NEW ISSUES AND VARIETIES

Ross Dependency Christchurch Philatelic Society Centennial Stamp & Postcard Exhibition Miniature Sheet (14 January 2012)

An attractive miniature sheet for this oft delayed philatelic exhibition. The miniature sheet contains the two Captain Scott stamps from the Race to the Pole set, set against a background of Scott's vessel The Terra Nova in Lyttelton Harbour. Scott used Christchurch and Lyttelton as his base for his expedition to the South Pole 1910-1912. The miniature sheet is also available on First Day Cover with special Ross Dependency Exhibition postmarks. The FDC design includes the two Victoria Land stamps RD2a and RD3a, issued for the use of the Scott Expedition 1910-1912. However, the images used, especially the ½d green, are dreadful reproductions bearing little or no resemblance to the actual stamps themselves. Designed by Stamps and Collectables Business, New Zealand Post, Wellington, printed by Southern Colour Print Ltd, Dunedin by offset lithography in the four process colours, vertical mesh p.13½ on Tullis Russell 104gsm red phosphor gummed stamp paper. The two stamp miniature sheet RDM125-6, containing RD125a, RD126a.

\$2.40 Self-adhesive definitive, \$12 self-adhesive booklet (1 February 2012)

The gummed \$2.40 Lake Rotorua scenic definitive from 4 August 2010, is now joined by a self-adhesive version contained in a \$12 booklet of five copies. The design of the stamp is unchanged, showing a dawn shot over Lake Rotorua and is joined by a most attractive First Day Cover of Lake Rotorua during the day. A jumbo roll was produced for this FDC. Designed by Stamps Business, New Zealand Post, Wellington, printed by Southern Colour Print Ltd, Dunedin by offset lithography in the four process colours, horizontal mesh p. 10 x 9¼. Booklets printed on Avery Dennison B100 Gloss-back non-phosphor PSA paper, tagged with red phosphor and jumbo roll printed on Avery Dennison B90 Kraft-back non-phosphor PSA paper, tagged with red phosphor. Booklet W133a; stamp PE60b, PE60b(Z).

New Zealand Native Trees (1 February 2012)

Now, this is a really most attractive set of five stamps depicting NZ native trees. New Zealand's isolation from the rest of the world has allowed its unique flora to evolve and flourish, resulting in the distinctive array of native trees present today. Each stamp incorporates the common as well as the scientific name of each species and portrays different aspects of the tree in a detailed, illustrative style. 60c Pohutukawa or New Zealand Christmas tree. Each of the five stamps is printed on slightly toned paper, not obvious in the four higher values, but exceedingly obvious in this 60c stamp with the pink background colour continuing in a pale form on the margins. Most attractive.

Five stamps in sheets of 25 and a five stamp miniature sheet entitled 'Anatomy of a Tree Collection'. The First Day Covers are postmarked unusually with three different postmarks, all 1 February 2012. A most successful issue. Designed by 2Di4 Design, Wellington, printed by Southern Colour Print Ltd, Dunedin by offset lithography in the four process colours, horizontal mesh p.14½ on Tullis Russell 104gsm red phosphor gummed stamp paper. SS186a-190a, SSM186-90.

Definitive Reprints

The following definitive Kiwi reprints blocks have been released October-December 2011.

PE58a \$1.20 Mitre Peak, Milford Sound 3-Kiwis

PE59a \$1.90 Queenstown 4-Kiwis

PE62a \$3.40 Christchurch, River Avon 1-Kiwi

We also have another reprint of the \$9.50 Queenstown booklet (PE59b \$1.90).

This is the 2-Kiwis reprint W126a(Y).

75 Years of the Royal New Zealand Air Force RNZAF (15 March 2012)

Well this is indeed a strange kettle of fish! When this large sheetlet (yet another sheetlet) of 15 x 60c large 'stamps' arrived on my desk, I really did not know what to make of it. Quite simply they do not look like stamps at all! They look like stickers produced by the RNZAF to commemorate their 75 Years. When I looked closer at the sheetlet, I briefly got excited because nowhere could I see the country name New Zealand. Only when I looked hard did I see tucked away in the top left corner in tiny letters, smaller even than the Silver Fern identifier, printed in silver the words 'New Zealand'. Frankly, this is ridiculous. Why would any country wish to issue stamps with their country's name so small as to be virtually indistinguishable.

And I have to say as a whole, I am not hugely impressed with the 15 design subjects chosen for the stamps. Surely, a three or four stamp set – five or six stamps if you really must – would have sufficed. The sheetlet is inscribed 'Air Force Te Taauarangi O Aotearoa' or 'New Zealand Warriors of the Sky', Celebrating 75 Years of Service to New Zealand. The designs:

The Beginning – 1934 RNZAF established, 1 April 1937 Air Force Act passed.
Air Training Corps. World War II Europe. Women's Auxiliary Air Force.
World War II Pacific. Aerial Topdressing. Territorial Air Force. South East Asia.
ANZAC – A4 Skyhawk Fighter. Naval Support. Transport – RNZAF Hercules at Williams Field, Scott Base, McMurdo Sound, Ross Dependency.
Peacekeeping. Search and Rescue – P3 Orion Maritime Surveillance Aircraft, supplemented by Iroquois Helicopters. Remembrance – the 'Missing Man' formation. The Future – 28 new or upgraded aircraft planned by 2014.

There is also a Prestige miniature sheet booklet, but just as the stamps on the sheetlet don't look much like stamps, the Prestige miniature sheet booklet doesn't look anything like a normal stamp booklet. For a start it is a large square item 15cm x 15cm, containing 40 pages of text and eight panes of stamps. It is quite evident that even more so than normally, this is designed to be a collectable souvenir item and not for normal usage as a booklet of stamps. As usual with Prestige miniature sheet booklets, it is sold at a premium over face value and will thus only receive a footnote in Section W.

Sheetlet of 15 stamps plus miniature sheet Prestige booklet containing eight miniature sheets, of 30 stamps total. Designed by Strategy Design & Advertising, Wellington, printed by Southern Colour Print Ltd, Dunedin by offset lithography in the four process colours, plus silver, vertical mesh p. 14½ on Tullis Russell 104gsm red phosphor gummed stamp paper. Sheetlet SM1303-17, stamps S1303a-S1317a.

CALs Corner – Part 34

2012 NZ Garden Birds, Part 3, Len Jury Ltd, 4th issue.

A set of two CALs in both self-adhesive and gummed formats were released 11 January 2012, organized by Mt Eden stamp dealers Len Jury Ltd. The New Zealand garden birds selected for this year's set are the fantail and the blackbird, two attractive photographs being selected. First Day Covers and MaxiCards were produced, postmarked Auckland, 11 January 2012.

2012 CPS100 Stamp Show, 3rd issue, Exhibition Dinner

A 60c gummed CAL was released 14 January 2012 as part of the Philatelic Exhibition Dinner celebrations for the CPS100 Stamp Show from the Christchurch Philatelic Society. The CAL shows a stylised drawing of a member of Captain Scott's Antarctic Expedition 1911-1912, seemingly eating his dinner and was first used affixed to the Exhibition Dinner menu, postmarked with a special Exhibition cancel, 14 January 2012.

2012 Heart Foundation Booklet

On 30 January 2012, a \$7 Heart Foundation Charity Appeal booklet was issued, containing five each of 2 x 60c Heart Foundation self-adhesive CALs, plus \$1 donation. The New Zealand Heart Foundation, the Heart of our Nation "Together we will beat heart disease" has its National Office in Greenlane, Auckland and released this booklet in a sponsorship deal with New Zealand Post. The two 60c self-adhesive CALs (x 5 of each in the booklet pane of ten), show the NZ Heart Foundation logo and a red NZ Post mailbox and heart. The 2012 Heart Foundation Appeal ran 13-19 February 2012.

2012 60c Go Native NZ

A 60c self-adhesive CAL has been released February 2012 showing the company logo of Go Native New Zealand.

2012 Blenpex Stamp Exhibition A set of two 60c gummed CALs have been issued 29 February 2012 for Blenpex 2012, the Specialised Stamp and Postcard Exhibition being held at the Marlborough Lines Stadium, Kinross Street, Blenheim, 12-14 October 2012. The CALs depict Cape Campbell Lighthouse in Marlborough and a statue of a beaver. Blenheim was originally known as Beaver due to its swampy areas. First Day Covers and MaxiCards are also available. These have been postmarked Blenheim, 29 February 2012, producing a leap year date.

THE ROBIN GWYNN FIRST SIDEFACE COLLECTION Erratum

Adam Miller, Hon. Librarian at the Royal Philatelic Society of New Zealand in Wellington, has drawn our attention to the fact that a description of the above collection included a statement that "no surviving newspaper bearing a ½d Newspaper stamp is known before 1879". Adam points out that this is not true.

He continues in the NZ Stamp Collector for September 2008 P70-72, my article "an exceptional pair of early used New Zealand newspapers bracketing 1/1/1873 rate change describes such a newspaper and illustrates it used on the 8 February 1873, or in just the second month of ½d Newspaper stamps issue". The newspaper itself now resides in Te Papa, the National Museum.

EIGHTY-FIVE YEARS AGO

From The New Zealand Stamp Collector – May 1927

AIR MAILS - British Passenger Service

Over 26,500 airway passengers arrived at and departed from Croydon Aerodrome during 1926. The Handley-Page machines in the fleet of Imperial Airways have flown over 1,250,000 miles on Continental lines without a fatal accident since 1922. The Khartoum-Kisumen air service opened on February 8, Captain Gladstone starting off at noon on a Royal Air Force seaplane. The Peruvian Government proposes to inaugurate an air mail service between Lima and Squitos. It is expected that two days only will be necessary to complete the journey, against 22 days by ordinary land travel. Messrs. Stock and Leete, the Lancashire air pilots, who flew from London to India in two "Moth" airplanes, carried a small mail of 10lbs: each from Karachi, for which a special official cachet was made.

Buenos Aires- Montevideo The air mail service between Buenos Aires and Montevideo which has been run efficiently by the Junkers Mission since 1 March 1926, has been definitely abandoned as a financial failure.

FIFTY YEARS AGO

From the Newsletter April 1962

Current Pictorials With Colours Missing

With the discovery of another missing colour this month, I think it is time to take stock of the position. The latest find is the ½d without green, O1a(Y), and this brings the total varieties of this nature seen by me in this issue to nine. Those I have positively identified are: ½d no green O1aY, 1d no orange O2a(Z), 2d no black O3a(Z) and no yellow O3a(Y), 2½d no brown O4a(Z), 3d no green O5a(X), no yellow O5a(Z) and no brown O5a(Y), 9d no red O11a(Z). I have also received reports of the ½d without blue O1a(Z) and 6d without mauve O8a(Z). I have not seen the last two, but in any case they must be considered only minor, as the missing colour referred to is the shading on the petals of the flowers and is not outstanding.

Because the issue is still current there is always the possibility that more may turn up. The current life of all issues is limited however and once this set has been replaced, I think prices may be far more realistic than they appear today. It is difficult to estimate accurately the numbers of each variety issued, but I doubt whether any of them amount to more than a hundred or so. In many cases it is much less than this; for instance, it is reasonably certain that only five copies of the 1d without orange exist and some of these are damaged. It can be seen, therefore, that they are all rarities, but the fear that more may appear at a later date has depressed them well below their true value. In my opinion this is an ideal time to pick up cheap copies because I feel confident that eventually they will be changing hands at much higher prices.

New Issues – (From the Newsletter May 1962)

This year's Health stamps will be issued 3 October and once again the theme will be birds. The 4d stamp (3d + 1d) will depict the Tieke (Saddleback) and the 3½d (2½d + 1d) the Kakariki (Parakeet). The Post Office is planning to issue two stamps in June, to mark the Centenary of the Telegraph Service in New Zealand. I understand they will be 3d and 8d values and will depict items associated with the development of the telegraph service between 1862 and 1962..
