jewellery, or precious articles by letter-post to any of the countries enumerated at Table B which are not marked (*).

13. Jewellery, &c., if addressed to countries which do not admit of their transmission by letter-post, and with which New Zealand has parcel exchanges, may be sent by parcel-post, except in cases in which they are specially prohibited; see special tables under heading "British, Intercolonial, and Foreign Parcel Post."

14. The registration to some countries is incomplete. In such cases articles are as a rule registered to the port of arrival, and the continuation of the registration thence to destination is left at the discretion of the country of arrival.

Redirection.

15. Registered articles are redirected free of charge on the same conditions as ordinary letters.

REDIRECTION.

Conditions of Free Redirection.

1. Redirected letters, post- and letter-cards, commercial papers, printed papers, newspapers, and sample-packets are treated as if they were addressed direct from the first office of posting to their ultimate destination, no charge whatever being made for intermediate redirections.

When letters are fully prepaid for their first destination they are charged on delivery only the actual difference between the postage from the first office of posting to the ultimate place of destination and the postage originally affixed to the letters. Thus, a post letter prepaid 1d. and posted at Wellington for Auckland would be redirected free of charge thence to Dunedin, or to any place named in the list on **page 3**. Telegrams readdressed for transmission by post are charged 1d.

Parcels treated differently.

2. Parcels are, when redirected, liable to additional postage at the prepaid rate for each redirection, except where the original and corrected addresses are both within a free delivery from the same post-office.

Redirection of Registered Letters.

3. Registered letters, &c., the redirection of which is desired after delivery, must not be dropped in the letter-box, but must be handed in at the office counter.

Notices of Removal.

4. Notices of removal and applications for the redirection of letters, &c., must in all cases be signed by the persons to whom the letters are addressed. The printed form of notice, which will be supplied on application at any post-office, should be used wherever practicable.

UNCLAIMED LETTERS.

1. On the first day of each month a list is exhibited at each post-office in the colony of the addresses of all letters received from places beyond the colony that have remained unclaimed for two months at such post-office, exclusive of the month in which they were received; and such of those letters as remain unclaimed at the end of a further period of one month are then forwarded to the Dead Letter Office, to be returned unopened to the countries where they originated. Unclaimed letters originating in the colony are not advertised, but at the end of one month are forwarded (excepting special-request letters) to the Dead Letter Office, Wellington, there to be opened and returned to the writers.

2. Under section 22 of "The Post Office Act, 1900,"—

(1.) Every postal packet addressed to any person at any premises licensed under "The Licensing Act, 1881," or at any shipping office, or public or private lodginghouse, and delivered to or received by the licensee of such premises, or the person apparently in charge of such office or lodginghouse, or any one acting as the agent or servant of any such licensee or person, shall be deemed to be under the control of the Postmaster-General until delivered to the person to whom the same is addressed.

(2.) If the same is not so delivered within two months after the receipt thereof by or on behalf of such licensee or other person as aforesaid, and if instructions to the contrary are not received from the person to whom the same is addressed, the licensee or other person as aforesaid shall return the same to the nearest post-office, with the reasons therefor.

(3.) Every such postal packet shall be transmitted to the Dead Letter Office, and shall be there dealt with as undelivered.

(4.) If any such licensee or other person as aforesaid omits or fails to return any such postal packet as aforesaid he is liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

(5.) The foregoing provision of this section shall extend and apply to telegrams transmitted by electric telegraph.

SPECIAL-REQUEST CORRESPONDENCE.

1. Letters and other articles posted in the colony, having the names and addresses of the senders written, printed, or embossed on the address side or on the fly of the envelopes, are returned unopened to the writers or senders by Chief Postmasters, when not claimed within thirty days; and all such articles which have, in addition, a request on the address side of the cover that the articles be returned if not claimed within a stated period, are also returned unopened by Chief Postmasters at the end of such period. No such articles, however, will be returned unless they have remained in the post-office to which addressed at least ten days. This section includes in the colony the possessions of Aitutaki, the Cook Islands, Mangalia, and Niue.

2. Letters and other articles originating outside the colony which bear a special request to return to the sender within a stated period are sent by Chief Postmasters at the end of such period to the Dead Letter Office, Wellington, for immediate return to the country of origin.

3. Letters and other articles of this class originating at hotels, clubs, or places of public resort are not returned unopened by Chief Postmasters unless, in addition to the printed or embossed address on the cover, the name of the actual sender also appears.

4. The above instructions do not apply to the following classes of correspondence, which, however, are sent at once to the Dead Letter Office after having been retained in accordance with **paragraphs 1 and 2**: Registered and official articles (excepting those of the latter class otherwise specially directed), surcharged articles, and letters containing coin.

5. Special-request articles are recommended to be marked as follows, near the left-hand upper corner: "If not claimed in ten days return to [name and address]." Unless the name of the sender as well as the address is given, the request for return will not be acceded to.

BUSINESS HOURS.

1. All post-offices are opened for delivery of letters, sale of stamps, receipt and delivery of parcels, and registration of letters, &c., from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (except as otherwise shown in the list of post-offices) on week-days only. Money-order and savings-bank business is transacted at certain offices and hours named in the list headed "Money Orders" in the Post and Telegraph Guide, on week-days only.

2. Certain post-offices specially authorised by the Postmaster-General may be closed during the periods of sorting and despatching mails.

3. Telegraph.—The hours of attendance at offices where telegraph business is transacted, and a list of these offices, will be found in the list headed "List of Telegraph Offices" in the Post and Telegraph Guide.

4. Post Office and Telegraph Holidays.—The statutory post-office and telegraph holidays are New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, the 24th of May, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day. When one of these days falls on a Sunday, the next day is observed as a holiday in lieu thereof. Partial holidays only are observed on Easter Monday and Boxing Day.

DELIVERY.

1. To facilitate the delivery of letters a letter-box should be affixed to every house-door. 2. Deliveries from office counters, &c., are made from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on week-days, but certain post-offices specially authorised by the Postmaster-General may be closed during the periods of sorting and despatching mails.

3. Letter-carriers and messengers are prohibited from distributing any letters, newspapers, &c., except such as have passed through a post-office. They are not allowed to deliver in the street or elsewhere except at houses or places of business, even to addressees; nor are they allowed to deliver under doors. They are not permitted to receive any payment beyond the postage for the delivery or collection of any letter or newspaper, or to deviate from the route laid down for them. The prohibition, however, from receiving payment in addition to the postage does not extend to Christmas gratuities. For delivery of parcels by parcel-post, see **regulations under "Parcel Post."**

4. No person living within the town free delivery can claim to have his letters delivered at the office if a delivery by letter-carrier is about to take place; but letters which arrive by a mail, after which there is no immediate delivery by letter-carrier, may be obtained by any person on application at the office, so long as it is open for delivery.

5. Receipts must be given for all registered articles upon delivery thereof.

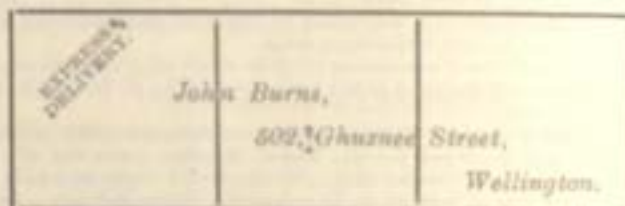
6. Letters addressed to the post-office, or to be kept till called for, may be obtained at the office, except where it is ascertained that it is the practice of persons living within the town delivery to have their letters so addressed, in which cases they will be sent out by letter-carrier. Letters for persons residing beyond any official delivery will be delivered on application at the office. It is not permitted to return any letter to the sender or to any one else, or to delay forwarding it to its destination according to the address, even though a request to such effect be written thereon (except under the provisions for special request, see "**Special-request Letters**"), as every letter must be delivered to the person to whom it is originally directed, and to him alone. Information must not be given by a postal officer respecting letters, &c., which pass through a post-office, except to the persons to whom they are addressed.

EXPRESS DELIVERY AND SPECIAL MESSENGER SERVICES.

1. THERE are express delivery and special messenger services at the following offices:—

2. All letters and parcels not exceeding 5 lb. in weight, posted at any post-office, intended for express delivery, must be boldly and legibly marked on the left-hand side "Express Delivery," and two parallel lines drawn across the front and back of the letter or parcel, thus:—



and the delivery-fee affixed in stamps, in addition to the ordinary postage. "Expressed" articles will be received up to time for receiving late letters.

3. All articles not so marked, or not fully prepaid the postage and delivery-fee, will be treated as a rule as ordinary correspondence, and delivered in the usual way. In certain cases, however, where the delivery-fee has been paid and the distance apparently miscalculated, or the postage inadvertently omitted, the articles will be delivered and the deficiency collected from the addressee and affixed to the letter in postage-due stamps.

4. The delivery-fee for each article is 6d. for the first mile, and 3d. each additional mile up to two miles, or three miles in all.

5. Delivery will be by telegraph messenger boy. The sender may, however, direct that delivery be made at the post-office, in which case the words "To be called for" must be written underneath the words "Express delivery."

6. A receipt must be given by the recipient for each specially delivered article.

7. "Expressed" letters, properly stamped for delivery from the post-office, also telegrams fully stamped for transmission, may be handed to any telegraph messenger or letter-carrier for delivery at the office. In no case, however, will the letter-carrier or messenger wait while the letter or telegram is being written.

8. A special messenger will be placed at the disposal of any telephone exchange subscriber on request being made to the exchange. Such messenger may be utilised for running an errand, ordering a cab, delivering a small parcel or letter, or any similar service. The fee to be paid will be the same as for express delivery; but beyond three miles and up to five miles, cab-hire, or return tram-fare, must be paid, in addition to the mileage fee. The whole of the messenger's journey will be counted as from the post-office. For example, if the telephone exchange subscriber lives half a mile from the office and the messenger has to deliver an article a mile beyond the subscriber's residence, the charge will be as for two miles. In the event of a boy being required to deliver a number of parcels or letters to different addresses, or to return with a reply, the charge will be at the rate of 1s. for the first hour and 6d. for each succeeding half-hour or portion thereof.

9. The delivery of "expressed" letters and parcels will be made from the time the offices named are opened until the last regular received mail of the day is sorted. The special messenger service will be available during the hours the telegraph-office is open for public business.

TIMES FOR POSTING CORRESPONDENCE.

1. Seaborne mails, as a general rule, are closed for ordinary correspondence one hour previous to the despatch of the mails from the post-office, but by payment of a late-fee see page 3; letters may be posted until within twenty minutes of the time the mail leaves the office.

2. Late letters may also be posted on board steamers, and in the travelling post-offices and guards' vans of the principal trains. The late-fee in all cases is an extra single rate of postage.

POSTAGE AND REVENUE STAMPS, POST-CARDS, AND NEWSPAPER-WRAPPERS.

1. Every Postmaster is required to keep for sale to the public a sufficient stock of the various postage and revenue labels and post-cards in use in the colony, and to sell them at the following prices:—

Applications for embossing must be made to the Secretary, General Post Office, Wellington.

2. No person excepting a postal officer may, unless specially licensed by the Stamp Department, sell postage-stamps, post-cards, or newspaper-wrappers. The penalty for such illegal sale is ten pounds. Discount-stamps are not permitted to be used for postage, and are only sold at money-order offices.

3. To prevent the perforating of postage-stamps by the employees in large establishments, the stamps may be perforated with the initials of the firms, &c., so as to render the improper use of such stamps a matter of difficulty. The perforation with initials of the stamps on post-cards and newspaper-wrappers is also allowed; but permission in all cases must first be obtained from the Postmaster-General.

4. Stamps should be placed on the front of the letter, and upon the right-hand corner of the upper side. On redirected letters care should be taken not to place fresh stamps over the stamps which have been previously used.

5. Stamps which have been torn, cut, or otherwise rendered imperfect, except by perforation, cannot be used.

6. Postage-due stamps, or stamps cut from post-cards or newspaper-wrappers cannot be used for prepayment of postage on letters, packets, or newspapers, or for payment for telegrams.

7. English, Victorian, and New South Wales postage-stamps may be obtained by permission of sending a stamp or stamped envelope to their relatives or friends in the United Kingdom, Victoria, and New South Wales, in order to relieve them of the cost of the postage when sending replies. These stamps cannot be purchased in quantities of more than two shillings and sixpence worth at one time, nor are they permitted to be used for the purpose of making remittances.

* Including registration-fee of 3d.

REPURCHASE OF STAMPS.

1. Postmasters in charge of money-order offices are permitted, though not compelled, to purchase from the public New Zealand postage-stamps of not less value than 10s. (provided the stamps be not soiled or otherwise damaged), at a discount of 5 per centum.
2. Discount-stamps are purchased at money-order offices if mounted on the special card provided for the purpose and presented in quantities of the value of 1s. or its multiple. They are not permitted to be used for postage.
3. To prevent the temptation to steal stamps attached to letters, which might be afforded by facilities for selling them, single stamps cannot be purchased. The stamps must in all cases be presented in strips of not less than two.

PRIVATE BOXES AND BAGS.

1. Private letter-boxes are provided for merchants and others upon payment, in advance, of the following fees:—

- (a.) For a term exceeding six calendar months and not exceeding one year, one pound (£1).
- (b.) For a term not exceeding six calendar months, ten shillings (10s.); and
- (c.) Provided that no private box shall be let for a term less than six months, to date from the day on which the same shall be let; and that, where there are two or more applicants for the same box at the same time, the preference shall be given to the person desiring to have the same for the longest term.

2. No private box can be held in the joint names of a number of persons unless it be known that the applicants are in business partnership. Private persons are not permitted to join in renting a private box. Subject to the above restrictions, any person can have a private box who is willing to pay the appointed rent. No person can be permitted to engage a private box for Sunday or for a certain day or days only.

3. Letters directed to any person renting a private box, and letters directed to members of the family or servants, also letters directed to the care of the box-holder, will be deposited in the box (unless written notice be given to the contrary). The registered and unpaid correspondence will be retained by the delivery-clerk, and the box-holder notified by means of cards placed in the box.

4. Each box is provided with a door, lock and key, which must be kept in repair at the holder's expense.

5. Private-box lobbies at chief post-offices are open as follows:—

At all other offices the hours are irregular, and vary from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. or 11 p.m., and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., according to local requirements and facilities. The lobbies are also open on Sundays and holidays, but at irregular hours.

6. Persons residing upon mail-routes requiring the accommodation of private bags can obtain the same upon payment, in advance, of the undermentioned fees to the Chief Postmaster of the district, and subject to the following regulations:—

- (a.) The fees payable for private mail-bags shall be—For a term exceeding six calendar months and not exceeding one year, two pounds (£2); for a term not exceeding six calendar months, one pound (£1). Provided that no private mail-bag shall be let for

a term less than six months, to date from the day on which the same shall be let. If taken delivery of at the office at which it is made up the fee is the same as for a private bag.

- (b.) The bag must be provided with a lock and two keys, and kept in repair at the cost of the person requiring it. When empty it must not exceed two pounds in weight. All private bags must be approved by the Postmaster.
- (c.) The Postmaster must securely lock the bag before despatching it, and it must be returned to the Postmaster in the same manner.
- (d.) The bag must only contain correspondence for persons connected with the establishment of the owner of the bag, or who may be in his employment; and it must be distinctly understood that such owner is responsible for the postage of all unpaid letters, and for returning receipts for all those which may be registered.
7. Mail contractors are bound to convey and deliver, free of charge to the holders, all private bags given to them by Postmasters or under their instructions, but are not required to deviate from the prescribed mail-route, and are on no account to be delayed. Should a mail bag not be ready at the appointed time and place, the contractors are not required to wait for it.

MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS AND SUGGESTIONS.

Non-liability of the Post Office.

1. The Post Office is not, by law, responsible for any loss or inconvenience which may arise from the non-delivery, mis-sending, or mis-delivery of any unregistered letter, book, or other postal packet; nor is it responsible for any injury which a packet may sustain during its transmission. See, however, regulations in re insurance of parcels.

Secure Packing recommended.

2. To guard against their being injured, all postal packets which are likely to suffer from stamping or from great pressure, should be placed in strong covers; and it is recommended that such articles should be sent by parcel-post. Fragile articles should not be sent by post.
3. The main business of the Post Office being the transmission of letters, the forwarding of book-packets and newspapers (which no one is compelled to send through the Post Office), though an important, is only a secondary object, for which no arrangement can be made which would interfere with the quick and regular conveyance and delivery of letters. Books and packets, therefore, which would be injured by being thrust into a bag and hurriedly pressed down like a bundle of letters, should not be sent through the post.
4. In order that no failure may occur in the delivery of newspapers through the covers being detached, it is recommended that the addresses be written on exposed parts of the newspapers themselves, as well as on the covers.

Postmasters and the Public.

5. No information can be given respecting letters which pass through a post-office except to the persons to whom they are addressed; and in no other way is official information of a private character allowed to be made public. A Postmaster may, however, give an address if he has no reason to believe that the person whose address it is would disapprove of his doing so.
6. Except in the case of "special-request" letters, post-cards, or circulars which cannot be delivered, Postmasters are not allowed to return any article to the writer or sender, or to say one else, or to delay forwarding it to its destination according to the address.
7. Postmasters are not bound to weigh letters, books, packets, or newspapers for the public, but they may do so if their duty be not thereby impeded. This rule does not apply to parcels, which are tested both as to weight and size before being accepted.
8. Postmasters are not bound to give change; and when money is paid at a post-office, whether as change or otherwise, no question as to its right amount, goodness, or weight can be entertained after it has been removed from the counter.
9. No postal officer is permitted to take money in prepayment of postage (except in the case of inland simulators posted in quantities of not less than one thousand at one time), or to affix postage-stamps on letters, &c., posted at any post-office. Postage-stamps should in all cases be affixed by the sender or person posting the correspondence.

All Articles should bear Sender's Address.

10. Every letter or other article should contain the full address of the sender, in order to secure its return if the person to whom it is directed cannot be found. A much larger portion of the undelivered letters would be returned if the names and addresses of the senders were always plainly written at the end of the letters or embossed on the envelopes.

Use of Sealing-wax discouraged.

11. The practice of sealing with wax (except such as is specially prepared) letters passing to and from countries with hot climates is attended with much inconvenience, and frequently with serious injury, not only to the letters so sealed, but to the other letters in the mail, from the melting of the wax and adhesion of the letters to each other. The public are therefore recommended, in all such cases, to use either wafers or gum, and to advise their correspondents in the countries referred to to do the same.

Money and Valuables should be Registered.

12. Neither money nor any other valuable article ought ever to be sent through the post, except by means of a money-order, postal note, or in a registered letter. Any person who sends money or jewellery in an unregistered letter not only runs a risk of losing his property, but exposes to temptation every one through whose hands his letter passes.

Privilege of Postmaster-General.

13. Any person conveying (otherwise than by the post) a letter not exempted from the exclusive privilege of the Postmaster-General incurs, by law, a penalty of £20 for every letter so conveyed.

Addressing Correspondence.

14. Much difficulty is experienced in the delivery to their right owners of letters imperfectly addressed, and the Post Office has frequently incurred unjust censure either for unintentionally delivering such letters to wrong persons or for declining the responsibility of delivering them at all. The address of every letter ought to be full and distinct; and, in the case of the larger towns, the name of the street and the number of the house should always form part of the address. The practice of addressing letters to a town only prevails to a large extent, and in such cases the letters are not only liable to suffer delay, but to be lost altogether through being delivered to wrong persons.

Examination of Packets.

15. It is the duty of Postmasters, whenever they have ground for suspecting an infringement of any of the conditions relating to commercial papers, patterns and sample-packets, newspapers, and printed papers generally, and occasionally even where there is no ground for suspicion, to open and examine packets posted at or passing through their offices.

Exceptional detention of Postal Packets other than Letters.

16. To prevent obstacles to the regular transmission of letters, a Postmaster may, when necessary, delay forwarding any book-packets or newspapers, samples, and parcels until the following despatch.

Circulars.

17. Circulars should be tied in bundles, with all the addresses in one direction, and should be posted early in the day.

PROHIBITED ARTICLES.

1. Any indecent or obscene print, painting, photograph, engraving, book, or card, or any other indecent or obscene article, or any letter, newspaper, publication, packet, or card having thereon any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, libellous, or grossly offensive character; matches of any kind; also any explosive, dangerous or noxious substance, any living creature, excepting live bees and hives, or any other specimens for delivery in the colony, Australia, the United Kingdom, and the United States (see section 17, page 10), or anything likely to injure the contents of the mails or any officer of the Post Office.

(Under the Inland Parcel-post, however, fish, meat, game, eggs, &c., razors, scissors, needles, knives, forks, or other sharp instruments, are permitted to be forwarded if so packed as to prevent all risk of injury to other parcels or to the officers of the Post Office. Liquids, or semi-liquids, such as paint, &c., or glass in any form, are also received if so packed as to be secure from breakage.)

2. The transmission by post of gold, silver, precious stones, jewellery, &c., is prohibited in all countries mentioned at Table B, pages 22 to 26, which are not marked (*). Such articles may, however, be sent to such of the countries not so marked as have parcel-post exchanges with New Zealand, except in cases where the Parcel-post Regulations specially exclude their admission. Vine-cuttings, except such as are addressed to the care of the Agricultural Department, are not permitted to be imported into New Zealand; any received through the post, unless so addressed, will be delivered to the Customs.

3. Tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, or snuff cannot be sent to the United Kingdom or New South Wales by letter- or sample-post. The United Kingdom, however, admits samples of

unmanufactured tobacco not exceeding 4oz. at a Customs duty of 8d. per package. The introduction into New South Wales of opium by post is prohibited.

4. Pure spirit, articles containing spirit or into the manufacture of which spirit has entered, cannot be sent to the United Kingdom by sample-post.

5. In Luxembourg the registration of packets containing gold, silver, jewellery, &c., is compulsory, and everything of value, except coin or bullion, is liable to duty.

6. In the under-mentioned colonies, viz.:

articles of value are transmissible, and, with the exception of jewellery addressed to Ceylon, Newfoundland, and St. Vincent, are exempt from Customs duty. Their transmission is also permitted in

Cyprus, Grenada, and Jamaica;

but they are liable to Customs duty, with the exception of gold and specie in Cyprus, gold, silver, and diamonds in Grenada, and diamonds in Jamaica.

7. In France engravings, prints, drawings, and chromo-lithographs are liable to Customs duty, and cannot be sent by post to that country in quantities sufficiently large to have a saleable value, but small quantities can be sent as *bona fide* specimens.

8. In the Dutch East Indies articles of value are admissible, except wrought gold and silver, but the packets containing them must be registered.

9. Special prohibitions in Queensland, the Cape of Good Hope, Italy, Norway, Serbia, Transvaal, Dutch East Indies, and United States of America: Anything relating to lotteries.

10. In Italy or other countries sent forward on Italy, letters, if containing gold or silver money, jewels or precious articles, registered or otherwise, are opened, the articles confiscated, and the letters sent on to destination. Illustrated post-cards are subject to Customs duty, and cannot be forwarded in quantities by letter-post.

11. In Spain and Victoria jewellery is dutiable, and liable to confiscation. Samples of cloth, woven fabrics, felt, and paperhangings addressed to Spain by post must not exceed 40 centimetres in length or width, unless the latter be well defined by a border, when it may be the full width of the piece.

12. *Russia*.—Stitched or bound books, being liable to Customs duty, cannot be sent at postal rates.

13. *Russia*.—Printed matter in the Russian language is prohibited; and even such trifling articles as photographs and Christmas cards are liable to duty, though a single photograph may be sent to Russia by post. All letters or packets containing prohibited or dutiable articles of any kind, however small the value, are confiscated in that country. Russian Government bonds cannot be enclosed in ordinary or registered letters to Russia, and if discovered in correspondence 25 per cent. will be deducted from their amount in Russia as a fine.

14. *Sweden and Russia*.—Papers impressed for the use of the blind cannot be sent at postal rates.

15. In all countries beyond His Majesty's Dominions and Italy, Egypt, Guatemala, Nicaragua, and Salvador Christmas cards, &c., must be prepaid letter rates if any complimentary remarks appear upon them in writing.

16. In *Perussia* obliterated stamps are subject to Customs duty.

17. In *Portugal* packets of bound books must be prominently marked on the outside, "To be submitted to Customs."

18. In *Perussia* printed papers other than books relating to science, art or industry, magazines and newspapers, are liable to Customs duty. They can therefore only be sent by letter or parcel-post.

19. In *Queensland* advertising pamphlets are charged Customs duty at the rate of 25 per cent. on estimated bulk value of the pamphlets. Such duty must either be remitted with the goods or a local agent appointed who will pay the amount on demand.

20. In *Norfolk* advertising pamphlets, circulars, &c., sent through the post in large quantities, though not necessarily in bulk, are liable to Customs duty at 4d. per lb.

21. In *Egypt* only one copy of any printed work to any one addressee is permitted to be imported free. Any book addressed to a library, or person dealing in books, will be subject to Customs duty also. Additional copies will be charged Customs duty, 8 per cent. ad valorem.

22. *Spain*.—Arms and opium by book-post are not permitted. Gold, silver, precious stones, and jewellery may be sent only at letter rates.

23. *Senegal, St. Pierre et Miquelon, French Guiana, and French establishments of Oceania*.—Same as for France.

24. *Persia*.—Colours made with aniline must not be sent by post to Persia.

25. *New Caledonia*.—Same as for France. Beans and plants of coffee are prohibited by a local law.

1. All packages of such a nature as to require special protection to assure their safe transmission through the post should be sent as parcels, otherwise that protection cannot be afforded. The postage must be fully prepaid in postage stamps, which should be affixed by the sender or the person handing in the parcel to a label which may be placed at the counter. The label must then be affixed to the right-hand top corner of the parcel.

Parcels not to be dropped into Letter-box.

2. Packages for transmission by parcel post must bear the words "Parcel Post" written or printed conspicuously in the left-hand top corner, and must be handed in at a Post Office counter or delivery-window. Every parcel should bear the name and address of the sender on the cover, but in such a position as not to be mistaken for the address of the parcel. The officer to whom it is handed will check the size, weight, and postage affixed before accepting the parcel. Parcels must not be posted in post-boxes; infringements of this rule render inland parcels liable to a fine of 6d. on delivery, and foreign parcels to detention.

3. Postmasters are forbidden to hand a parcel back to the sender, except as provided in the clause headed "Undelivered and Unclaimed Parcels."

Customs Declaration.

4. The sender of a parcel addressed to any place beyond New Zealand will require to make a Customs declaration on a form to be obtained at any Post Office) describing the contents and stating the value, and also giving the name of the office of destination and the sender's signature and place of residence. False declaration involves the forfeiture of the parcel, and renders the sender liable to prosecution under the Customs laws.

Limits of Weight and Size.

5. Parcels not exceeding 11lb. in weight, 24 in. in length, or 6ft. in length and girth combined, are accepted for transmission to all places within the colony, except—

- (v) Hawke's Bay has a special delivery by sub-subsidiary carrier.
 (v) Delivery extends now to Wairarapa.
 (v) Delivery extends to Hawke's Bay three days a week.
 (v) Morning delivery includes Patea, between Havelock and Wairarapa Bridges. Afternoon delivery by carrier extends as far as the Breakwater.
 (v) Three deliveries on Monday and Wednesday only. First only (extending over whole town) on Tuesday. Two first on Thursday and Saturday.
 (v) First delivery in Up. or East Street, Balla Street (east side), Karaka Creek, Edward Street, Hill Street, Hays Road, Hays Cr. St., Mount Pleasant, and Papanui; second to Irititanga and Mount Pleasant, Wairarapa, and Wairarapa.
 (v) First delivery to Main Street and western portion of town; second delivery to Main Street and West and North; third delivery to Main Street and eastern portion of town; on Wednesdays the delivery begins at 12.45 p.m.
 (v) Delivery to Otara Road, Brooklyn, and part of Happy Valley, also Kildare and Rosemeath, twice daily.
 (v) Parcels—Letter-carriers' weekly half-holiday: No afternoon delivery on (a) Wednesday, (b) Thursday, (c) Friday, (d) Saturday. As far as practicable, letter-carriers' half-holidays are arranged to correspond with the holidays observed under the Shops and Shop-assistants Act. When a general holiday falls on some other day, and shopkeepers do not observe the usual half-holiday, the letter-carriers will make full deliveries. Correspondence may be obtained on application at the delivery-counter of the Post Office.

ing those not served by railway, coach, or steam-boat (see next section), to the Australian Colonies, and the United Kingdom. Thus a parcel measuring 3ft. 6in. in length could be 2ft. 6in. in girth, while one of 3ft. in length might be 3ft. in girth, &c. The limits of weight and size of parcels for other countries will be found in the table which follows. Weights must not exceed 25lb. in diameter.

6. Parcels for or from New Zealand offices not served by railway, coach, or steamer, a list of which is given at **pages 146 to 150**, must not exceed 5lb. in weight, 2ft. in length, and 1ft. in breadth or depth; nor can parcels for those offices be accepted which are of too fragile a nature to permit of their safe transmission in mail-bags.

How to Pack.

7. The public will greatly facilitate the work of the Post Office and help towards the safe delivery of parcels by taking care that they are in all cases compactly, strongly, and securely packed, especially those with fragile or perishable contents. It should be borne in mind that a parcel must be frequently handled before it reaches its destination, and, although every care will be taken by the officers through whose hands it passes, it will be impossible to avoid occasional damage if the packing be defective.

8. Parcels containing perishable articles, such as game, fish, eggs, &c., may be accepted for inland transmission. Razors, scissors, needles, knives, forks, or other sharp instruments, liquids, or semi-liquids, such as paints, &c., bottles, or glass in any form, may be forwarded both inland and to such of the countries beyond the colony as do not specially prohibit their introduction (see **prohibitions** in the table which follows, last column). All such articles must, however, be securely packed, so as to prevent all risk or injury to other parcels or the officers of the Post Office.

Prohibitions.

9. Parcels bearing or containing writing or marks of an offensive or indecent character, or containing gunpowder, cartridges, matches of any kind, or anything explosive or liable to sudden combustion, bladders containing liquid, live animals, offensive or filthy matter, or any substance likely to cause injury to other parcels or to the officers of the Post Office, rays of any kind; also all clothing of every kind which has ceased to be in actual wear and does not form part of the personal effects of any passenger or any other person on board a vessel arriving in the colony, are not accepted for transmission. The Customs Department has decided that in the case of parcels of second-hand clothing arriving by post the contents of which are not discovered to be second-hand until after being opened, delivery is not to be made until the clothing has been properly fumigated under the direction of post office officials. Should any such parcels arrive, addressees must be given notice that parcels will be held to allow of fumigation being carried out. Parcels addressed to countries beyond the colony must not contain any perishable articles, such as fish, game, &c. Vine cuttings may not be imported into New Zealand, and any found in the post as received from abroad will be handed over with wrappings to the Customs. In addition to the above, parcels are liable to the further prohibitions indicated in the last column of the table which follows.

Coin, Paper-Money, and Letters Prohibited.

10. Parcels must not contain any letter, coin, or bank-notes, or any packet or parcel intended for delivery at an address other than that borne by the parcel itself. Unsigned and cancelled bank-notes may, however, be forwarded to places in the colony in sealed parcels, provided the cover indicates the contents. For every letter so enclosed, and for each article directed to an address other than that on the parcel, the parcel becomes liable to a surcharge of double the postage which such enclosure would have cost if sent separately. Invoices may, however, be sent in parcels addressed to offices within the colony. Parcels having written thereon any communication in the nature of a letter are subject to a fine of 6d.

Bullion and Jewellery.

11. Parcels containing jewellery, watches, articles of gold, silver, and such-like valuables should be insured and specially packed as instructed in **paragraph 9**, under the heading of Insurance of Parcels. If addressed to any place within New Zealand they may be registered in lieu of being insured, or may be insured and registered if desired, but their insurance or registration is not compulsory unless the contents are over 10s. in value. The transmission of such parcels to certain countries is interdicted (see **prohibitions** in the last column of the table of British, Intercolonial, and Foreign Parcel Post charges). Parcels containing gold mined in the North Island, if addressed to countries beyond the colony, can only be posted at Money Order Office, and senders will have to pay thereon the gold export duty (2s. per ounce) in addition to the usual parcel postage and insurance rates. Bullion for the Australian Colonies cannot be sent by parcel-post, but may be forwarded by letter-post.

Franked Parcels from the United Kingdom.

12. Senders of parcels posted in the United Kingdom and addressed to New Zealand may defray all charges arising on them, such as Customs duties, redirection fees, &c. Such parcels should be indorsed "Free of all charge."

Registration, Certificates of Posting, and Acknowledgment of Receipt.

13. Parcels for delivery in the colony and for the United States of America may be registered on the same conditions as letters. Parcels directed to places beyond the colony, except the United States of America, cannot be accepted for registration, but the sender may obtain a certificate of posting on payment of a fee of 3d., the certificate to include as many parcels as the sender may choose to enter on a list to be handed in in duplicate with the parcels. For an additional fee of 2d. for each parcel an acknowledgment of receipt (A.R.) by the addressee will be obtained in any of the Australian States and forwarded by post to the sender. For an additional fee of 2d. a receipt for parcels delivered within New Zealand may be obtained from the addressee on delivery and forwarded to the sender. Neither certificate of posting nor registration involves any liability on the part of the department beyond that named in the clause headed "Postmaster-General's Liability."

Parcels may be Examined.

14. Parcels may be opened and examined by postal officers, but this does not make obligatory that the ends shall be left open by senders. After so opening the examining officer will securely refasten them.

Delays in Transmission.

15. Parcels may be delayed when their transmission would interfere with the due dispatch of letter-mails.

16. The Postmaster-General is not responsible for any loss which may arise through the delay of any parcel.

Delivery of Parcels.

17. At places served by letter-carriers delivery of parcels will be made by them as far as practicable. Where letter-carriers are not employed, or where they are unable to deliver parcels, delivery must be taken at the Post Office. Senders are recommended to inform addressees by post of the despatch of parcels, so as to assure prompt delivery.

18. Parcels addressed to a Post Office "To be called for" will, after they have remained in the office seven clear days (excluding Sundays and holidays), be charged demurrage at the rate of 1d. a day. No demurrage, however, will be charged on parcels to places at which there is no house-to-house delivery, or for persons on board ship.

19. Parcels cannot be delivered until all charges due thereon, such as Customs duty, redirection fees, &c., are paid.

Undelivered and Unclaimed Parcels.

20. When a parcel is refused by the addressee, or known to be undeliverable, the sender will be immediately communicated with, and he may elect to have it redirected to another place or returned, but he must pay a fresh rate of postage for such redirection or return.

21. Unclaimed parcels will be retained at the office from which they should be delivered for one clear month, exclusive of the one in which they are received. At the end of that period the sender will be advised that they cannot be delivered, as provided in the preceding section.

22. Inland parcels, if not claimed by the addressee or senders within three months, exclusive of the one in which they have been received, will be disposed of as the Postmaster-General may direct. Parcels with perishable contents may be destroyed immediately they become offensive. Parcels from countries beyond New Zealand, if unclaimed, will be retained until the expiry of six months from the date of posting of the advice of non-delivery, and then returned through the Dead Letter Office to countries of origin.

Redirected Parcels.

23. Redirected parcels are liable to a new rate of postage for each redirection, except parcels addressed to officers and seamen of Her Majesty's ships in Australasian waters, which are readdressed without charge within or from New Zealand. Also, parcels addressed to Her Majesty's troops in South Africa who have died or who have returned home are redirected free of charge.

Postmaster-General's Liability.

24. In the event of any damage or loss occurring during transit, the Postmaster-General shall in no case be liable to pay, by way of compensation to the owner or otherwise, a greater sum than two pounds sterling in respect of any parcel.

INSURANCE OF PARCELS

1. The Postmaster-General is not legally liable to make good any claim arising out of the conveyance of a parcel sent by post, but, subject to the following regulations, he will grant compensation up to a limit of £20 for the loss or damage of a parcel posted in the colony for delivery there, or to any of the countries enumerated in the additional postage table published on next page.

2. The free payable in addition to the ordinary postage to secure compensation will be found in the said table.

2. All such fees must be prepaid by means of postage stamps, which the sender must affix to the parcel with the stamps in prepayment of the postage.

4. A certificate must be obtained by the sender on posting an insured parcel, which must be produced by him when any claim for compensation arises. No charge will be made for such certificate.

5. No parcel may be insured for a sum in excess of the real value of the contents. An invoice, or description of contents and the value of each article contained in the parcel, must be enclosed therein. Over insurance is a bar to compensation.

6. Parcels containing any of the following articles are excluded from acceptance under these regulations, viz.: Liquids or semi-liquids, perishable articles such as eggs, butter, fruit, flowers, confectionery, &c., fragile articles such as glassware, &c.

Under no circumstances will compensation be given for the loss or damage to a parcel containing any of the above-mentioned articles.

7. Every parcel intended to be forwarded under these regulations must be carefully and substantially packed, with due regard to the nature of contents and the length of the journey, and must be secured in such a manner as to prevent tampering with it without leaving obvious traces of violation; for instance, seals should be placed over each join or loose flap of the covering of a parcel, and, if string be used in packing, a seal must be placed on the ends of the string where they are tied.

3. All seals on a parcel must be of the same kind of wax or lead, and must bear distinct impressions of the same device; and the device must not consist merely of straight, curved, or crossed lines. Coins must not be used for sealing.

9. Parcels containing jewellery, or any article of gold or silver, must be enclosed in strong boxes or cases, which must be securely fastened in wrappers of linen, canvas, strong paper, or other substantial material. The seals must be placed along the edges of each join or loose flap at distances of not more than 3 in. apart. For parcels outside the colony such parcels must be insured for at least part of their value; for parcels within New Zealand, they must be either registered or insured for registered and insured, if desired, unless their contents are not over 10s. in value.

10. If a parcel tendered for transmission under these regulations does not, in the opinion of the officer to whom it is tendered, fulfill the foregoing conditions as to packing and fastening, it is his duty to refuse to forward it. The onus of properly packing and fastening the parcel lies upon the sender, and the Postmaster-General assumes no liability for loss or damage arising from defects of packing or fastening which may not be observed at the time of posting.

11. When a parcel posted under these regulations is redirected from one country or colony to another, a fresh fee becomes payable for each such transmission; if this fee be not prepaid, it will be collected before delivery of the parcel. Insured parcels can be redirected to any place within the colony or to any of the countries mentioned in the additional postage table.

12. In the event of the contents of a parcel being damaged, the parcel should, as far as practicable, be retained in the condition in which it was received from the office of delivery, and be submitted, when required, to the examination of a reasonable officer.

13. Compensation for a parcel lost or damaged in the post will not exceed the amount of the actual loss or damage, but no compensation will be paid for a parcel containing any prohibited article, or which has been delivered without external trace of injury and has been accepted, without remark, by the addressee, or when loss or damage arises from flood, tempest, shipwreck, earthquake, war, or other causes beyond control.

14. No application for compensation will be entertained unless made within three months from date of posting if the parcel originated in New Zealand or Australia, and within six months if in any other country. Such application may be made to the postal administration of either country or colony of origin or delivery, but the certificate of posting must be produced when required.

15. The final decision upon all questions of compensation rests with the postal administration of the country or colony in which the loss or damage has taken place.

15. Any insurance effected contrary to the foregoing provisions is invalid.

General.

17. Where not repugnant to the foregoing regulations, the general regulations relating to parcels apply also to parcels forwarded under these regulations.

MONEY ORDERS.

Except as mentioned in the next paragraph, Money Orders are issued at the following Post Offices in New Zealand, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m., except on Saturday, when the Offices are not closed before 5 p.m.

The Money Order Offices at Auckland, Christchurch, Dunedin, Gisborne, Greymouth, Invercargill, Napier, Nelson, New Plymouth, Newton, Thames, Wanganui, and Wellington close at 1 p.m. on Saturday, except when the money-order portion of English mails is despatched to close later than 1 p.m., when the Offices named will remain open until 2 p.m., if necessary.

Money Order Offices are also Postal-note and, with few exceptions, Savings-Bank Offices.

Lots of the Money Order Offices in Australia, the United Kingdom, Ceylon, Hong-Kong, Japan, Straits Settlements, Cape of Good Hope, Natal, Hawaii, Fiji, Canada, and the United States on which Orders are issued may be seen at any Money Order Office in the Colony.

Money Orders may be drawn on any Post Office in Germany and in India.

COMMISSION CHARGEABLE ON MONEY ORDERS.

Commission on Money Orders issued in New Zealand is charged according to the following scales:—

BY TELEGRAPH.

(Within New Zealand.)

For every £1 or fraction of £1—3d., and a telegraph fee of 1s. for each Order.
Money Order Telegrams can be sent as urgent upon payment of 1s. on each Order in addition to the ordinary rates. Such telegrams will rate as *Urgent Ordinary Telegrams* and be sent in the order of their receipt with other telegrams of the like code.

(Australia.)

For every £1 or fraction of £1—3d., and a telegraph charge at the rate for a message to the colony upon which the Money Order is drawn. (See "International Telegraph Rates Table E," further on.)

One message will be sufficient for any number of Orders from the same remitter to the same payee, provided the numbers are continuous.

The remitter must also advise the payee by telegraph.

INDIA.

Issues of Money Orders issued in New Zealand on India are paid in rupees, annas, and pice; the rupee being the standard of value in India.

As, however, the value of the rupee is subject to constant variation, no tables of conversion can be given. All Orders on India are issued in sterling, and the equivalent in rupees is settled by the Post Office at Madras on the arrival of the Advice List from New Zealand.

Money Orders drawn in India on New Zealand are issued in the currency of India, and the equivalent in sterling is calculated by the Post Office at Madras at the rate of exchange current in India at the date of preparing the Advice List for despatch to New Zealand.

EGYPT.

Money Orders for Egypt will be subject to a deduction for through commission by the Ceylon Post Office.

COREA.

Full addresses are required in Money Orders for Corea. If possible, the address should be in vernacular whenever the payee is a native.

Limit of Amount of Money Order.

No single Order payable in New Zealand, United States and Canada, Cook Islands, Samoa, Germany, and Australia can be granted for more than £20. To other places the limit is £10.

No Fractions allowed.

No order is allowed to contain a fractional part of a penny.

Particulars required.

No money-order can be issued unless the applicant furnish in full the surname and, at least, the initial of one Christian name both of the remitter and payee, together with the remitter's address. The exceptions are as follow: If the remitter or payee be a peer or a bishop, his ordinary title is sufficient; if a firm, trading under the name of the persons comprising it, the usual designation of such firm will suffice. The remitter is at liberty to desire, at the time of issue, that the order be crossed thus: *and Co.* and be made payable through a bank, in which case it is left to his option to give or withhold the name of the payee. Prefixes, such as Mr., Mrs., Miss, Messrs., Revd., Doctor, are not allowed. The remitter, when applying for an order payable to a married woman, should be careful to give the forename of the payee and not that of her husband.

Application Forms.

Particulars of money-orders required must be furnished to the issuing Postmaster on the printed forms of application. Wherever practicable the form should be filled up by the applicant.

Orders cannot be cancelled.

An order once issued cannot be cancelled, and should repayment or transfer be required, application must be made on a form provided for this purpose, which can be obtained at any Money Order Office.

Payment of Money Orders.

When a money-order is presented for payment (otherwise than through a bank) the Postmaster has first to see that the signature of the payee (which must be written in ink) is in agreement with the name given in the advice. The Postmaster has then to request the applicant to furnish the name of the remitter, and, if the reply be correct, pay the order, unless he has good reason for believing that the applicant is neither the rightful claimant nor sent by him.

When an order is presented through a bank, crossed by stamp or in writing with the name of the bank by a person known to be in its employment, payment will be made without the signature of the person named in the advice as the payee.

Order may be crossed by Holder.

The holder of a money-order is always at liberty to direct, by crossing it, that the order be paid through a bank, notwithstanding that its payment was not originally so restricted.

Payment cannot be demanded on Day of Issue.

Payment of a money-order not issued for transmission by telegraph cannot under any circumstances be made on the day of issue.

No Liability after Payment.

After once paying a money-order, by whomsoever presented, the Department is not liable to any further claim.

Void Orders.

If payment of an order, whether issued in this colony or abroad, be not obtained before the end of the twelfth calendar month after that in which it was issued (for instance, if issued in January, and not paid before the end of next January) all claim to the money will be lost.

Telegraph Orders.

Money-orders for transmission by telegraph can be issued and made payable at Money Order Offices within the colony where there are Telegraph Offices, and similarly in New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Tasmania, and at the following places in Western Australia through Perth:—Albany, Bunbury, Coolgardie, Cossack, On, Fremantle, Geraldton, Guildford, Kalgoorlie, Kanowna, Newcastle, Northam, Perth, Roebourne, Southern Cross, York.

*The total amount which can be remitted to Australia by any one person to the same payee in one day must not exceed £40.

Orders on India, Japan, and Foreign Countries, &c.

As payment in Germany, Samoa, India, Japan, and Foreign Countries, &c., except the British Agencies at Constantinople, Smyrna, and Panama, is not made upon the orders issued in this colony, but upon new orders issued by the German, Samman, Indian, Hongkong, or London Offices, and forwarded by post to the payees in accordance with the address furnished by the issuing office, it is very important that the complete postal address of the payee should be given.

The remitter should retain the order issued here, but should advise the payee of the name of the remitter as given to the issuing office, and also of the delay in payment of the order which may probably occur from the transmission of the advice through the German, Indian, Hongkong, or London Offices.

Particulars of orders on India must be furnished in the vernacular on dockets supplied by the Department.

Orders on the United States and Canada.

The full postal addresses of both payees and remitters must be furnished by the remitters of orders issued for payment in the United States or Canada for entry in the native advices.

Natives of India.

In the case of natives of India, the name of tribe or caste and father's name must be given. The full name of the payee is required in vernacular whenever the payee is a native.

Payment can be stopped by Remitter.

The remitter of an order has full control over the money until payment has been made by the Department, and can therefore stop payment, obtain repayment, or alter name of payee.

Money Orders Lost, &c.

Application for the issue of a duplicate order, for stoppage of payment, or transfer from one office to another must be made to the chief office of the country in which the order is payable.

Application for repayment, alteration of name, or correction of error in name of payee or remitter must be made to the post-office of the country in which the order was issued. All such applications should be made on the prescribed forms, which can be obtained at any Money Order Office.

In the case of applications for duplicate orders or alteration of the name of payee or remitter, they must be accompanied by an additional inland commission in postage-stamps.

Repayment or transfer, whether of an original or duplicate order, will not be authorised until it has been ascertained that payment has been stopped at the office on which the order was originally drawn.

Post Office Savings Bank. Where established.

Every Money Order Office, except the following—

Blackburn	Paterson	Walsley

(is also a Post Office Savings Bank, and open for Bank business during the same hours as for Money Orders.

The Savings Banks at Auckland, Christchurch, Dunedin, Gisborne, Greymouth, Invercargill, Napier, Nelson, New Plymouth, Newton, Thames, Wanganui, and Wellington close, however, at 1 p.m. on Saturdays, but open again from 7 to 8.30 p.m. on Saturdays for the receipt of Savings Bank deposits and the opening of new accounts only. The Savings Banks at Ashburton, Hastings, and Timaru reopen from 7 to 8 p.m. on Saturdays for the same purpose.

Amount of Deposits.

Deposits of one shilling, or of any multiple of one shilling, may be made at any Post Office Savings Bank.

Interest.

Interest is allowed to each depositor at the rate of 3 per cent. per annum when the balance at the credit of his account does not exceed £200, and at the rate of 2½ per cent. when it exceeds £200; but no interest will be allowed on more than £500.

The calculation is made from the first day of the calendar month next following the day on which a complete pound has been deposited up to the last day of the calendar month preceding the day on which the money is withdrawn. The interest due to each depositor is calculated to the 31st December in each year, and is then added to and becomes part of the principal due to him.

Name, Address, and Occupation to be furnished.

A person upon opening an account must furnish his Christian name or forename and surname, occupation, and residence, and he must also sign a declaration to the effect that he is not directly or indirectly entitled to any sum or sums standing in his name or in the name or names of any other person or persons in the books of the Post Office Savings Bank (unless it be as trustee of another person or as a member of a friendly or other society).

Such declaration must be witnessed by the Postmaster, a Justice of the Peace, or by a solicitor of the Supreme Court.

Intending Depositors residing at a Distance from a Post Office.

Applications in writing from persons residing at a distance from any Post Office who may be desirous of opening an account, but are unable to attend personally to make the usual declaration before a Postmaster, will be received and acted upon. In such cases the Postmaster will forward a blank form of declaration, which must be filled up and signed by the intending depositor and attested by a Justice of the Peace, or by a solicitor of the Supreme Court. The Postmaster will also forward a depositor's book, in which the signature of the intending depositor is to be affixed in the place assigned for it, and be similarly attested. Both documents, with the money to be deposited, must be returned to the Postmaster without delay. On their receipt the Postmaster will enter the sum in the book in the usual manner, and return the book to the depositor.

Deposit to be entered in Depositor's Book, and acknowledged from the General Post Office.

Every deposit in a Post Office Savings Bank must be immediately entered by the Postmaster, or other person receiving it, in the depositor's book, and the Postmaster or other person receiving the deposit must affix his signature and the stamp of his office to each entry.

In addition to the receipts which the depositors will thus obtain in their deposit-books, they will receive for each deposit an acknowledgment by post from the General Post Office. If the acknowledgment does not reach the depositor in proper time, or if, when it reaches him, it shows any signs of erasure, or does not agree with the entry in his book, the depositor should immediately apply to the Secretary of the General Post Office by letter, and should renew his application again and again until he obtains a satisfactory reply.

By whom Deposits may be made.

Besides deposits by ordinary persons, deposits may be made—

(a) By a trustee on behalf of another person, in the joint names of that person and the trustee; but repayment of the same, or any part thereof, will not be made without the assent of both parties. A person may act as trustee in any number of accounts, and at the same time have an account in his own name.

(b) By two or more persons jointly on their own behalf, provided they are not already depositors either jointly or severally.

(c) By persons under twenty-one years of age. In the case of children under the age of seven years the declaration must be made by one of the parents or by a friend on behalf of the depositor, and the money cannot be withdrawn till the minor attains that age, when it will be payable to the signature of the minor alone.

(d) By women, whether married or single. Deposits made by a married woman, or made by a woman who afterwards marries, will be repaid to any such woman.

(e) By the trustees (or treasurer in cases where there are no trustees) of any friendly, charitable, or provident society or institution, or penny-bank, the rules of which have been certified or approved.

Applications, accompanied by a copy of the rules, must first be sent to the Controller, Savings Bank Department, Wellington.

Such societies, &c., are allowed to deposit without limit as to amount.

(f) By Education Boards and School Committees appointed under the Education Act.

(g) By the manager of an Industrial School, in trust for an inmate, for the deposit of the savings of the latter.

Depositor's Book to be sent once a Year to the Chief Postmaster.

On the anniversary of the day on which an account was opened the deposit-book should be forwarded to the Chief Postmaster for examination, insertion of interest, &c. Cores for the purpose can be obtained at every Post Office Savings Bank.

Depositors' Book Lost.

If a depositor lose his book a duplicate thereof shall be supplied to him upon application being made on the proper form, accompanied by a fee of two shillings.

Postage on Depositor's Books, &c.

No charge for postage will be made upon depositors for the transmission of their books to the Chief Post Office for examination, &c., or when communicating with the Controller in Savings Bank business.

Repayment of Deposits.

Any depositor at the principal office in the postal district can make withdrawals thereof without the necessity in all cases of making application in writing; but any depositor at a sub-office of the postal district wishing to withdraw the whole or any part of the sum deposited by him must make application for the same on a printed form, called a notice of withdrawal, which he can obtain at any Post Office Savings Bank. When he has properly filled up this form, he must fold and secure it, and forward it by post as if it were an ordinary letter. In return for it he will receive a warrant for the amount required by him, payable at the Post Office Bank named by him in the notice of withdrawal. The warrant should be presented for payment immediately, as the amount ceases to bear interest from the date of issue.

Withdrawals by telegraph can also be made by any depositor at a sub-office (which is a telegraph office) in the postal district in which the account may be open, upon filling up a form of notice of withdrawal, and handing it to the Postmaster, together with a fee of 6d., for the cost of a telegram to and reply from the chief office of the district. Withdrawals by telegraph may be made "urgent" on payment of an extra fee of 6d.

The Postmaster-General will endeavour to prevent fraud, and to identify every depositor transacting business with the Post Office Savings Bank; but if any person shall fraudulently represent himself to be a depositor, and, by presentation of the depositor's book, and compliance with the rules of the Department, shall obtain any sum of money belonging to that depositor, the Postmaster-General will not be responsible for the loss thereof.

Repayments shall be made only to the depositor in person, or to the bearer of an order under his hand, signed in the presence of and attested by a person known to the Postmaster, a Justice of the Peace, or, in case of sickness, of the medical attendant or a minister of religion.

If the depositor be resident out of the colony, his signature must be verified by a Governor, Judge, Mayor, Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other constituted authority of the place in which he resides. Printed forms of orders can be obtained at any Post Office Savings Bank.

Applications to withdraw money deposited by any friendly, charitable, or provident society, or savings bank must be signed by the sole trustee, or two of the trustees of any society or savings bank, or, when there is no trustee, then by the treasurer, or some officer performing the duty of treasurer; and the names of the trustee or treasurer, or other officer of the society authorized to receive the amount to be withdrawn, shall be stated in the notice of withdrawal. The warrant for payment of the amount shall be made out in the name of such trustee, treasurer, or officer, and the receipt of such person apparently authorized shall be a sufficient discharge for the same.

Funds of Deceased Depositors not exceeding £100.

In case any depositor shall die leaving any sum of money not exceeding one hundred pounds, exclusive of interest, deposited in the Post Office Savings Bank, and probate of his will or letters of administration be not produced to the Chief Postmaster of the postal district; or if notice in writing of the existence of a will, and intention to prove the same or to take out letters of administration, be not given to the Chief Postmaster of the postal district, at his chief office, within the period of one month from the death of the depositor; or if such notice be given but such will be not proved, or letters of administration be not taken out, and the probate or letters of administration (as the case may be) produced to such Chief Postmaster of the postal district within the period of two months from the death of the depositor, it shall be lawful for the Postmaster-General, after such period of one or two months, as the case may be, to pay all just debts due or owing by such deceased depositor, and to defray the expenses of his funeral, so far as the said sum of money shall extend, and divide the surplus, if any, at his discretion, to or among the widow or relatives of the deceased depositor, or any one or more of them; or, if he shall think proper, according to the Statute of Distributions.

Funds not exceeding £50.

Provided that where the amount standing to the credit of any deceased depositor is not more than £50 (exclusive of interest), and the Postmaster-General is satisfied that he may justly pay such amount to the person or persons applying for the same, the Postmaster-General may at his discretion, and upon receiving such indemnity and such proof of death, identity, and otherwise as he shall deem satisfactory, pay such amount to the person or persons appearing to be lawfully entitled thereto.

When there is no will or letters of administration the claimant of the deceased depositor's amount must make a statutory declaration, setting forth the grounds on which he claims, and forward the declaration to the Chief Postmaster, together with certificates or other satisfactory evidence of the death of the depositor, and of his identity. A statement showing, as far as may be, where deceased was born, what relatives he had in New Zealand and elsewhere, and what debts he left, if any, must also be produced.

Funds of Deceased Depositors exceeding £100.

In case any depositor shall die leaving any sum of money in the Post Office Savings Bank which (exclusive of interest) shall exceed the sum of one hundred pounds, the same shall only be paid to the executor or administrator on the production of the probate of the will, or letters of administration of the estate or effects of the deceased depositor, to the Chief Postmaster of the postal district, who, after satisfying himself as to their authenticity, will forward an attested copy or extract, with the usual application, to the Controller, Savings Bank Department, Wellington, for the decision of the Postmaster-General. But in any case, within the terms of this and the two last preceding regulations, the Postmaster-General may require such additional evidence as to the death or identity of the deceased depositor or otherwise as he shall be advised or require.

Payment on Death of a Depositor being Illegitimate and Intestate.

If any depositor, being illegitimate, shall die intestate, leaving any person or persons who, but for the illegitimacy of such depositor, or of such person or persons, would be

entitled to the money due to such deceased depositor, it shall be lawful for the Postmaster-General, with the advice in writing of the Attorney-General or other Law Officer of the Crown, to pay the money of such deceased depositor to any one or more of the persons who in his opinion are entitled to the same according to the Statute of Distributions as modified by "The Administration Act, 1879," or any other Act of the New Zealand Legislature.

Incapacitated Depositors.

If any depositor shall be found insane by inquisition or other competent authority, or become otherwise incapacitated to act, and the same shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General, and if the Postmaster-General shall be satisfied of the urgency of the case, he may authorize payment from time to time, out of the funds of such depositor, to any person whom he shall deem to be entitled thereto, and the receipt of such person shall be a good discharge for any such payment: Provided that where the deposits of any such depositor are claimed by the Public Trustee under any law for the time being in force authorizing him in that behalf, the Postmaster-General may, if he thinks fit, cause such deposits to be paid to the Public Trustee or to any agent whom he may by writing appoint.

Settlement of Disputes.

If any dispute shall arise between the Postmaster-General and any individual depositor, or any executor, administrator, next-of-kin, or creditor or assignee of a depositor who may become bankrupt or insolvent, or any person claiming to be such executor, administrator, next-of-kin, creditor, or assignee, or to be entitled to any money deposited in the Post Office Savings Bank, then and in every such case the matter in dispute shall be referred to arbitration, as provided by the 47th section of "The Savings Bank Act, 1858," an arbitrator to be chosen and appointed by the Postmaster-General, and the other by the party with whom the dispute arises. And for the purposes of this regulation the said 47th section shall, subject hereto, be deemed to be incorporated herewith. And whatever award, order, or determination shall be made by the said arbitrators shall be binding and enforce on all parties, and shall be final to all intents and purposes, without any appeal.

Secrecy.

The officers of the Postmaster-General engaged in the receipt or payment of deposits shall not disclose the name of any depositor, or the amount deposited or withdrawn by him, except to the Postmaster-General, or to such of his officers as may be appointed to assist in carrying out the provisions of the Post Office Savings Bank Act.

ELECTRIC TELEGRAPH.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH TELEGRAMS ARE AUTHORIZED TO BE TRANSMITTED ON THE TELEGRAPH LINES BELONGING TO THE GOVERNMENT OF NEW ZEALAND.

Non-liability for Errors, &c.

1. Neither His Majesty the King nor the Government of the colony shall be responsible for errors, omissions, or delays in the transmission of any telegram, or for the non-delivery or non-transmission of any telegram.

Charges.

2. The charges for transmission of a telegram within New Zealand are,—

For twelve words or less, including address and signature—	
Urgent	One shilling.
Ordinary	Sixpence.

Extra words, 2d. and 1d. each respectively.

On Sundays, at or for offices which are open from 5 to 5.30 p.m. only, these rates are doubled.

When more than one telegram, apparently part of a message previously lodged, is presented by the same sender during any one day, such telegrams may be treated as one

continuous telegram, and charged for accordingly, unless it be shown to the satisfaction of the Officer in Charge that they have no connection with each other.

3. Postage stamps must be used for payment, and any person sending a telegram is required to affix such stamps to the message forms.

Receipts for Charges.

4. Receipts for the amounts paid for international and intercolonial telegrams may be obtained by the sender free of charge at the Telegraph Office at the time of presenting such telegrams for transmission. A receipt for the amount paid for an inland telegram will be given at the time of presenting such telegram for transmission on payment of a fee of two pence.

How and upon what to be written.

5. Inland telegrams presented for transmission shall be written either in ink, or with pencil, or in manifold, in a clear and legible manner; cable telegrams shall be written in ink or in manifold. All telegrams shall contain a proper address, and bear a genuine signature in the usual handwriting of the sender, or in that of his authorized agent, but when written by the agent the latter shall add his name or initials, not for transmission, but for the information of the Post and Telegraph Department.

6. In order to prevent errors in the transmission of telegrams, all words must be written in full, and no abbreviations will be allowed that are not in general use and in accordance with the usage of the language. All numbers should be written in words in full, and not in figures.

7. Printed forms upon which telegrams should be written may be obtained at all telegraph-offices on application; but all telegrams, whether written upon the prescribed form, upon any other printed form, or upon plain paper, shall (subject to the provision hereinafter stated) be considered as presented for transmission under the several conditions contained in these regulations: Provided that telegrams written upon printed forms other than those supplied by the Government shall be first approved of by the Electric Telegraph Commissioner, or the same may be refused when presented for transmission. Books of telegram forms, interleaved with white forms for use with carbonic paper, may be purchased at the principal telegraph-offices at the cost price of 1s. each. One hundred forms, in duplicate, are contained in each book.

How to be signed.

8. When it is not intended or desired that the sender's signature should be telegraphed, it must be written on the back of the message. The message may then be transmitted without a signature, or with any signature known to the receiver, such as "Kate," "Harry," "Mamma," which the sender may insert for transmission; but the receiver may have the full signature telegraphed by paying for the necessary telegrams.

Special Instructions.

9. When the sender desires that special instructions, such as "Private," "Confidential," "To be opened at once," "Per Te Anau," "Post," "By first steamer," or the like, shall be written on the envelope of the message, he shall write those instructions immediately after the address of the receiver, and pay for them as part of the message. The words shall also be written in the space for instructions.

Cipher Telegrams.

10. Telegrams may be written in cipher, which will be counted according to the following scale, whether for figures or letters: Separate ciphers count as one word; groups of five ciphers, or fractional part of five ciphers, count as one word; groups exceeding five ciphers are counted at the rate of five ciphers to the word, and any fractional portion remaining is to be counted as one word.

11. The use of a cipher address is prohibited on messages for transmission within the colony.

Telegrams may be dropped into a Letter-box.

12. Persons not wishing to send to a Telegraph Office may post a telegram in an envelope addressed "Telegram Immediate," in a wall- or pillar-box, or at a receiving office or sub-post-office. Telegrams so posted are sent on by the next collection or the next mail

to the Telegraph Office to which the letters included in the collection are taken, and are then transmitted and delivered free of extra charge, provided the proper amounts for transmission and for postage (if any) have been prepaid. The time of arrival at the Telegraph Office is regarded as the time of receipt from the public. Telegrams may also be posted not enclosed in envelopes, and when so posted they will be treated in the same manner.

Telegram forms and envelopes, having the words (printed in red) "Telegram for transmission to the Officer in charge Telegraph Station," can be procured at Post Offices in towns where there is no Telegraph Station.

Order of Priority of Transmission.

13. All telegrams are required to be sent forward so as to reach the office of destination in New Zealand on the day of despatch. In any case where by accident this does not happen, the dates of despatch and receipt are plainly stated. Telegrams will be transmitted in the following order of priority:—

- (1) Telegrams from members of the Executive.
- (2) Government telegrams marked urgent.
- (3) Service telegrams.
- (4) Urgent private telegrams.
- (5) Non-urgent (ordinary) private telegrams.

Replies may be prepaid.

14. The cost of a reply may be prepaid, and a reply-form will then be delivered to the addressee, who will be at liberty to send another telegram of the value prepaid, from any Telegraph Office, at any time within six weeks. If the form be not used its value will be refunded on application being made within six weeks to the Accountant, General Post Office, and on the production of the form. A reply-form need not necessarily be used for a reply, but may be used to prepay any single inland message.

Collect Telegrams—Sender responsible for Transmission Charges.

15. Telegrams may be taken from the sender with the word "Collect" written thereon in the space for instructions, and in such case the value of the telegram will be collected from the receiver; but, in the event of the department being unable to collect the amount, the sender will be held responsible for the due payment thereof, and in such case, if the sender fails to pay the charges upon being requested to do so, the Officer in Charge of the Telegraph Office at which the telegram was delivered for despatch may in his own name, in any Court of competent jurisdiction, sue for and recover from the sender of such telegram all charges due for the transmission thereof.

16. The sender of a "Collect" telegram shall, if requested to do so, lodge the cost of it. Any difference between the sum required and that lodged will be settled, or any refund will be made, upon delivery of the telegram. The sender of a "Collect" telegram is at liberty to direct that delivery shall be conditional on the addressee first paying the charges. In such cases the words "Delivery conditional" must be inserted in the instructions and paid for.

Repetition at Request of Sender to Insure Accuracy.

17. Telegrams may be repeated, if the sender desires it, by being signalled back from office to office. No copy is, in such case, given to the sender. The charge for repetition is one-half the ordinary tariff; a fraction of a penny being reckoned as a penny. Telegrams containing mercantile quotations or figures, and telegrams written in cipher, or according to a preconcerted code, should always be repeated.

Repetition at Request of Addressee to Detect Errors.

18. If the receiver of a telegram doubts its accuracy, he may have it repeated by paying half the amount paid for its transmission to him, fractions of a penny being reckoned as a penny. Should he require only a portion of the message to be repeated, a payment must be made at the rate of 1d. for each word embraced in the repetition. For example, if 15 words in a message of 30 words are to be repeated the payment would be eightpence. The minimum charge, however, for repetition (even of a single word) is threepence. The money will be refunded if it should happen that the telegram has been incorrectly transmitted. The request for repetition must be in writing, and may be abbreviated to underlining the necessary words and adding the request—as, for example, "Please repeat"—on the delivered copy.

Inland Multiple Telegrams.

19. Prepaid telegrams addressed on one form to several persons in the same town, or to one person at different residences in the same town, may be accepted for transmission within the colony. If the telegrams be addressed to different towns, or are written on separate forms, both or all will be treated as distinct messages, and charged full rates. Each address will be complete in itself; consequently the office of destination will appear as many times as there are names of addressees. The text, and all the addresses, and the signature will be counted and charged for as a single message, with an additional fee of 2d. per address for each copy excepting the first. "Urgents" may be accepted at double the above tariff. The number of addresses will be indicated in the office of address by the insertion of "multiple [No. of addresses]" in the "Instructions"; but this information will be omitted from the message actually delivered, which will show one address only unless the sender has inserted and paid for the instruction "Communicate all addresses." Multiple telegrams cannot be sent "Collect."

Extent of Free Delivery.

20. Except as notified in the printed list of telegraph offices published from time to time in the Post and Telegraph Guide, all telegrams will be delivered free of charge within a distance of one mile by the nearest practicable road of the office to which they may be transmitted by wire.

The foregoing charges only provide for ordinary delivery from offices where the service can be performed by a departmental messenger. For telegrams to be delivered by special messenger, the cost of such delivery shall be added and paid for. If required to be delivered beyond the distance of three miles, all moneys disbursed in payment of cab-fare, omnibus-fare, horse-hire, portage, or any other expenses incurred in delivery, shall be charged and paid. All telegrams shall bear any expenses incurred to defray ferriage and tolls. To prevent the non-delivery or detention of telegrams, when the sender of a telegram objects or refuses to pay the above charges, or any of them, the telegram will be posted immediately on its arrival at the office to which it is transmitted by wire.

Sender responsible for Delivery Charges.

21. The sender of a telegram shall be responsible for the payment of all charges incurred in the delivery, and, if the sender fails to pay the charges upon being requested to do so, the Officer in Charge of the Telegraph Office at which the telegram was delivered for despatch may, in his own name, in any Court of competent jurisdiction, sue for and recover from the sender thereof the charges due on such telegram.

Redirected Telegrams.

22. Telegrams redirected to a corrected address are liable to an additional charge of 6d. if delivery can be effected from the original receiving office, but if the corrected address requires the message to be re-telegraphed from the receiving office, a charge will be made equal to the original amount paid.

22A. The sender may direct that a telegram be readdressed, paying an extra fee for the new address. Telegrams readdressed for transmission by post are charged a single rate of postage only.

Fee for Search.

23. On the application, within six months of the date of its presentation, of the sender or the addressee of any telegram, search will be made by the department for the copies thereof in its possession. A fee of five shillings shall accompany each application for search, or for search with copies, so as to cover cost of the search and the copy or copies required. Any excess or insufficiency in this amount, determined by the length of time occupied in the search, will be adjusted before copies are handed to applicants. The rate of payment for search is two shillings and sixpence per hour or fraction thereof. For copies of inland telegrams a charge of sixpence each will be made, and for copies of cable

telegram sixpence for every hundred words or fraction thereof. No application is entertained unless at the request of the sender or of the person to whom any telegram is addressed.

24. In the case of allegation of error on the part of the department in the transmission of any telegram, no inquiry will be made unless the telegram was a repetition-paid telegram, or unless a fee equal to half the cost of the original message is paid.

Accidents to Lines.

25. In the event of serious delays occurring through accident to the lines, which may prevent the transmission of a telegram within a reasonable time, or may destroy the value of any telegram, the acceptance of telegrams may be refused for the time being; and, in the case of a telegram already accepted, the sender may, on an application to the Officer in Charge of the Station at which such telegram was presented and paid for, receive back the amount paid thereon, and the telegram will be cancelled.

In the event of partial interruption of the lines by accident or stress of weather, the department may refuse to accept all telegrams except urgent telegrams.

Monopoly of Line forbidden.

26. The transmission of telegrams presented in quantity, or of telegrams of great length, may be delayed when their transmission would give an undue monopoly of the line to the sender or addressee.

Prohibitions.

27. Telegrams which are indecently or obscenely worded, or which appear to contain matter of a treasonable, seditious, libellous, or grossly offensive character, will not be transmitted.

Urgent Telegrams.

28. Telegrams marked *Urgent* are received at any Telegraph Office and transmitted in the order of their priority with other messages of the like code.

Urgent telegrams take precedence of all ordinary messages.

The fee for an urgent telegram is double of that for an ordinary telegram.

Urgent telegrams lodged on Sunday at offices open from 5 p.m. to 6.30 p.m. only are charged four rates.

When the sender of an urgent telegram desires to pay for an urgent reply, the words "*Urgent, reply paid urgent*" must be inserted in the instructions. When the reply required is not to be urgent the instruction should be "*Urgent, reply paid*."

Charges for Messages relating to Sickness or Death.

29. Telegraphic messages relating to sickness or death or other urgent matters may be accepted and transmitted from any to any telegraph office at any time outside the ordinary hours of business on week-days or Sundays (provided the attention of the terminal office can be obtained), on payment of the following rates and fees:—

For the first twelve words or less, including address and signature, 1s. and 2d. for each additional word after twelve. Such telegrams must be inscribed with the words "*Extra fee*" in the instructions.

For calling upon a postmaster or operator in charge to transmit a message after his ordinary hours of duty, and when the office is closed, 2s. 6d., to be paid even if the telegram fails to reach its destination, but in the latter case the tariff rates collected will be refunded.

In addition to the foregoing charges a further fee of 2s. must be paid for delivery within a mile from the office.

30. Charges for ferries, tolls, or for any extra cost incurred for delivery beyond the ordinary limits must also be paid by the sender at time of presenting the telegram. The sender shall also be liable for short charges, should it be subsequently found that the amount allotted for carriage was insufficient.

Weather Telegrams for Shipping.

31. Masters of vessels are permitted to forward messages at one uniform rate of sixpence for each message (including reply) to the Harbourmasters of the several ports asking information as to the state of the weather, &c., at the port to which they are

bound, or from any post which may lie in their route. These telegrams must be concise, and should be filed in in accordance with the directions to be seen at telegraph-offices. In no case will a larger number of words in the body of the telegram than twelve be allowed.

Transmission of Telegrams by Telephone.

22. (1.) Subscribers to telephone exchanges may, by prearrangement in writing with the telegraph-office, have telegraphic messages which are addressed to them forwarded by telephone from the office of destination to their business or private address. Such messages will, after transmission, be posted for delivery to such address, and be marked on the front "Transmitted by telephone."

(2.) If desired, short Press messages up to fifty words may be telephoned to newspapers, the proprietors of which are subscribers to a telephone exchange, and who agree to pay the fee for so doing. After being telephoned such messages will be delivered by messenger, when their values (if collect), together with the fee for telephoning, will be collected.

(3.) This system may be availed of during the ordinary hours for attendance of officers at the telegraph-office, except in the case of offices where officers are on duty until 10 p.m. when the telegrams may be telephoned up to that hour.

(4.) The charges for transmitting telegrams as above shall be as follows:—

A fee of £5 5s. per annum, paid in advance; or, in other cases, for each separate transmission, provided the telephone conversation does not exceed three minutes

For each additional three minutes or fraction thereof
When the fee is paid by time, one conversation may include two or more messages, including any referred to in the next succeeding section. The fee is to be affixed in stamps to a docket which will be provided, and presented to the telegraph-office immediately after the message has been telephoned.

(5.) Telephone exchange subscribers who have signed the usual form of application may also telephone to any telegraph-office connected with a telephone exchange, during the ordinary hours of telegraph attendance, if the exchange is open, any messages, not exceeding fifty words in length, to be further transmitted from the telegraph-office to the respective destinations of such messages as telegrams, provided the usual cost of such telegrams is paid in addition to the above rates.

(6.) Prior to telephoning any such message the sender shall have reduced such message to writing, and, immediately after transmission, if telephoned before 5 p.m., deliver the written message to the telegraph-office, with the charges affixed in stamps. Messages telephoned after 5 p.m. and before 8 p.m. must be handed in to the telegraph office not later than 10 o'clock the following morning.

(7.) The department reserves the right to exclude any person from the privilege of sending or receiving telegrams by telephone under this system until any arrears of fee which may be due are fully paid, and to demand a deposit before registering any application.

(8.) The transcribed copies of messages telephoned by subscribers will, so far as the department is concerned, become the original telegrams, and the department will not assume or be subject to any liability by reason or on account of any failure, delay, or mistake in or about the transmission, receipt, or delivery of any telegram under this system, from whatever cause the same may arise.

(9.) On payment of a fee of 6d. and the charge for the transmitting—at the prescribed rates for urgent or ordinary telegrams, as the case may be—of such words as may be required to convey the direction hereafter mentioned, the sender of a telegram may insert in the place for instructions thereon the direction "To be telephoned," and thereupon such telegram, upon arrival at the telegraph-office of destination, shall be forthwith telephoned through the Telephone Exchange to the addressee, if such addressee be a subscriber to such Exchange; and in other respects the provisions made for the transmission of telegrams to addressees through Telephone Exchanges at their own request shall, as far as applicable, apply to such telegram.

STATUTORY HOLIDAYS.

New Year's Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and the Birthday of the King and the 24th of May, or any day substituted therefor:—

Ordinary and urgent telegrams at the same rates as for week-days.

Press Association Rate.

Messages lodged and forwarded on behalf of the United Press Association are liable to the following charges:—

At the rate of 6d. per 100 words or fraction thereof, together with a fee of 7s. 6d. for reopening the office, and all charges in respect of overtime at offices other than the original forwarding office.

The additional payment to be made in all cases by the applicant.

At least six hours' notice should be given the General Post Office, Wellington, of the desire to have an office specially reopened for Press news.

CHARGES FOR PRESS TELEGRAMS RELATING TO EXTRAORDINARY EVENTS, ETC.

Press telegrams containing intelligence of extraordinary events, such as collisions, wrecks, large fires, explosions, &c., may be accepted for transmission between offices open for the midnight cable service, after those offices are closed for the receipt of other Press messages, on the following conditions:—

No message must exceed 100 words.

The rate of 1s. to be charged for each message.

The Officer in Charge may refuse to accept any such message which in his opinion does not contain news of an urgent nature.

These messages will not be permitted to interfere with or delay the transmission of the midnight cable news.

Telegrams forwarded by Members of General Assembly.

Members of the General Assembly may send telegrams at the following rates, viz.:

GENERAL RULES FOR COUNTING TELEGRAMS BETWEEN PLACES WITHIN THE COLONY.

1. Telegrams are charged for according to tariff rates as shown in the Guide; and all that the sender wishes to transmit to his correspondent is charged for except service instructions, such as the following, viz.: "Urgent," "Reply paid," "Collect," "Carriage paid," &c.

2. Telegrams may be written either in plain or code language. A plain message must be written wholly in English, and may not contain illegitimate combinations of words or abbreviations contrary to the usage of the language—*Webster's Dictionary* being taken as the standard.

3. Combinations of two or more words are charged for as separate words, but compound words found in *Webster's Dictionary*, joined by a hyphen, or separated by an apostrophe, and which are so written by the sender, are counted and charged for as single words. Combinations which usually count as two words, such as "Courtward," but which, in order not to destroy the sense of the message, must in particular instances be shown as one word, will in future be indicated as double words in the instructions, thus: /DI. Every care must be taken to prevent such words becoming disjoined in the course of transmission.

4. Groups of letters or figures count five characters to the word, plus one word for any excess up to five characters. The Department does not guarantee the correct transmission of figures, and may at any time require numbers to be written in words at length, and paid for accordingly.

5. Code messages must be composed of words not exceeding ten letters each taken from one or several of the following languages: English, French, German, Italian, Dutch, Portuguese, Spanish, Latin, or Maori.

6. All names composed of more than one word (with the exception of those mentioned in Rule 7, and any entitled to pass as one word under Rule 3) are to be counted according to the number of separate words contained in the name, however the same may be expressed.

7. Names like MacDonald, McDougal, O'Neil, De Morgan, De la Rue, should be counted as one word each, but double surnames, such as Hunter-Brown, must be counted as two words, whether written with a hyphen or without. The prefix "St." always counts as part of a word, but when written in full it should be counted as a separate word.

Official designations are to be counted according to the number of separate words of which they are composed: thus, "Under-Secretary, Public Works," to be counted as three words, "Under-Secretary" being an admissible compound word according to the standard dictionary.

8. The name of any post- or telegraph-office in New Zealand will pass as a single word in either the address or text of any inland message.

9. Each separate letter or figure is charged for as one word, but unintelligible combinations of letters in the text of messages, words not forming part of any authorized language, and groups of figures count five characters to the word. Where a fraction is inserted in a group of figures, such fraction is regarded as terminating the word—as, 3145/10, three words.

10. Under the above rule, abbreviations such as "fob," "am," "pm," &c., are accepted as single words.

11. When a group of figures is followed by a letter, the letter is counted as a separate word: thus, 104, or 104a, each count as two words. Letters added to figures to form ordinal numbers are each counted as a figure: thus, "1st" counts as one word, "100th" as two words.

12. The two principal punctuation signs, viz., full stop and comma, when used as such, are not to be counted, but signalled free of charge. Other punctuation signs and underlines are counted and charged for as one word each; while parentheses, brackets, or inverted commas are counted and charged for as one word each pair.

13. Bars of division, or full stops representing decimal points, used in the formation of numbers, or in groups of mixed characters, are counted as figures. The oblique stroke / when used with letters counts as one word, except in the case of well-known trade signs, of which examples are given in paragraph 15.

14. All figures should be expressed in Arabic characters; if Roman numerals are required to be signalled, two extra words are charged for each group of five (or less) of such figures.

15. The following examples determine the interpretation of the rules to be allowed in counting words:—

LIST OF TELEGRAPH OFFICES.

The names of the telegraph offices in New Zealand are to be written in the address of telegrams as given in this list, and the name of each office as it is thus required to be given must be written as one word. For instance, Abbotstford in the address of a telegram will count as one word, and not as two words.

When a telegraph message is addressed to a place not a telegraph office, but having the same name as a telegraph office, as well as to the office to which the message is to be telegraphed—thus, "Richmond, Christchurch"—the names of both places must of course be telegraphed, and the transmitting office through which any message so addressed may pass must regard the first of the two names as that of a place and not a telegraph office.

Telegrams for persons on trains that will pass railway-stations which are public telegraph-offices should be addressed to those offices and not the departmental offices, as, for example, to Masteries Railway, not Masterton.

Unless otherwise stated, offices are closed on Sundays and public holidays.

Money-order telegrams can be sent between all offices except those marked *.

Ordinary telegrams lodged during hours that offices are open for receipt of press telegrams only must be paid for as "Extra fee" messages (see clause 2 page 107).

When telegraph lines are obstructed and only urgent telegrams for places within New Zealand are being despatched, telegrams for places beyond the colony are also accepted and despatched, but treated as urgent on New Zealand lines, and liable for the New Zealand charges on cable telegrams collected.

TELEPHONE EXCHANGES.

1. At any place where telephone exchanges have been established, Edison-Bell or any other approved telephones connected with the exchanges will be placed in offices or private residences within three miles of the central office, so that subscribers can converse with other subscribers at their offices or residences.

2. Every person desiring to hire any telephone instruments or set of telephones connected with a telephone exchange shall make application to the Superintendent of Electric Lines on the form supplied for that purpose by the department.

3. All applicants for a first connection with a telephone exchange, in addition to the rates in force for connection with an exchange, will be required to pay an entrance fee of £1 when delivering the application for connection.

4. Subscribers at each exchange will be furnished with a list of persons with whom they may communicate by telephone, and, as new subscribers are connected with the system from time to time, notification of the fact will be given by the department.

5. The Electric Telegraph Commissioners or Superintendent of Electric Lines may refuse to connect with the telephone exchange any place of business, house, or premises which in the opinion of the Commissioner is or are used for any illegal, immoral, or improper purpose, and may, either with or without previous notice, exclude from the telephone exchange any subscriber who allows the telephone instruments in his custody or control to be damaged or destroyed, or put to any improper use, and may remove or cause to be removed any instruments allotted to the use of such subscriber. No person shall have any claim for damages or otherwise whatever in consequence of the refusal of the said Commissioner or Superintendent to connect any place of business or house with the exchange for any of the causes aforesaid, or in consequence of the removal of any instruments, or the exclusion of any subscriber as aforesaid.

6. All charges payable in respect of the hire of any telephone instruments shall be paid half-yearly in advance, for distances up to two miles and under, and for distances over two miles, quarterly in advance, the first payment to commence from the date when the connection with the telephone exchange is completed.

7. If such payment be not made within one week after demand, the connection with the exchange may, at the discretion of the said Superintendent, be discontinued without prejudice to any proceedings for the recovery of any moneys then due or otherwise.

8. Telephones connected with exchanges are to be used on the business of the subscriber or that of his employees, family, or guests only.

9. No extra telephone, special instrument, or appliances other than those provided and maintained by the department will be allowed to be used by any subscriber in connection with an exchange wire.

CHARGES.

In addition to the entrance fee of £1, the charge per annum payable in respect of the hire for any telephone instrument connected with a Government telephone exchange is as follows:—

To every subscriber for a single wire, as from the date of connection:—

The above rates are for connections with a telephone exchange of warehouses, stores, shops, and business places not more than half a mile from the exchange, and of private residences not more than one mile from the exchange.

For every additional quarter of a mile or fraction thereof, for each year commencing from the date of connection, and for every following year, 10s.

Where any connection with an exchange is over one mile in length, the applicant will be required to hold the same for three years.

If a connection with a telephone exchange necessitates the erection of a new line of poles beyond one mile, then the additional charge after the first mile will be at the rate of £1 for every quarter of a mile or fraction thereof.

For connections over three miles in length the subscriber will be charged at ordinary rates on the first three miles. For the portion beyond that distance he will be required to pay the cost of erection of the line, and an annual maintenance charge of £1 for each quarter of a mile or fraction thereof if the line is on new poles, or 10s. for each quarter of a mile if the wire is on an existing line of poles.

BUREAU STATIONS.

A "bureau station" means any ordinary telegraph office, connected by telephone with an exchange, which is mentioned as a bureau in the list of telegraph offices, and includes any station so connected.

The following are the charges to be paid by the public for the use of Government telephones in the colony at a bureau station:—

Where the line used is not more than six miles long, a uniform charge of 6d. for the use of same for any period not exceeding three minutes, and a further charge of 6d. for every additional three minutes or portion of three minutes.

Where the line used is over six miles long, the charges are 1s. for the use of the same for any time not exceeding three minutes, and a further charge of 1s. for every additional five minutes or portion of three minutes.

The above regulation as to time (three minutes) shall only apply to bureau stations within the limits of a town where an exchange is situated.

For bureau stations outside the limits of a town, the charge will be for the first six minutes, and every additional six minutes or fraction of six minutes.

When subscribers are connected through an exchange to a bureau station, or from a bureau station to a subscriber, half the above rates will be charged if the applicant is a subscriber to the particular exchange through which it is desired to communicate.

When a message to the effect that any person is required at a telephone is sent to a house for delivery beyond the premises in which such bureau is situated, 3d. will be charged for delivery. These charges must be paid by the sender. Messages for addresses outside the ordinary delivery limits are subject to special charges for delivery, according to the extra expense thereby incurred.

Any one person may only use the wire for six minutes at a time—that is to say, that if another person requires the wire, at the end of six minutes it must be given up. Should the wire not be asked for, then the person using it may continue to do so at tariff rate. On Sundays ordinary rates only are charged.

The following are the charges for the use of Government telephones for the purpose of conveying over long-distance wires on Sundays or at other times approved by the Commissioner, usually between midnight and 8 a.m.

(4.) When the conversation takes place through Exchanges which are open continuously, or through other Exchanges or bureaux during the ordinary hours of attendance of switchboard- or bureau-attendants: For a period not exceeding six minutes, 2s. 6d.; and a further charge of 2s. 6d. for every additional period of six minutes or portion of six minutes.

(5.) When special attendance of switchboard- or bureau-attendants out of ordinary hours of attendance is required, then for each switchboard- or bureau-attendant called upon to make the necessary wire-connections: For every hour or less, 2s. 6d., in addition to the charges set forth in sub-section (4).

No free conversations on public service are permitted.

PRIVATE WIRES.

CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH LINES WILL BE CONSTRUCTED, SUPPLIED WITH INSTRUMENTS, AND MAINTAINED.

Cost of Construction.

Application should be made direct to the Superintendent of Electric Lines, Wellington, for any information regarding cost of construction and conditions under which private lines will be constructed or supplied with instruments.

Maintenance and Wapleane.

The charge for maintenance of such private line will be as under, payable yearly in advance, viz.:-

For the first mile or fraction thereof, £2 per annum, and 10s. for every additional quarter of a mile or fraction thereof.

If the wire cannot be erected on any existing poles, and therefore entails the erection of new poles, then for such new line the maintenance will be at the rate of £4 per annum for the first mile or fraction thereof, and £1 for every additional quarter of a mile or fraction thereof.

Use of Line.

The applicants must only use the line for their own *bona fide* business, and on no account, directly or indirectly, allow the wire to be used for any purpose which might be construed into an attempt to defraud the department of its revenue.

CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH TELEGRAMS ARE TRANSMITTED TO PLACES BEYOND THE COLONY.

Telegrams for places beyond Australia are described as *international*, and those for Australia and Tasmania as *intercolonial*.

MODE OF WRITING AND ACCEPTANCE OF TELEGRAMS.

1. No responsibility is accepted for any delay or errors in the transmission of telegrams, nor for the non-transmission or non-delivery of telegrams from whatever cause arising. Every care, however, will be taken to insure both accuracy in transit and speed in delivery.

2. In order to guard against mistakes, attention is called to the great importance of legible writing. Every intercolonial, reference, resource, or alteration must be authenticated by the sender or his representative.

3. Telegrams may be composed of plain language or of secret language, i.e., of code words, or of figures or groups of figures. Letter ciphers, i.e., letters or groups of letters having a secret meaning, are only admitted in Government telegrams.

4. Telegrams in plain language must present a clear meaning in any one or several of the languages admitted for telegraphic correspondence—viz., English, French, German, Italian, Dutch, Portuguese, Spanish, and Latin.

5. Telegrams in code must consist of words, each of them presenting a clear meaning, but not forming intelligible phrases.

6. These words are taken from vocabularies admitted for this description of correspondence.

7. Telegrams in code may contain words of ten letters at most, taken from any or all of the admitted languages. No other languages may be used. Code words containing more than ten letters will be dealt with as groups of letters, and will be charged at cipher rates (vide Rule 35); but words composed of more than ten letters, used in their natural sense in code messages, will be charged for at the rate of ten letters to the word (vide Rule 33).

8. Proper names of persons, places, &c., in the text of code telegrams will only be accepted when used in their natural sense.

9. Between Australia and New Zealand the Japanese language expressed in English characters, guaranteed to be without secret meaning, is accepted as plain language (see Rule 32). The office at which any telegram whatever is tendered for transmission may allow the production of the code or codes for the purpose of verifying the authenticity of the absence of secret meaning in the words employed.

10. Telegrams in cipher may be composed of figures or groups of figures.

11. The text of secret telegrams may be wholly secret or partially so.

12. Telegrams consisting merely of the address, i.e., without text, are accepted.

13. The following abbreviations are counted as one word:—

(U)	Urgent telegram.	(XP)	Express paid.

14. Any instructions the sender may have to give as to the delivery at destination, payment of reply, acknowledgment of receipt, repetition (collationnement), &c., should be written immediately before the address of the telegram and are charged for. These notes may be written in the above abbreviated form adopted for official instructions, in which case they are placed between parentheses and counted as one word only, the parentheses not being transmitted.

15. The address of a telegram must consist of at least two words, the first representing the name and address of the addressee, and the second the place of destination. These words must be inserted and charged for as part of the telegram. The consequences of an incomplete or incorrect address must be borne by the sender.

16. The Government will, at any of its offices, register for a fee of 10s. per annum for each address, the names and addresses of persons receiving telegrams, or proper names, or unless ciphers, so that this information may be given in two words, but not less than two words, thus: "ARIEL, WELLINGTON." This registration can only be effected locally. If a firm in Wellington should desire to register a code address in any other place, they must instruct their correspondents in the town where the registration is to be effected to make the necessary application at the telegraph office. When the telegram is addressed to the use of a person who has registered a code address, his name, or the words representing the code address, must be preceded by one of the instructions "at," "care of," or any other equivalent.

17. In all cases where it is desired to register a code address, a proper name or a dictionary word must be chosen.

Such combinations as "Cornmart" for "Cornelius Mart," "Granotel" for "Grand Hotel," &c., being neither proper names nor dictionary words, cannot be accepted for registration, nor can such irregular combinations be admitted in the text of telegrams.

18. These registrations apply, however, only to telegrams received at the station where the registration is effected, and not to telegrams forwarded from such station. Registration need not in every case be effected at the receiving station.

19. The sender or his representative must sign the telegram at the foot of the telegram box, adding, if required, his address, but the name of the sender is only charged for if transmitted.

20. The sender of a private telegram is bound to prove his identity when requested to do so. The sender may have his signature legalized, and include such legalisation in his telegram. The number of words required for this purpose must be paid for.

RECTIFYING TELEGRAMS.

21. The addressee of a telegram may have the whole or part of it repeated, on payment of the cost of the telegram demanding the repetition, and of the reply to the same. Should a reply to the request for repetition not be received within a reasonable time a second request will be sent without charge.

22. The sender can also have the whole or any portion of his telegram repeated, on payment of the cost of the telegram he forwards, and of the reply, if one be required.

23. The demand for the repetition must be made within seventy-two hours (Sundays excluded) after receipt or despatch of the telegram, and should be written in the following manner:—

"Wellington from London. [These words are not charged for].

S.R. " (R.F.) [i.e., reply paid].

"Twenty-sixth [date of original telegram]. Brown [addressee of original telegram]. Repeat first, fourth, sixth [meaning text words in the original telegram]." Or

"Twenty-sixth. Brown. Repeat word [or words] after Words to be repeated or corrected in a telegram are referred to according to their position in the text of such telegram without regard to the rules for charging.

The reply will be as follows: S.R. "London from Wellington [These words are not charged for]. "Brown [words repeated]."

24. The number of words in the reply will thus exceed by one the number of words to be repeated.

25. The charges will be immediately refunded at the office where they were paid if the repetition proves that the original telegram has been mutilated in transmission.

26. In case some of the words repeated are shown to have been correctly transmitted, the cost of the words employed to designate the words correctly rendered, both in the telegram of inquiry and reply, will be retained.

27. No refund will be made when the mutilation has been caused by illegible handwriting on the part of the sender, or when the repetition is obtained direct, instead of by means of an official service telegram.

28. No reimbursement of the charge for the original telegram will be allowed.

29. The sender may also rectify any error or omission in a telegram forwarded by him. This rectification should take the following form:—

EXAMPLE OF A RECTIFYING TELEGRAM SENT BY THE SENDER.

"S.T. Paris via Darwin. 7/4 [number of words]. Thirteenth Krishnam. [Date and name of receiver of telegram to be rectified]. "Replace third [word of text] 20 by 200."

The charges paid for this class of telegrams are not refunded.

COUNTING AND CHARGING.

30. Telegrams are charged according to a tariff per word, including the names and addresses of the sender and addressee; but, unlike inland telegrams, the charges must be paid for in cash.

31. The name of the station of origin, the date, hour, and minute of the deposit of the telegram, will be officially inserted in the telegram, and supplied to the addressee free of charge.

32. In plain language the maximum length of a word is fixed at 15 letters in both international and intercolonial telegrams, any additional letters being counted and charged for as extra words, at the rate of 15 letters to the word. Diphthongs count as one letter only.

33. In code language the maximum length of a word is fixed at 10 characters according to the Morse alphabet. Words in plain language when inserted in code telegrams are charged for at the rate of 10 letters to a word. This applies to both intercolonial and international telegrams. (See Rule 7.)

34. In the address, however, the name of the receiving office and the name of the country in which the telegram has to be delivered are each counted as one word only, irrespective of the number of letters required to express them, subject to these proper names being written as they appear in the official nomenclature of the International Telegraph Office.

35. Code words containing more than 10 letters, and words not belonging to any of the languages admitted for international correspondence, are charged for in both international and intercolonial telegrams at the rate of 5 letters to the word. (See Rule 7.)

36. All separate characters, whether letters or figures, underlines, parentheses, or inserted commas, are counted as a word.

37. Initials are charged as so many separate words.

38. Words joined by a hyphen or separated by an apostrophe are counted as so many separate words.

39. Nevertheless English and French compound words to be found in a standard dictionary, joined by a hyphen or separated by an apostrophe, are counted as one word if so written, subject to the limitation of letters in preceding paragraphs; also, compound words used by the production of the code-book to be embodied in a code are counted as one word each, subject to the same limitation.

40. Illegitimate combinations contrary to the usage of the language, and abbreviated and wrongly-spelt words, are inadmissible.

41. If a short charge has been made on a telegram owing to the sender having employed words or combinations contrary to the usage of the language the amount short-charged will be collected from the addressee. When this power is exercised the telegram is not delivered to the addressee until the supplementary charge is paid. The sender is informed by service telegram in case the payment is refused. In every case where charges on telegrams have to be collected on arrival, the telegrams are only to be given over to the addressee upon payment of the amount due.

42. Proper names of towns, countries, places, squares, streets, ships, and numbers written at length, whole or fractional numbers written entirely in letters and compound words, also patronymics belonging to one person, are counted according to the number of words employed by the sender to express them, the respective limitation as to the number of letters referred to in Rule 32 being always applied. The names of racehorses, designations of gold-mines or financial companies, or the titles of newspapers, &c., are counted according to the actual number of words they contain.

43. In both international and intercolonial telegrams each group of five figures or less is charged for as one word; larger groups also are charged at the rate of five figures to a word. The same rule applies to the counting of letters where admitted. (See Rule 3.)

44. In international telegrams signs of punctuation, apostrophes, hyphens, and fresh paragraphs are not transmitted unless paid for. Decimal points, commas, bars of division, and signs used in the formation of numbers are each counted as a figure.

45. Letters added to figures to form ordinal numbers are each counted as a figure.

46. The words "fob" (meaning "free on board"), "cif" ("cost insurance freight"), and "cf" ("cost freight insurance") are accepted as one word if written together. If written separately as "F.O.B.," "C.I.F.," and "C.F.I.," they are counted as three words each. Abbreviations "B/L" ("Bill of Lading"), "c/o" ("care of"), and "X" ("per cent.") are each accepted as one word.

47. In counting the number of words in messages—

- (1) When no double words and no double groups of figures are included, the number of words should be indicated by **one** number only—that is, the total number of words and groups combined.
- (2) In plain telegrams containing words of over fifteen letters or groups of more than five figures, and in code messages containing plain words of over ten letters or groups of more than five figures, indicate by a fraction, the numerator of which will denote the total **taxable** number of words, and the denominator the **actual** number of words and groups combined.
- (3) In Government cipher telegrams indicate by bars of division—first, the total number of taxable words; second, the plain and code words; and, third, the number of groups of letters or figures.

48. The following are examples for counting and charging telegrams:—

PAYMENT OF CHARGES.

49. All charges must be prepaid, except those for supplementary services or special messages beyond the telegraph office of destination, which are claimed from the addressee.

50. A receipt can be obtained for any message handed in at any telegraph station.

51. Short charges and charges due by the addressee which are not recovered from him are to be paid by the sender.

52. Charges erroneously collected in excess are refunded.

STOPPAGE OF TELEGRAMS.

53. The Telegraph Administration reserves to themselves the power to stop the transmission of any private telegram which may appear dangerous to the security of the State, or which may be contrary to the laws of the country or to public order or decency.

54. Any sender can, by proving his identity, stop, if in time, the transmission of a telegram deposited by him. When a sender withdraws or stops his telegram before transmission has been commenced, the charges are returned to him, less a fixed sum of 5d., the fee of the sending office. If the telegram is already transmitted by the office of despatch, the sender's only means of requesting it to be cancelled is by means of a paid service.

DELIVERY AT DESTINATION.

55. Telegrams are delivered according to their address at the place of residence of the addressee, or *poste restante* at the Post Office, or *telegraph restante* at the Telegraph Office, and in the two latter cases they are only delivered to the addressee or to a person duly appointed by him.

56. A telegram taken to the place of residence may be delivered either to the addressee, the adult members of his family, to his employees, lodgers, or landlord, or to the porter of the house, unless the addressee has given special instructions to the contrary.

57. If the door is not opened at the address given, or if the messenger finds no one who will consent to take in the telegram, notice is left at the address given, and the telegram is brought back to the Telegraph Office, to be delivered to the addressee upon application.

58. When a telegram cannot be delivered, the delivery office advises the sending office of the cause of non-delivery, which advice, if practicable, is communicated to the sender. The latter can only complete, rectify, or confirm the address by a paid telegram.

59. Cable telegrams to Australia must now contain fuller addresses than a surname only, however well known the addressee may be. Telegrams for delivery in those colonies addressed to surnames only should not be accepted except in cases where such names are stated to be registered as cable-code addresses.

60. Telegrams addressed to places beyond New Zealand which are handed in for transmission with the instruction "Post, Auckland," "Post, Bluff," &c., must not be accepted without a full postal address, the abbreviated or code address being only allowable in messages telegraphed to actual destination.

URGENT TELEGRAMS.*

61. Telegrams marked "urgent" may be forwarded to any of the Australian colonies, for which three rates are charged throughout. Telegrams may be accepted "Urgent N.Z. lines" only, in which case three inland rates, as per heading of "Table of Rates," should be charged.

PREPAID REPLIES.

62. The sender may prepay a reply to his telegram, which must not however exceed thirty words, unless it be to obtain the repetition of a telegram previously transmitted, under Rules 21 and 22. (See Rule 64.)

63. The words "reply prepaid," or "(RP)," are to be added to the telegram and paid for, and the sender must state the number of words he has prepaid; for instance, "reply prepaid twenty," or "(RP 20)," the first instructions counting as 3 and the latter as 1 word. If the sender does not specify the number of words for which he prepays a reply, charge is made for an ordinary telegram of 10 words. When an urgent reply is required the indication "Reply paid urgent," or "RPD," must be inserted and paid for.

64. The amount prepaid by the sender is held for a period of six weeks at the disposal of the addressee.

65. Should such reply or other telegram contain more words than have been stated as prepaid, the excess must be paid for by the sender of the reply.

66. If the addressee does not make use of the amount prepaid, he may, within the above-mentioned period of six weeks, return the voucher delivered with the original telegram, and request that the money be refunded to the sender. If the reply be sent and contains a less number of words than have been prepaid, the difference will be returned to the sender if applied for.

67. The amount prepaid for a reply to a redirected telegram must be telegraphed forward to the final place of destination; the addressee will thus be able to reply to

* Urgent messages can be accepted for transmission through Great Britain or India, but during their transmission over the wires of those States they will take rank with ordinary telegrams.

accordance with the sender's intention. The cost of the redirection must be collected from the addressee on delivery of the redirected telegram.

REPEATED OR COLLATED TELEGRAMS.

68. The sender may have his telegram repeated from station to station on payment of an additional charge equal to a quarter of the ordinary rate. The words "repetition paid," or the abbreviated signal "(TC)," must be written before the address and charged for.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RECEIPT.

69. The sender may request that the time at which his telegram is delivered to the addressee be notified to him either by telegraph or letter.

70. The words "acknowledgment paid," or the abbreviated signal "(PC)" for telegraph and "(PCP)" for post, must be inserted in his telegram and charged for. The cost of an acknowledgment of receipt by telegraph is equal to that of a telegram of 10 words, or by post on payment of 5d.

TELEGRAMS TO FOLLOW.

71. Telegrams for countries in Europe can be directed to several addresses "to follow," for instance, "John Brown, Hotel de Rome, Berlin, ou Rumer, Frankfurt a/M., faire suite." The sender pays the charges to the first destination, and the cost of further transmission is collected on delivering the telegram. The words "faire suite," or the official code "(FS)," must be inserted before the address, for which the rate of two words is charged in the former and of one word in the latter case.

MULTIPLE TELEGRAMS.

72. Telegrams may be addressed—

a. To several persons in the same place;

b. To one person at several residences in the same place; if the words "X addresses" or "TMX"—the former counting as two and the latter as one word—be written before the address.

73. Telegrams addressed to several addressees, or to the same addressee, in different towns, are charged as so many separate telegrams.

74. Telegrams addressed to several persons in the same place, or to one person at several residences in the same place, with or without further despatch by post, are charged as single telegrams, plus a copying-fee of 5d. for every 100 words or fraction of 100 words entered in the telegram for every additional address after the first.

75. In calculating the charge for the telegram all the names and addresses are included in the number of chargeable words. If all the addressees are required to be shown on each copy, the instructions "communicate all addresses" must be written before the address and charged for, otherwise each delivered copy will bear its own address only.

Multiple telegrams are not accepted for places in North or South America.

TELEGRAMS TO PLACES BEYOND THE INTERNATIONAL SYSTEM.

76. Telegrams for places not connected by telegraph must have instructions added to the address as to the means by which they are to be forwarded to destination; for instance, "Express" (or post), Müller, Steglitz, Berlin.

77. The name of the telegraph office by which the telegram is to be sent on by post, express, or other means, is stated last.

78. Telegrams to be sent by post to a country other than that of the terminal telegraph station are subject to a fee of 5d. The charges for transmission by express are, as a rule, collected from the receiver.

CERTIFIED COPIES OF FOREIGN TELEGRAMS.

79. The sender or addressee of a telegram may, on furnishing full particulars thereof, obtain a certified copy of the telegram as handed in, or as delivered at destination, on payment of 5d. for every 100 words or fraction of 100 words. (In addition to this charge, a search-fee of 2s. 6d. must be paid when a search is necessary.)

80. As all telegrams are destroyed periodically, certified copies of telegrams more than twelve months old cannot be supplied.

REFUNDS.

81. Refunds are granted—

a. Of the cost of every telegram which has, through the fault of the telegraph service, failed to reach its destination, or suffered a notable delay, that is to

any, which does not arrive sooner than by post, or which occupies more than 144 hours in transit;

- b. Of the full cost of every repeated or collated telegram which has manifestly failed to fulfil its object through errors made in its transmission by telegraph;
- c. In international telegrams the cost of every word omitted in the transmission of an ordinary telegram through the fault of the telegraph service (this rule, however, is not applicable when the addressee has discovered the omission and had it rectified under Rules 21 and 22).

81. A claim for refund of charges may be made to the office of origin or of destination by the sender or addressee of a telegram at any time within six months. The claim must be accompanied in the case of non-delivery by a written declaration of the office of destination or of the addressee that the telegram has not been delivered, and in the case of delay or of mutilation by the copy actually delivered to the addressee. Although a claim for refund may be accepted from the addressee of a telegram, the reimbursement of the charge is only made to the sender.

82. No refund, except as stated under Rule 80, c, can be made on account of errors or omissions in ordinary or non-collated telegrams, nor can any refund be granted on account of telegrams necessitated or rendered useless by the loss, delay, or omission referred to under Rule 80, a, b, c, nor for any rectifying telegrams exchanged direct between sender and addressee.

REGISTRATION OF ABBREVIATED ADDRESSES.

UNITED KINGDOM.

1. A register is open at the Central Telegraph Station, London, for the registration of the full address, at which telegrams reaching London from the provinces, or from abroad, and marked with an abbreviated or arbitrary address, are to be delivered.

2. The charge for registration is one guinea per annum, payable in advance, and becomes due on the 1st of August in each year.

3. For an address registered in London, the fee of one guinea should be remitted by means of a cheque on a London Bank, crossed "Bank of England," in favour of the Postmaster-General or order, or by Post Office order payable at the Chief Office, London.

4. The Postmaster-General does not undertake the delivery of any telegrams at address which are not either full and complete, or which have not been registered at the General Post Office, or which cannot be traced in the Post Office London Directory, whether the record of the actual address has already been notified to the Post Office or not.

5. In the provinces, and in Scotland and Ireland, the addressees of telegrams may have their addresses registered at the Chief Office of the Town in which they reside, upon payment at that office of the registration fee.

Persons in New Zealand desirous of availing themselves of this arrangement should request their correspondents in the United Kingdom to register any abbreviated address that may be agreed upon, at the Chief Office of the Town in which they reside.

The Telegraph Companies register names and addresses of telegraph correspondents free of charge at all their stations, and in London at 11, Old Broad Street, 8, Leadenhall Street, and 3, Great Tower Street.

NEW ZEALAND.

A register is kept at every Telegraph Office in New Zealand for the registration of code or abbreviated addresses of two or more words in cablegrams from places beyond the colony only. The charge for registration is 10s. per annum or 2s. 6d. per month for each address.

TABLES OF RATES, INCLUDING ALL TELEGRAPH CHARGES FOR TELEGRAMS DESPATCHED TO PLACES BEYOND THE COLONY.

THE New Zealand inland charge, included in these rates (excepting "Press" messages), is 1d. per word. On Sundays double inland charges are collected, except on cablegrams emanating from offices open between 9.30 and 10 a.m. Words contained in signature and address are to be counted as part of each telegram. The greatest length of a word is limited to fifteen letters in both intercolonial and international telegrams; any excess in either case counting as an additional word.

PRESS TELEGRAMS TO AND FROM PLACES ABROAD.

Definition.

By "Press telegrams" are meant telegrams addressed to newspapers duly published in accordance with the respective laws relating to the publication of newspapers in force in the United Kingdom, or the colonies, and intended in good faith for publication in full in such newspapers, and shall include only such as are intelligible and written in English, in plain language, and without the use of cipher, code, groups of figures, or letters or words of unusual meaning. Groups of figures, when used in their natural sense, may be included.

Rates.

The following table shows all the rates now chargeable on Press telegrams exchanged by New Zealand with Australia and Tasmania under the above conditions, and with the United Kingdom and India under the special conditions for Press telegrams in those countries:—

Conditions.

1. The wires by the Eastern Company's route of telegraph from London, via Gibraltar and Malta, to India, and thence by the Eastern Extension Telegraph Company's route to Australia and New Zealand, are available to the Press for the transmission, at the reduced rate, of news or intelligence for publication in newspapers allowed by the Imperial and Colonial Governments respectively, to receive intelligence by telegraph at the reduced rate. United States Press messages at the above rates are sent by N. Atlantic routes and Eastern Company's cables.

2. Such telegrams shall not interfere with the transmission of the ordinary telegram traffic, and in order to insure this the transmission of such news telegrams may be deferred or suspended, or interrupted, until any Government telegram or any ordinary or press telegrams at full rates that may be on hand shall have been transmitted and completed. But when Press Telegrams have been delayed over twenty-four hours they shall thereafter be forwarded in turn with ordinary telegrams.

3. The working of the wire or wires shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the International Telegraph Convention.

4. No telegrams at the reduced rate shall be sent except for publication in such newspapers, and they must be written in plain English, so as to be intelligible to the transmitting office. Telegrams containing news or information not for publication, or containing code words or words of concealed meaning, or groups of figures or ciphers, shall be paid for at the full tariff rates in force for ordinary telegrams.

5. The newspapers, their Correspondents or Agents, are required to address their telegrams to a newspaper office, which shall be prohibited from selling, distributing, or communicating such telegrams to clubs, exchanges, or newsmen, or disposing of them for any purpose whatsoever, directly or indirectly, other than for publication in newspapers allowed by the Imperial and Colonial Governments to receive them.

6. Telegrams can only be accepted from the authorized correspondent of a newspaper, and the news sent in such telegrams must be duly published in the newspapers, or satisfactory reasons be given for non-publication, in the absence of which full rates will be chargeable.

7. The Administrations reserve to themselves the right to terminate the present arrangements, but will in such case announce their intentions twelve months beforehand.

POLICY-HOLDERS MAY AUTHORIZE DEDUCTION OF THEIR PREMIUM WHEN DUE FROM THEIR POST-OFFICE SAVINGS-BANK ACCOUNTS, if they desire such convenience.

POLICY-HOLDERS CAN BORROW ON THE SECURITY OF THEIR POLICIES to the extent of 90 per cent. of the cash surrender value.

POLICY-HOLDERS MAY TRAVEL or reside in any part of the world without loss or extra charge.

POLICY-HOLDERS may engage in any occupation without license or extra charge.

A mistake in age will not make the policy void; and, although death should take place before the age is admitted, the claim will be paid on production of satisfactory evidence such as that before mentioned.

For **TOTAL ABSTAINERS** there is a **SPECIAL SECTION**, in which **PROFITS** are **ALLOCATED SEPARATELY**.

LOANS ON MORTGAGE.—The Office is now lending money on approved Freehold security not exceeding three-fifths of the value offered at exceptionally low rates of interest. The maximum amount which can be advanced to any one person is fixed by statute at £5,000. Liberal terms of repayment. The Office undertakes the following Business:—

1. The Administration of all Intestate Estates of which Letters of Administration have not been granted to the widow or other person entitled, the realisation and distribution of the personality, the payment of the debts, and the care of the realty for the absent heir.
2. The Execution of the Wills of persons who may appoint the Public Trustee their executor, and thus avoid the necessity of committing their friends to the responsibilities involved by such a position.
- Also the Administration of Trusts recognised by previously-appointed Trustees.
3. The Administration of all kinds of Money Trusts, including Marriage Settlements and every kind of fund the trusts of which are definitely set forth in the deed creating the Trust.
4. The Administration of the Estates of Lunatics.
5. The management of property as Attorney or Agent for the owner.
6. The Protection and Administration of all Lands lying waste, of which the owner is unknown, or has been absent from the colony for ten years without having left any known agent.
7. The Deposit of Wills for safe custody when the Public Trustee is executor.

The colony guarantees the integrity of the capital funds of properties placed in the Public Trust Office where there is no direction for the investment of such funds, or where there is no other direction for their investment than generally, at the option of the Public Trustee, in the securities in which, unless expressly prohibited, he may invest all capital funds.

The colony also guarantees on such capital funds for investment a common rate of interest, to be credited quarterly, free of all office charges, to the properties from which the funds arise.

The value of this guarantee will be obvious when it is considered that it is—

- (1.) The guarantee of the colony against loss from investments in bad or insufficient securities;
- (2.) The guarantee of the colony against loss from delay in the investment of money;
- (3.) The guarantee of the colony that the interest determined by Order in Council shall be regularly and punctually paid, free of all charges of the Public Trust Office.

A person making a will or arranging a trust must always be seriously concerned as to the security of the capital funds; and the larger the capital funds the greater will be the concern for security, and the less for a high rate of interest; and it will be found that the charges for the administration of a property by the Public Trustee will, when the legal charges and commission allowed to executors and administrators in connection with private administrations are considered, compare very favourably with the expense of an administration by any other means.

In private trusteeships, death and absence render necessary numerous and expensive deeds not required by Public Trustee's administration, which has, besides, the office solicitor's advice without expense to the estates. By all who know or have experienced the contingencies of private trusteeships these advantages must be appreciated.

The Public Trust Office, although a department of the State, is absolutely free from political interference or control.

Large powers are conferred by statute on the Public Trustee, thus supplementing powers contained in wills for the benefit of the testator's family.

ADVANCES TO SETTLERS.

"The Government Advances to Settlers Act, 1894," provided for the lending of money to settlers on the security of land in the colony other than urban and suburban land. Under the amending Act of 1929 these provisions have been extended so as to include urban and suburban freehold land and so make it eligible for loan purposes.

The following explanatory memoranda are now issued with the view of placing before the public the chief provisions of the original Act of 1894 as well as of the amending Act of 1929 and other amendments.

1. All communications to the office should be addressed as follows, and when so addressed will go free by post:—

"The Superintendent,
Government Advances to Settlers Office,
Wellington, New Zealand."

2. **The business of the office** is the advancing of money in New Zealand on first mortgage of lands and improvements held under the following classes of tenure, free from all encumbrances, liens, and interests other than leasehold interests, that is to say,—

- (1.) Freehold land held in fee simple under "The Land Transfer Act, 1885," or freehold land held in fee simple the title to which is registered under "The Deeds Registration Act, 1908."
- (2.) Crown land held on perpetual lease under "The Land Act, 1885."
- (3.) Crown land held under Parts III, and IV, of "The Land Act, 1892."
- (4.) Crown land held on lease as a small grazing-run under "The Land Act, 1895," or under "The Land Act, 1892."
- (5.) Crown land held on agricultural lease under "The Mining Act, 1901."
- (6.) Crown land held on lease (not being for mining purposes) under "The Westland and Nelson Coalfields Administration Act, 1877."
- (7.) Native land held on lease under "The West Coast Settlement Reserves Act, 1881," or under the Act of 1892.
- (8.) Land held on lease under "The Westland and Nelson Native Reserves Act, 1887."
- (9.) Land held under "The Thermal Springs Districts Act, 1881."
- (10.) Educational and other reserves which are subject to the provisions of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1881," by virtue of Proclamation made under section 50 thereof, or "The Land Act, 1885," by virtue of Proclamation made under section 237 thereof, or "The Land Act, 1892," by virtue of Proclamation made under section 243 thereof, and are held on perpetual lease or lease in perpetuity, or on deferred-payment or small grazing-run systems.
- (11.) Crown land held by license on the deferred-payment system under Part III of "The Land Act, 1895."
- (12.) Land held under lease from a leasing authority, as defined by "The Public Bodies' Powers Act, 1887," and providing for the payment by the incoming tenant of valuation for improvements made upon the land, whether by the lessee named in such lease or any former lessee as tenant.

With regard to Classes 10 and 12, a lease is not eligible if it provides for absolute forfeiture (without compensation) for breach of conditions, or if on the determination of the lease compensation is to be allowed for certain improvements only.

3. Mortgages are granted either on the **Instalment** or the **Fixed-loan System** (fully described hereafter), and the margins of security required by the Act are as follow:—

- (1.) On all freeholds (other than urban or suburban) **three-fifths** of the value may be advanced either on the Instalment or Fixed-loan System: Provided that in the case of first-class agricultural freeholds Instalment loans may be advanced up to **two-thirds** of the value.
- (2.) On leaseholds (other than urban or suburban) **one-half** of the value of the lessee's interest in the lease may be advanced on the Instalment System. No loans are granted on leaseholds on the Fixed-loan System.
- (3.) On urban and suburban freeholds, loans are granted on the **Instalment System only**, and the amounts of loan are limited as follow:—

(a.) On urban freehold on which buildings exist, **three-fifths** of the value of the land, plus **one-half** the value of the buildings, may be advanced:

(b.) On suburban freehold on which buildings exist, **one-half** the value of the land, plus **one-half** the value of the buildings, may be advanced;

(c.) On urban or suburban freehold on which no buildings exist, **one-half** the value of the land may be advanced, but on such security no loan shall be granted except for the erection of buildings on the land: the loan to be advanced for instalments at the discretion of the Board, at the erection of the buildings proceeds.

"Urban land" means land which is situate in a borough having a population of at least two thousand inhabitants and is not used for farming, dairying, or market-gardening purposes.

"Suburban land" means land which is situate in a borough having a population of less than two thousand inhabitants, or in any town, or in the vicinity of any town or borough, and is not used for farming, dairying, or market-gardening purposes.

Land situate within towns which are used for farming, dairying, or market-gardening purposes is deemed in accordance with paragraph 3, (1), (2), hereof.

The right of determining what land may be considered "urban" or "suburban," or "inclosed agricultural," is imposed by the Act on the General Lending Board.

4. The security which the applicant offers for the loan must consist of one or more mortgages of the several classes of tenure mentioned in the foregoing paragraph 2, and must, if the security is of the leasehold value; and, if the security is leasehold, all the covenants and conditions of the lease, including the payment of rent, must have been regularly complied with. Crown lessees should note that "The Land Act, 1892," provides that leases under that Act must be at least twelve months in existence before they can be mortgaged.

5. Any person desiring an advance should make a written application on the form provided for the purpose, a copy of which can be obtained from any Postmaster in the colony. The Postmaster will also supply an envelope in which the application may be forwarded free of charge, and will afford to the applicant any explanation which may be required respecting anything in the application.

6. In the case of an application for an advance on the security of an interest in land under a lease or license issued from the Lands Department (and belonging to one or more of the classes of tenure numbered 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 9, 10, 11, in paragraph 2 hereof), a copy of the application must be forwarded to the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the land in which the land is situated, on a form which, with an envelope for forwarding it and postage, may be obtained from any Postmaster in the colony.

7. No loan of less than £25 or more than £3,000 can be granted, and in the case of "urban" or "suburban" lands the maximum loan is fixed at £3,000.

8. Applications must be accompanied by a valuation-fee according to the following scale:—

9. If the applicant has already obtained any advance under this Act and is desirous of obtaining a further advance, either on the same security or on a separate security, the amount of the application, added to the amount of the advances already obtained, must not exceed the limits mentioned above—£3,000 for farming and £2,000 for urban or suburban lands.

10. Mortgages granted on the **Fixed-loan System** may be for any period not exceeding 20 years, and the principal is repayable at the end of the term. They may also be repaid in instalments, and in part on any half-yearly due date during the term, as explained hereafter. Interest at the rate of 5 per cent. is payable half-yearly, reducible to $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. provided payment is made not later than fourteen days after due date and there are no arrears.

11. Mortgages granted on the **Instalment System** are repayable by seventy-three half-yearly payments of principal and interest combined. They may also be repaid in whole or in part at any time. Interest is charged at the rate of 5 per cent., reducible to $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. provided payment is made not later than fourteen days after due date and there are no arrears.

12. Every half-yearly instalment, except the last, is at the rate of £3 (less the rebate of interest in case of prompt payment) for every £100 of the loan. The following table shows, in a loan of £100 as an instance, how much of each instalment is applied to repaying the principal, and how much is in payment of interest. It shows also the balance of principal remaining due after payment of the respective instalments until the loan is entirely repaid in thirty-six years and a half:—

13. With reference to the above table, it has to be borne in mind that the amount of instalment (£3) is reduced by one-tenth of the amount set down for interest if payment made within the prescribed time. Thus, a mortgagor paying promptly his first instalment of £100 would be charged not £3, but £2 15s., the interest being reduced by one-tenth.

14. The mortgagor, under the Instalment system, may pay to the Superintendent of any bank under the Fixed-loan system on any half yearly due date, the whole balance of principal owing with interest to date of payment, and obtain a discharge of the mortgage on payment of the fee prescribed for such discharge.

15. The mortgagor may also from time to time pay to the Superintendent, in addition to the half-yearly payments, sums of £5 or a multiple of £5, and in the case of Fixed loans such sums will be applied in reduction of the advance, and interest will be charged on the balance; or, if the mortgagor so directs, such deposits will be held on his behalf and will represent of the half-yearly instalments of interest as they fall due.

In the case of an *Installment loan*, money paid to advance by a mortgagor may be applied in any of the following methods, according as he directs:—

(a) It may be audited as explained in paragraph 10.

Advance payments in reduction of the mortgage, unless made on the due date of a half-yearly payment, take effect only from the next due date.

Readjustment of Loans.

16. On the due date of any instalment, after at least one-tenth of the loan has been repaid, by means of the half-yearly instalments or of moneys repaid in advance, or both, the mortgagee (provided he is not in arrear with any instalment or other payment due under the mortgage) may, with the consent of the Superintendent, readjust the loan by treating the balance of principal then unpaid as a fresh loan duly created on that date for a fresh term. But no readjustment is allowed unless the balance of unpaid principal amounts to at least £100. Under this arrangement the mortgagee will be relieved of paying interest calculated on the original amount of the loan. He will only pay interest on the balance of principal now repaid.
