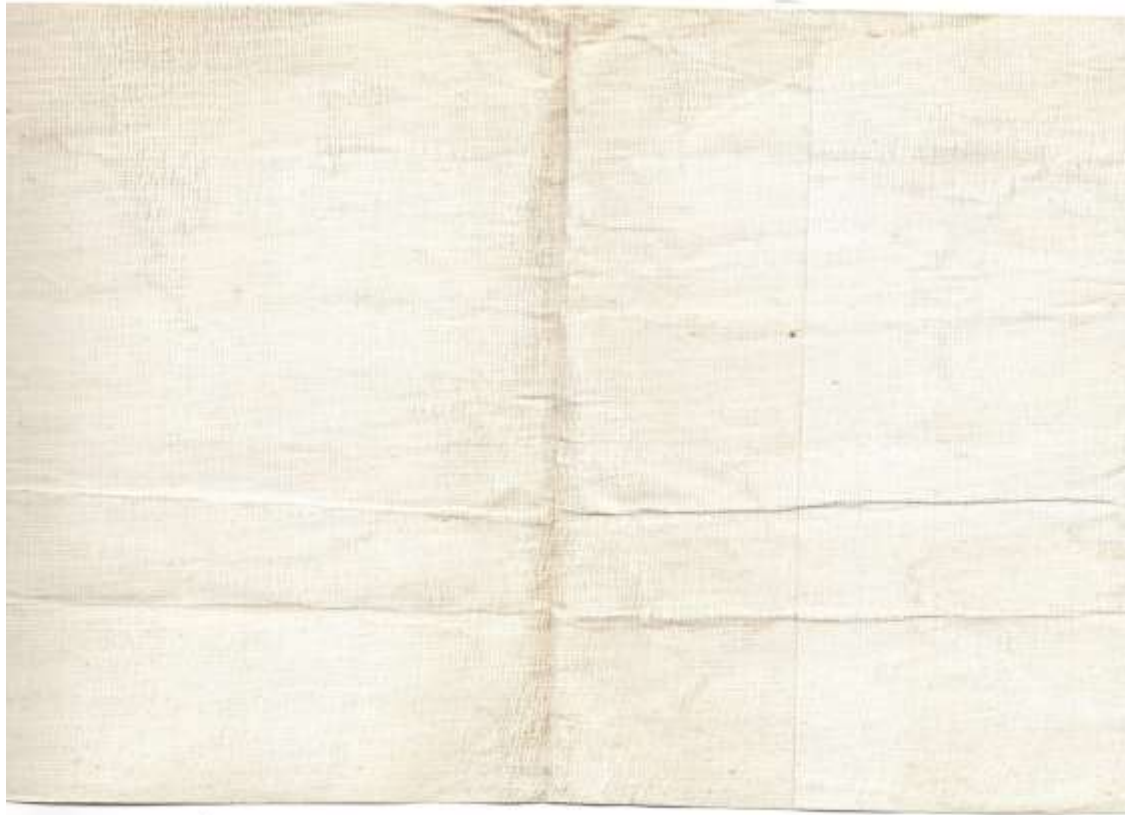

Considerable astonishment was expressed in Auckland on April 24 when news was received of the death of Mr Robert Rose, the well-known secretary of the N.Z. Mines Trust, Waihi, Waitekauri, Union Waihi, N.Z. Crown Companies and Ohinemuri Syndicate. It was known to his many friends that Mr Rose had not been well for the past three months, in fact not since he had an attack of influenza which was followed by ear trouble, but recent letters from Okoroire referred to his greatly improved state of health, which made the sudden news of his death this morning all the greater shock. Mr and Mrs Rose went to Okoroire on Thursday, 12th of April, and had intended going on to Rotorua. The deceased was about 51 years of age, and leaves a widow and two children to mourn their loss. Mr Rose was a nephew of the late Hon. James Williamson. He was born in Ireland, but went with his parents to America from which country he came to Auckland while yet in his teens. He was for some time teller in the Bank of New Zealand, but his uncle, who was then president of that institution, recognised the business abilities of Mr Rose and appointed him his business manager. A memento of this period is the fact that one of the main streets of Grey Lynn is called Rose Rd. in honour of the agent at the time of cutting up of the Surrey Hills Estate, which was Mr Williamson's property. Later on Mr Rose went into mining and became local secretary for the Waihi, Waitekauri, N.Z. Crown Mines, Union Waihi, Ohinemuri Syndicate, and the N.Z. Mines Trust. Mr Rose has also been
