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NEW ISSUES AND VARIETIES

Children's Health – Butterflies (7 July 2010) T82

Definitely one of the more attractive Health designs of recent years. However, the connection between butterflies and children's health is thinly drawn indeed.

Designed by You X D, Wellington. Printed by Southern Colour Print, Dunedin by offset litho in four process colours.

- Gummed sheets of 25, Tullis Russell 104gsm Red Phosphor gummed stamp paper. Perforation 14, horizontal mesh.
- Self-adhesive sheet of 100, Avery Dennison B90 Kraft Back paper. Perforation 9.75 x 10.00, vertical mesh.
- Gummed miniature sheet incorporating all three designs/values. Perforation 14, vertical mesh.
- Self-adhesive singles ex-Jumbo Roll printing. Perforation 9.75 x 10.00 horizontal mesh.

Note: Both self-adhesives are phosphor tagged with a short band at the left of stamp.

New Value Definitives (4 August 2010) PE58-62

No change to the basic current definitive design. Even the locations of scenes are unchanged. It's just angles, times of day and presumably different whales that are now the still-beautiful scenes. I can see topical collectors now collecting New Zealand geographically rather than in date of issue order.

Quite an early release for these new higher values. The increase in postal rates does not take place until October. NZ Post also managed to squeeze in several reprints, also higher values, before those changes took place. (See below). An interesting but expensive month for definitive collectors.

- Two self-adhesive booklets (10 x \$1.20, 5 x \$1.90), Avery Dennison B100 PS1 gloss-back adhesive 210 gsm. Perforation 10.1 x 9.75, horizontal mesh.
- Jumbo roll printing singles (\$1.20 and \$1.90). No change to technical details other than plain backing paper.

All Blacks (4 August 2010) S1203, 4

There is no question but that the "All Blacks" and the Silver Fern are the most internationally recognised cultural attributes of New Zealand. The Rugby World Cup taking place in New Zealand in 2011 is clearly the motivation for this issue and also the design's addition to the Personalised range.

It is a shame, therefore, that such a tedious design has eventuated. Other than the small figure of value even value differentiation is bad. Perhaps the reason lies in the copyrights! The NZ Post silver fern logo conflicted with the New Zealand Rugby Union silver fern logo so the political compromise reached

was to print it in overgloss. You should **just** be able to see it with the naked eye at top left of the stamp above the country name.

Designed by Cue Design, Wellington. Printed by Southern Colour Print, Dunedin, by offset litho in four process colours and overgloss.

- Gummed sheetlets of 10, Tullis Russell 104gsm Red Phosphor gummed stamp paper. Perforation 13.6 x 13.4, mesh vertical.
- Miniature sheet incorporating two (60c and \$1.90) large stamps as in sheetlets but now horizontal mesh, and two (60c and \$1.90) small stamps in proportion to the "personalised" stamps of other issues with perforation 14.9 x 14.5 and horizontal mesh.

Rugby World Cup 2011 (9 September 2010) S1205, 6

Obviously the negotiations with the IRB (International Rugby Board) went along the same lines as the "All Blacks" issue! It is a shame that both of these rugby issues have turned out to be little better than kiddie stickers.

Call us pedantic if you like, but they even forgot the dollar sign in front of the 1.90 value. As for the overglossed NZ Post logo fern, because it is printed on the white of the stamp paper, it is now virtually invisible. We love our rugby and would die for the All Blacks but these two designs leave us colder than that death.

Designed by NZ Post, Wellington. Printed by Southern Colour Print, Dunedin, by offset litho in four process colours and overgloss.

- Two sheetlets each of 10 x 60c or \$1.90 value, Tullis Russell 104gsm Red Phosphor gummed stamp paper. Perforation 13.6 x 13.4, mesh vertical.
- Miniature sheet incorporating two stamps of each value – one of each are the same size and perforation as above but now mesh horizontal. The other two stamps (one of each value) are a reduced size, perforation 14.9 x 14.5, mesh horizontal.

Personalised Stamps – New Values (9 September 2010) PD177-188

No new designs here but strictly not reprints because of the changed values required for the October 1st postal rate increases.

Designed by YouXD, Wellington. Printed by Southern Colour Print, Dunedin by offset litho in four process colours plus silver.

- Two sheetlets – 8 x 60c and the other 1 x \$1.90 plus 3 x \$2.40 – Tullis Russell 104gsm Red Phosphor gummed stamp paper. Perforation 15 x 14.5, mesh horizontal.

DUNEDIN : NEW-ZEALAND

There have only been five **DUNEDIN NEW ZEALAND** date stamps recorded for the whole period of nine years, and there is some doubt on the authenticity of two of the dates. It would appear inconceivable that the Dunedin Post Office only processed **three covers in nine years**, especially when there are probably 100 covers cancelled with the **OTAGO NEW ZEALAND** date stamp. In 1848 the population of Port Chalmers was 38 and at Dunedin 444, in 1854 at Port Chalmers it was only 80 and at Dunedin in 1857 it was 840. There is also some doubt as to whether there were two dashes =, between the words **DUNEDIN & NEW ZEALAND**.

2010 Pampas Heights Red Deer 60c In response to NZ Post's rates increase, a 60c CAL has been released by Pampas Heights Red Deer Stud Farm, to join the 50c CAL from 7 May 2010. FDCs were produced, postmarked Rotorua on 1 September 2010. The basic design is the same with the two large red deer who are now named on the 60c CAL – 'Atlas' and 'Zorb'. Also now at the top of the CAL appears Rotorua-New Zealand. As before, FDCs are also available signed by the owners and a maxicard was also available.

EIGHTY-FIVE YEARS AGO

From The New Zealand Stamp Collector – October 1925

NEW RAILWAY STAMP An innovation has been introduced into the New Zealand Railways Parcels Branch, in the shape of adhesive stamps for the pre-payment of parcels despatched by rail. The stamps are the same size as the current high value duty stamps, and the design consists of the figures of value on a white ground with a crown and the letters "N.Z.R." at the top and Railway Charges at the sides in a circular frame. The front view of a railway engine appears in the four corners. The various offices of issue are overprinted across the stamps in black.

LONDON-RUSSIA BY AIR A new Air Mail from London to several other countries came into operation on June 29th last, and letters may now be posted for transmission by the new service to Russia, Finland, Esthonia, Lettonia, Lithuania, and Memel Territory. The total time of transit from London to Helsingfors or Moscow should not exceed thirty-six hours, and to the other places mentioned the time should be less.

By ordinary mail the time of transit from London to Helsingfors or Moscow is about four and a half days.
