SOME GENERAL NOTES

Because the Bulletin and Newsletter continue to reach an ever-widening readership (wise people!) both in the U. K. and overseas, one or two matters of interest and assistance to all concerned are worthy of repetition. Subscribers to whom these points are already known will, we feel sure, forgive their reiteration for the benefit of new readers.

U. K. subscribers wishing to order items advertised in the N. Z. Newsletter.

The method we recommend is that the order be dispatched by the customer direct to Campbell Paterson Ltd., P. O. Box 5555, Auckland, New Zealand, by means of an Air Letter (available for 5p from any post office). No remittance need be sent to Auckland. If still available, the material required will then be forwarded to Woking, and invoiced by us to the customer in the usual way. Payment can then be made to Woking. Bank charges for foreign payments, and extra airmail postage, are thus avoided by the customer. Alternatively, orders may be sent to Woking, and we will gladly forward these to Auckland by air mail, unless of course we are able to supply the material ordered from our own stock.

Remittances to Woking from Europe and overseas.

Wherever possible, these should be made by International Money Order or Sterling Draft (or, in the case of U. S. A. and Canada, by dollar bills). If payment is made by cheque, drawn on a bank outside the U. K., collection and other bank charges should be allowed for in the total remittance. These charges on foreign cheques vary widely, but our recent experience has been that they tend to be heavy (hence our advice to avoid the use of cheques drawn on banks overseas if at all possible!).

The following list of offers will repay careful study, being full of the interesting, the unusual, the elusive - items to add that extra bit of sparkle to your collection.

SCARCE PLATE PROOFS

- 701 ½d Mt. Cook. Block of 4 printed in black on paper which had the watermark PERKINS BACON & CO. LTD. LONDON in double-lined capitals appearing once in each sheet. This block shows part of the watermark. (For the record, these proofs were printed from the new plate numbered 1 of 1907). The imperf proof block£12.50
- 702 3d Huias. The redrawn design of 1907, again printed in black, on medium thick unwatermarked paper, imperf. Block of 4£10.00
- 703 6d Kiwi. 1907 redrawn design. Block of 4, printed in black, on unwatermarked paper, imperf.£10.00
- 704 1/- Kea and Kaka. Again the reduced size design of 1907, printed in black on Cowan paper with wmk NZ and Star inverted. This is a block of four with bottom selvedge, showing part of the marginal watermark. The proof block....£12.50
- 705 Penny Dominion. Two blocks of 4, one imperf, the other perf 14 x 15, printed in black on gummed paper wmk'd NZ and Star. There is a little foxing on the back of both blocks, but this does not affect their facial appearance. The two blocks (both marginal)£ 5.00

- 706 First Pictorial 6d Kiwi Red, perf 11 wmk'd (E14c). Mint copies with "Letters" wmk, caused by the stamps being printed on the paper selvedge, each.....£ 1.25

- 707 Penny Universal Used Multiples. An unusual lot, comprising "Waterlow" paper perf 11 (G2a), 2 pairs; Basted Mills, perf 14 (G3b), 1 pair; Original Local Plates, perf 14 (G5a), 3 pairs and strip of 3; Dot plates, perf 14 (G8a) strip of 3; Royle Plates, perf 14 (G10a), 2 pairs and strip of 3; Surface print (G11a) pair and strip. An interesting display, all used£ 1.00
- 708 Penny Universal, Royle, Perf 11 (G10b). A scarce stamp.

- 709 Penny Universal Plate Number. A mint pair of the Royle Plates, perf 14 issue (G10a) with the plate number R1 in the bottom selvedge. Lovely - and a scarce item£12.50
- 710(a) Penny Dominion. Cowan Paper (J6a). The rare booklet pane of 6 with "Dainties" advertisements on side selvedges. Complete with binding selvedge ("Jeyes Fluid" ad.). The booklet pane£22.50
(b) As above. Cowan paper, reversed watermark (J7a). Booklet pane of 6 with "Kodak" ads. on side and binding selvedges£ 4.00
(c) As above. Wiggins Teape paper (J8a). Variety watermark inverted. Excellent used copies at, each£ 1.00
- 711 K. G. V. 1d Field Marshal. The rare Reversed Watermark issue of 1927 - caused by printing on Cowan paper which had been surfaced on the wrong side. Magnificent mint block of 4 in the astounding scarlet shade (as different from any other 1d Field Marshal shade as chalk is from cheese). See it to believe it! The beautiful block£20.00
- 712 Q. E. 3d Small Figures Variety. The major retouch to R1/14 (Plate 26). This is a splendid example of the generally finely executed "repair" work which is a feature of the Bradbury, Wilkinson printed Queen Elizabeth issues. Fully illustrated, described and listed (NV5p) in the C. P. Catalogue. In mint selvedge block of 4£ 2.50
- 713(a) Queen on Horseback 2/6d Brown. Two good contrasting shades of chocolate brown and deep brown (the extra shade is due for inclusion in the C. P. Catalogue listings at the first convenient opportunity).

(b) As above, 3/- Green. A corner block of 4 with printer's imprint and plate no. 2 - at the price of four normal stamps. Lovely mint, a bargain at£ 6.00
(c) As above, 5/- Carmine. Three shade singles, being deep carmine, bright carmine and pink carmine (again the extra shade will be catalogued). Three mint£ 4.50
(d) As above, 10/- Blue. The distinctive deep ultramarine and royal blue shades of this never-easy-to-find stamp. Two shade singles, mint£11.00

- 714 1940 Centennial 9d.** The original frame plate number 1 of this value showed signs of wear during the course of printing, and was recut in a different position. Here we offer a plate block of 4 with the recut number, and showing clearly the remnants of the original number. The plate block £ 4.00
- 715 1965 Commonwealth Parliamentary Conference 9d.** The prominent constant variety "Broken corner of building" on R11/6, in positional block of 4. Mint.. 90p
- 716 1964 Health 2½d + 1d.** Amusing set of 4 mint singles, reminiscent of the old game of "pin the tail on the donkey". In three of the stamps, the red colour (beak, eyes and legs) is in all sorts of strange positions. The fourth shows the design as it was intended. The set..... £ 2.00

5c Vintage Car. R4/2 (P1. 1a x 6). Blurred spokes on the car wheels. The most interesting cause of this variety is fully explained in the write-up. Central stamp in a marginal block of 9 - the other eight are normal	£ 1.00
8c Vintage Car. R2/7 (P1. 1a x 6). Some bodywork repairs needed here, to make good a large scratch on the driver's door. Positional block of 8	53p
10c Vintage Car. R4/7 (P1. 1a x 7). A cigarette has mysteriously appeared in the driver's right hand. Mint block of 8 (in the other seven stamps he's definitely a non-smoker!)	68p
